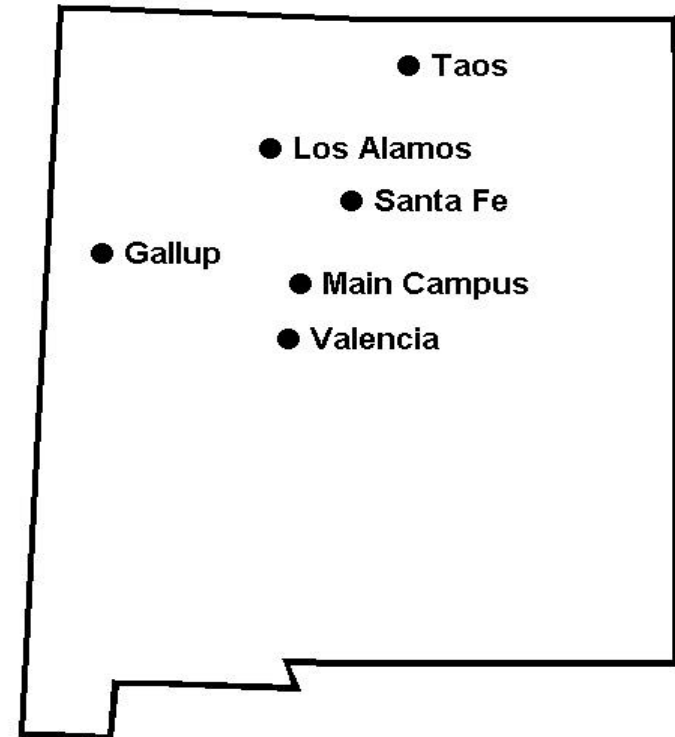

Introduction

In fall 1999, the campuses of the University of New Mexico served 30,970 students, employed 2,834 faculty and 10,884 staff, and had a total operating and capital budget of about \$1.06 billion. In the previous academic year, UNM awarded 4,608 degrees and certificates.

UNM consists of a Main Campus located in Albuquerque, which includes the Health Sciences Center; three branch campuses that have a two-year degree mission: UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, and UNM-Valencia; an Education Center that functions very much like a branch campus: UNM-Taos; and Upper Division & Graduate Centers at Los Alamos and Santa Fe, which are part of UNM's Extended University. This fact book presents data for all these units. The UNM Health Sciences Center and its programs—which include the School of Medicine, College of Nursing, and College of Pharmacy—are included in *UNM Facts*, sometimes as part of the Main Campus and sometimes separately. Footnotes and labels should make it clear in each case what is included.

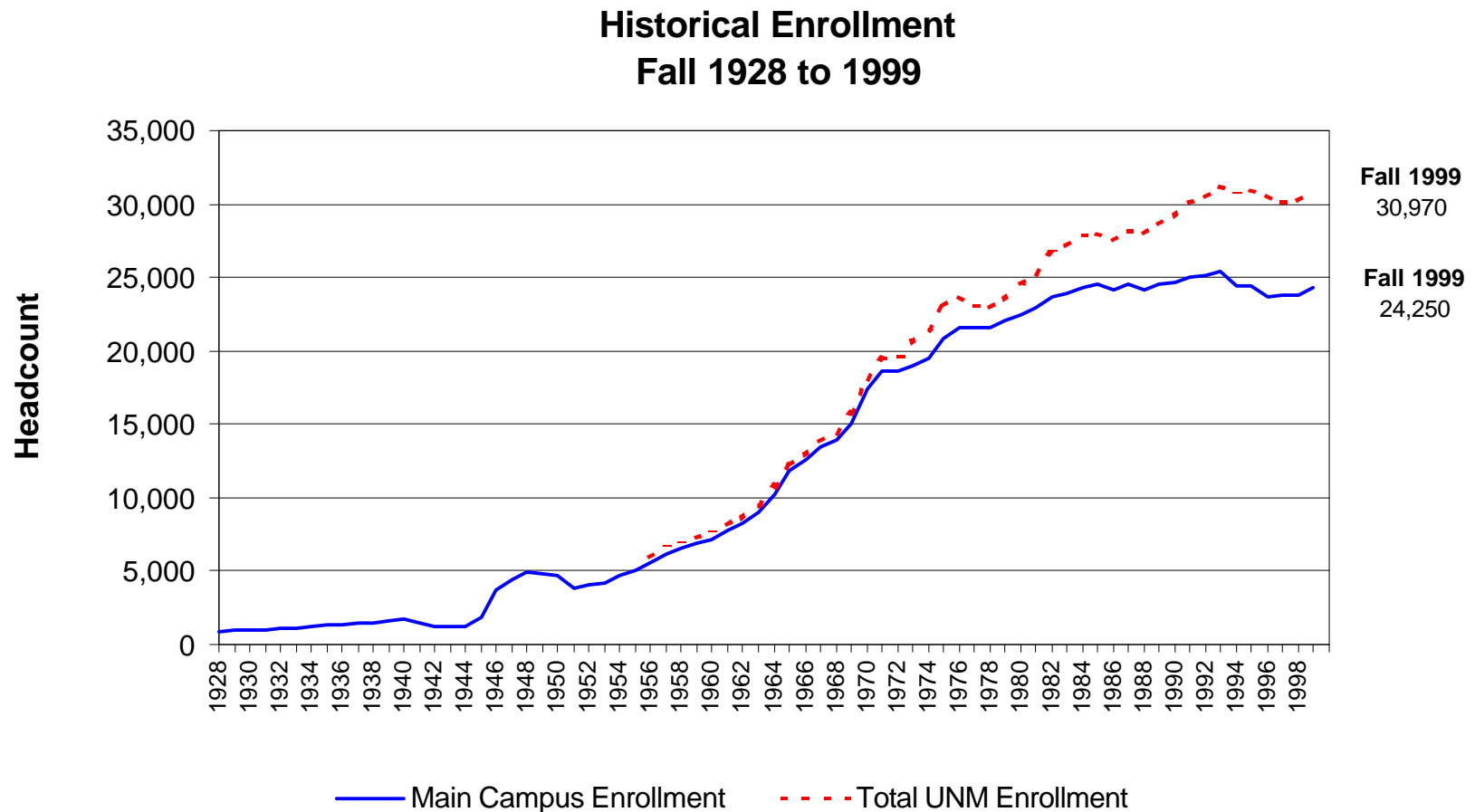
UNM's Extended University also delivers courses (partially using live TV and electronic transmission) across the state, to locations such as Taos, Española, Farmington, and Gallup. In addition, the Division of Continuing Education has over 55,000 enrollments every year in both credit and non-credit courses.

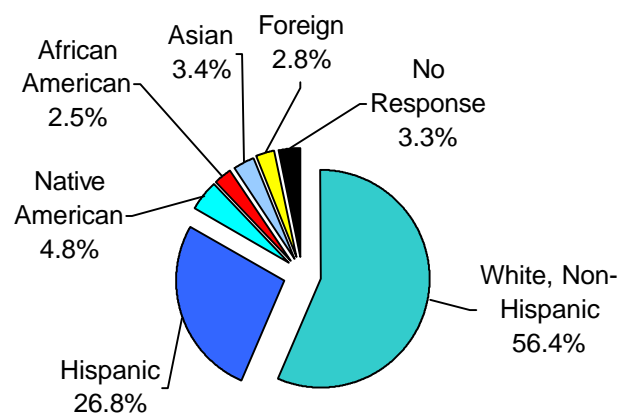

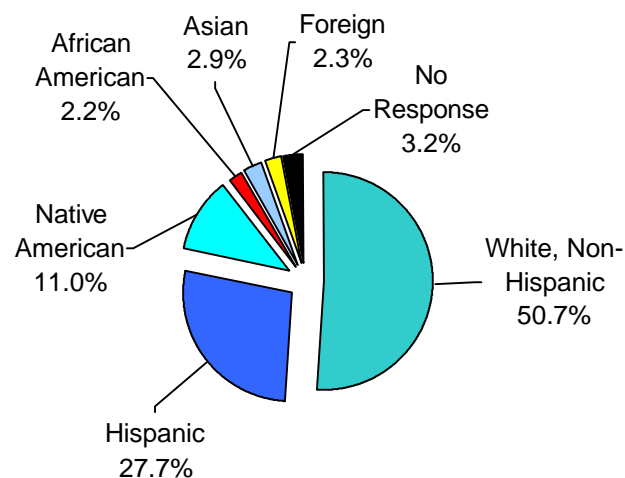

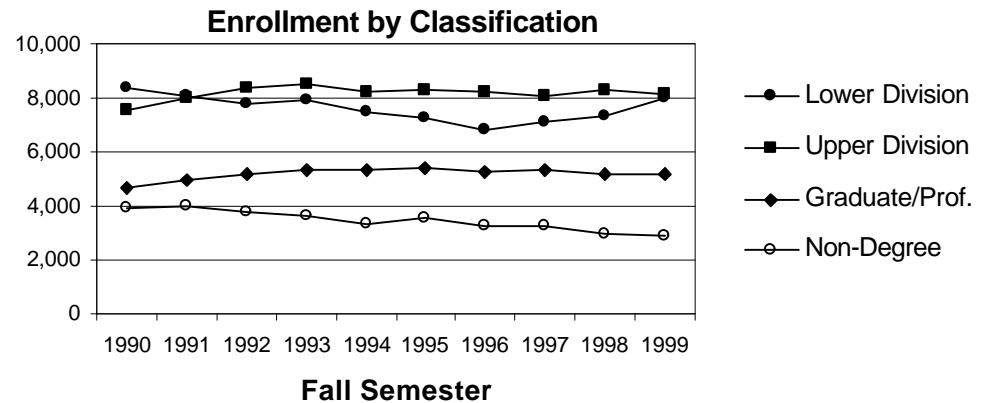

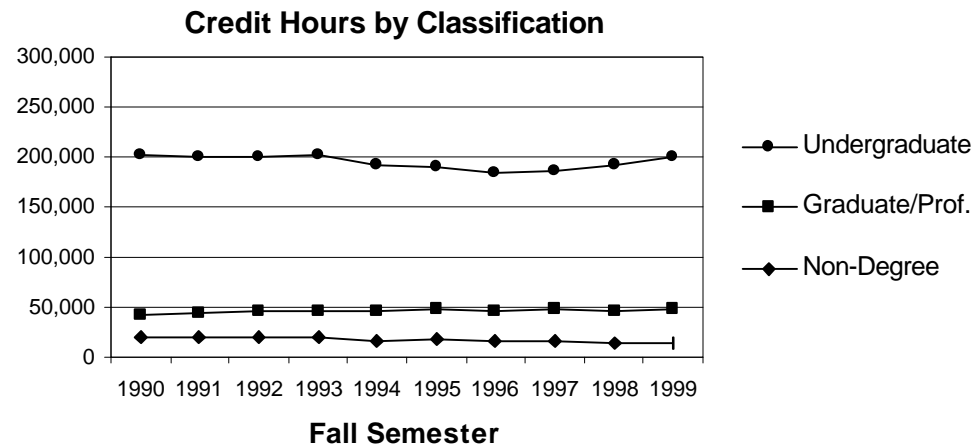
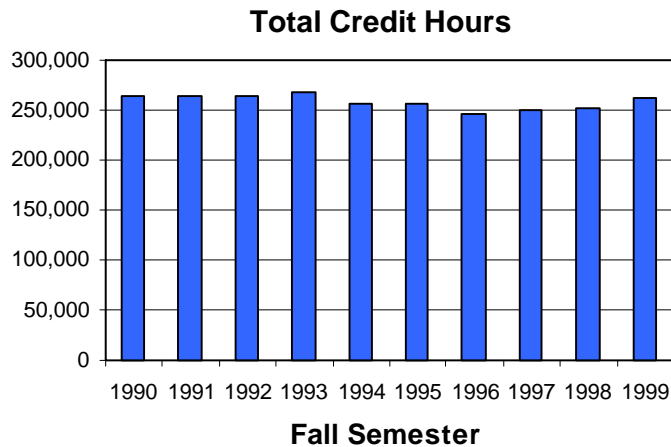

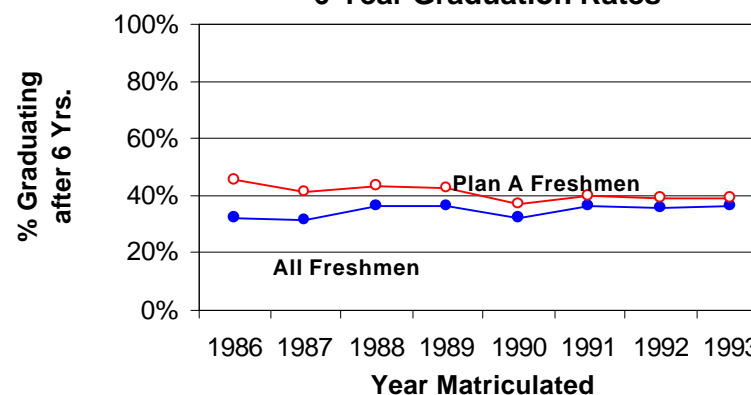

6-Year Graduation Rates

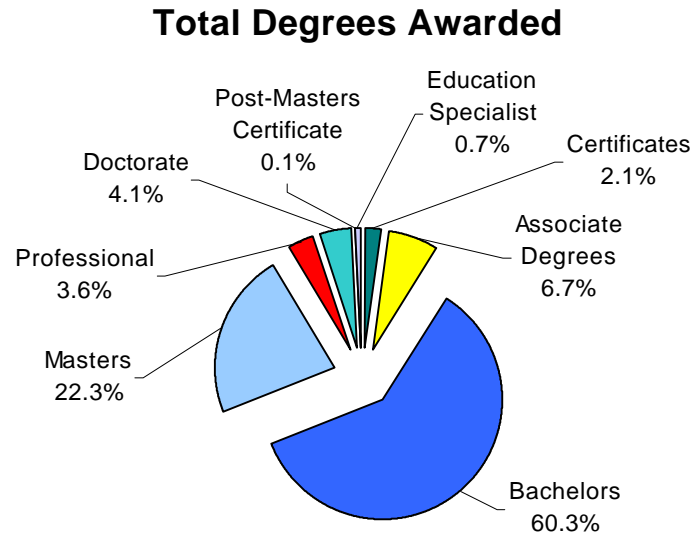

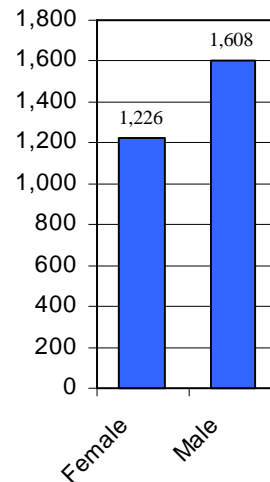

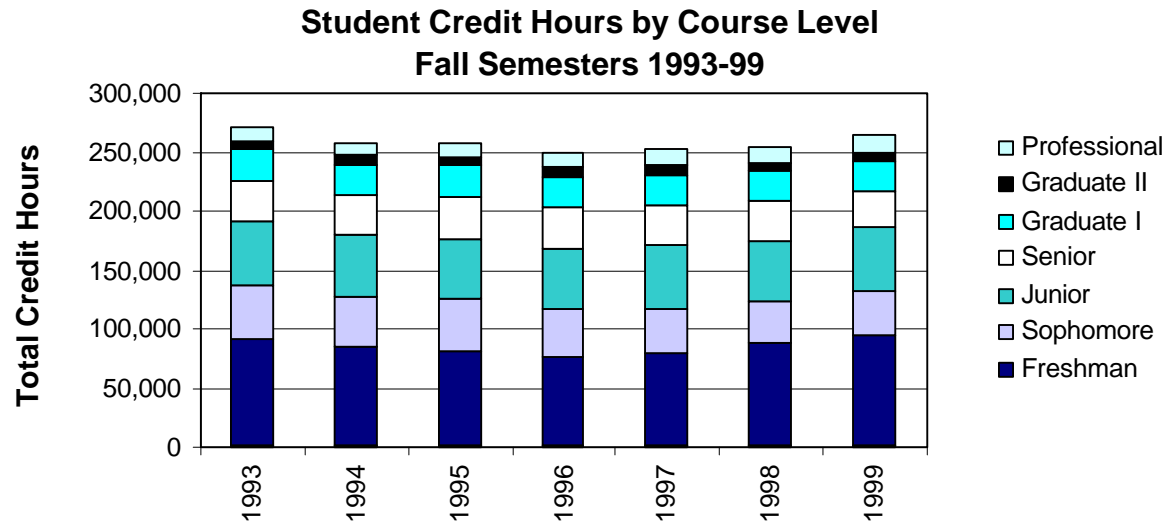

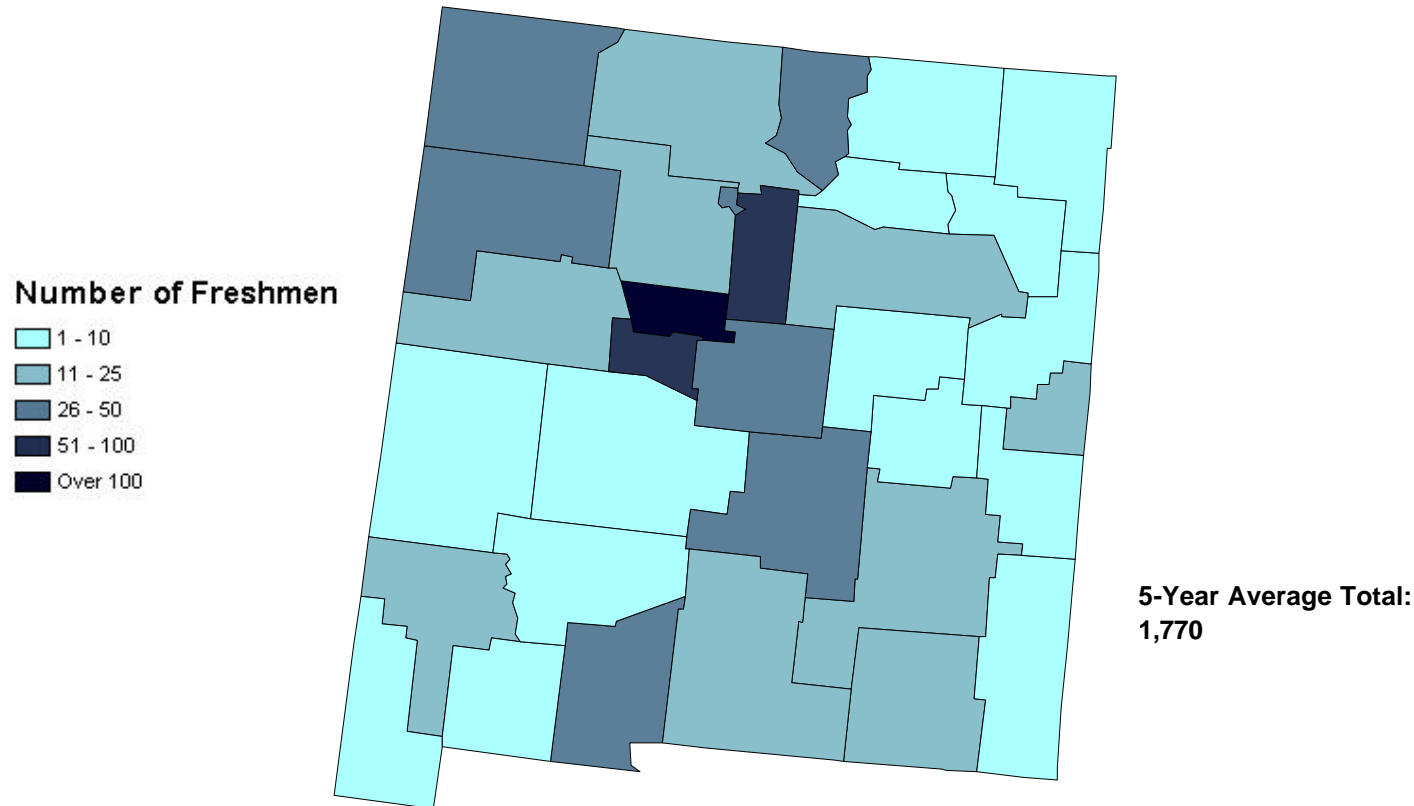

County of Origin of Recent HS Graduates from NM High Schools Main Campus, Average Number of Freshmen (Fall 1995-1999)

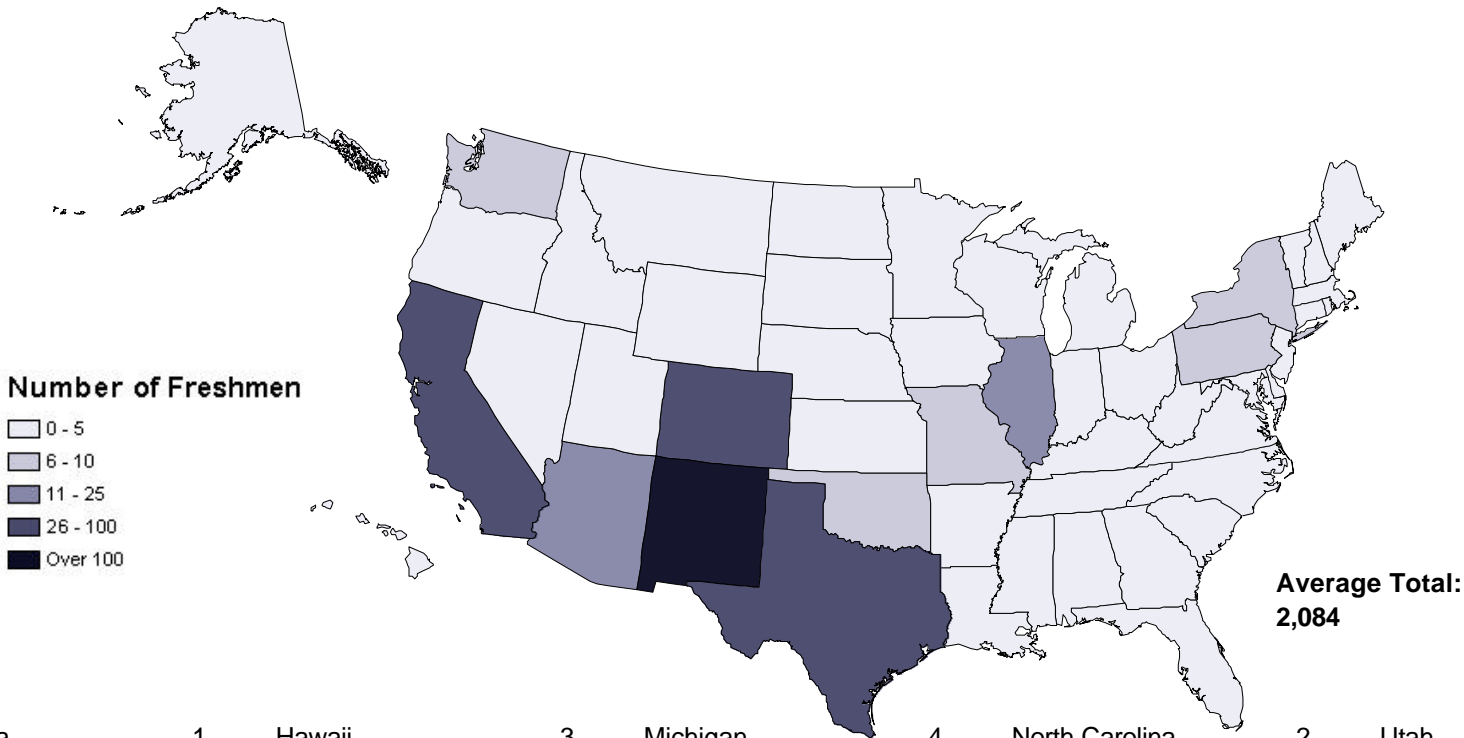

Degree Programs and Majors (Main Campus)

UNM's Main Campus offers over 200 degree programs and majors. The *UNM Catalog 1999-2001* lists 117 baccalaureate, 67 masters, and 37 doctoral level degree programs and majors. Many of the degree programs have additional concentrations and options—for example, either a bachelor of science or a bachelor of arts. In addition, there are 2 certificate programs (one of which is a graduate certificate); 1 associate degree program; 8 Education Specialist Degrees (graduate programs beyond the masters level); and first-professional programs in law, medicine, and pharmacy.

The University offers an Evening and Weekend Degree Program (EWDP) in which at least 45 degrees are available. Over 1,000 classes are offered each semester after 4:00 p.m., and about 11,500 students attend UNM at night. The following list of degree programs and majors are marked with an "*" if the entire program is available in the EWDP and with a "+" if several core courses in a program are offered.

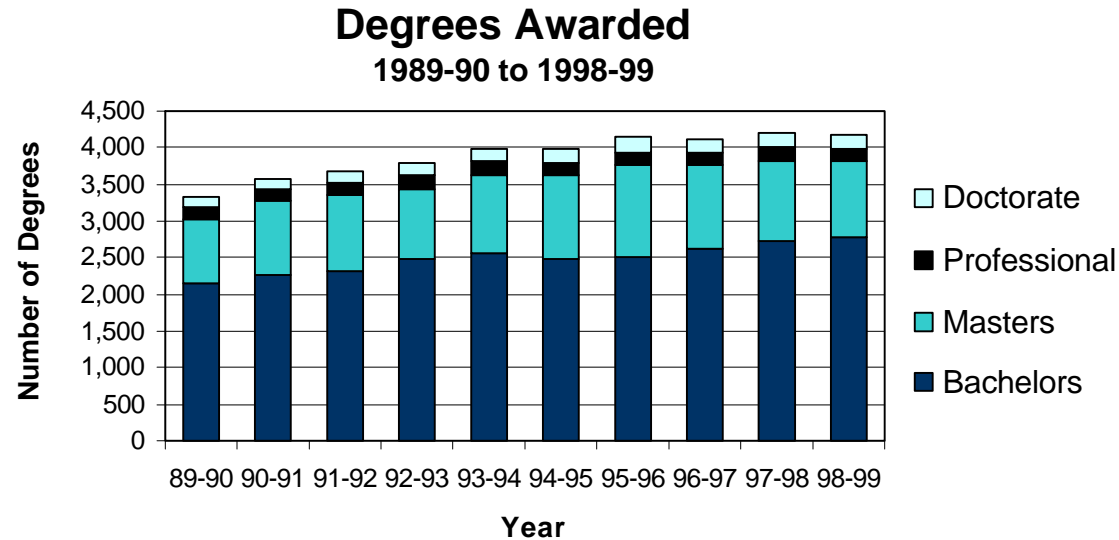

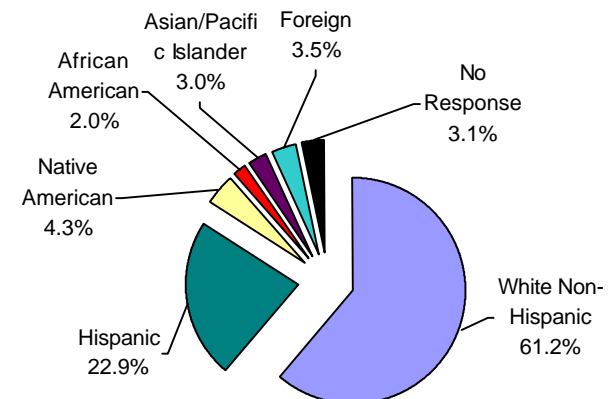

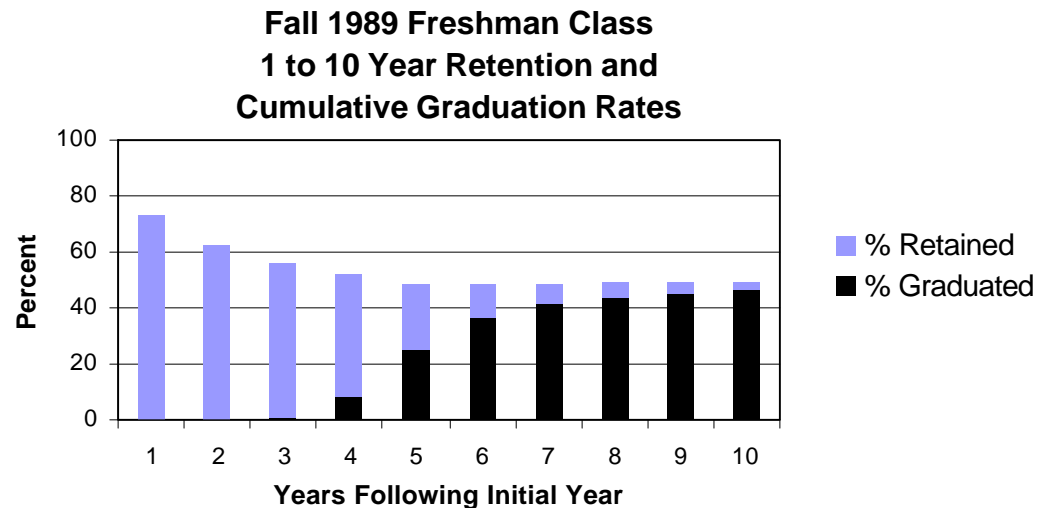

Retention and Graduation Rates of First-Time Freshmen (Fall 1989 to Fall 1998 Freshmen Classes)

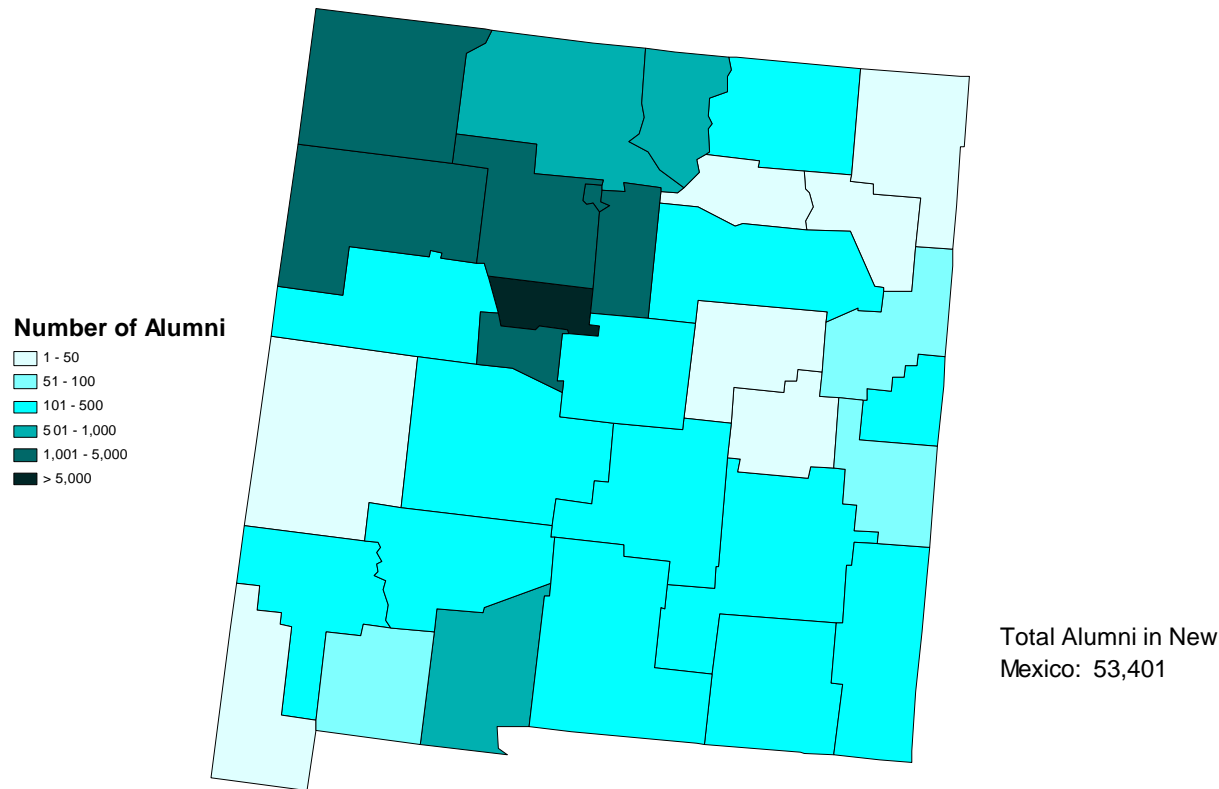

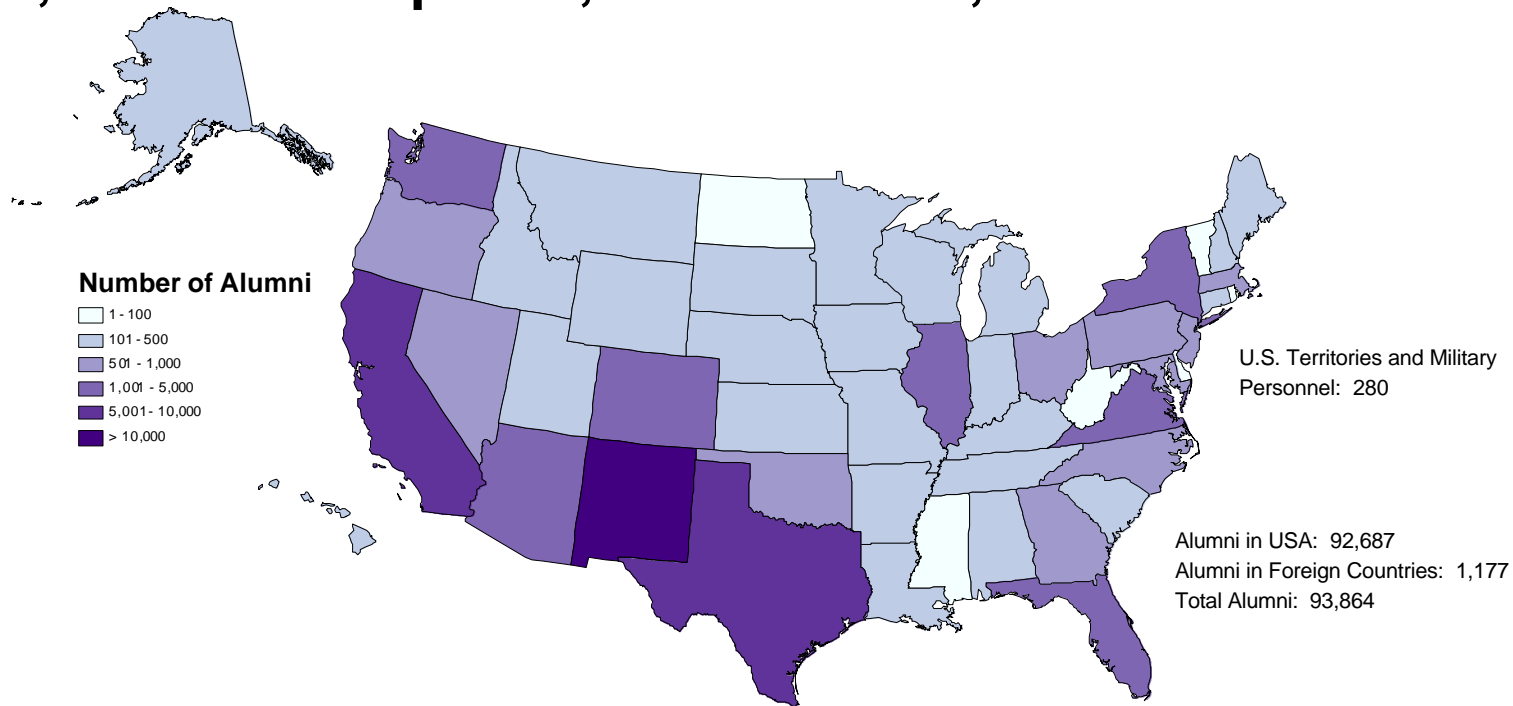

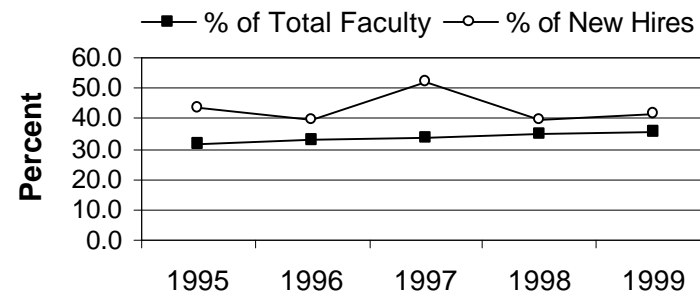
Faculty Diversity - Tenured & Tenured Track

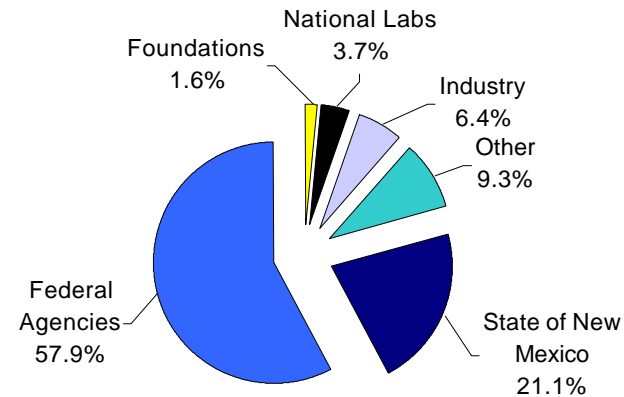

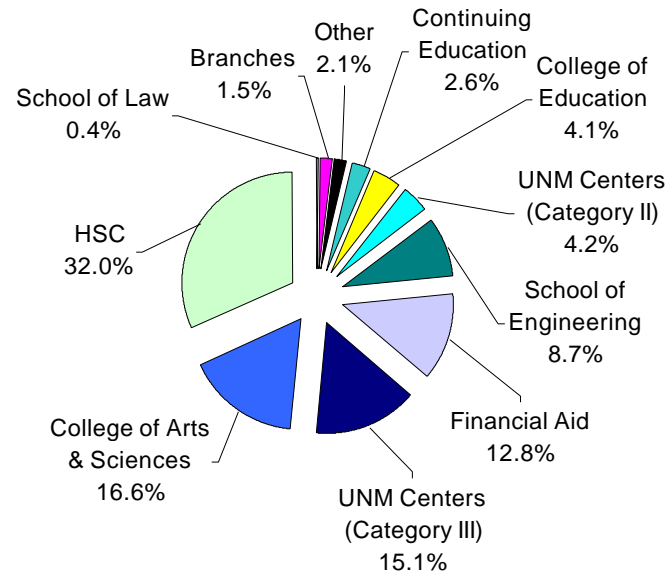

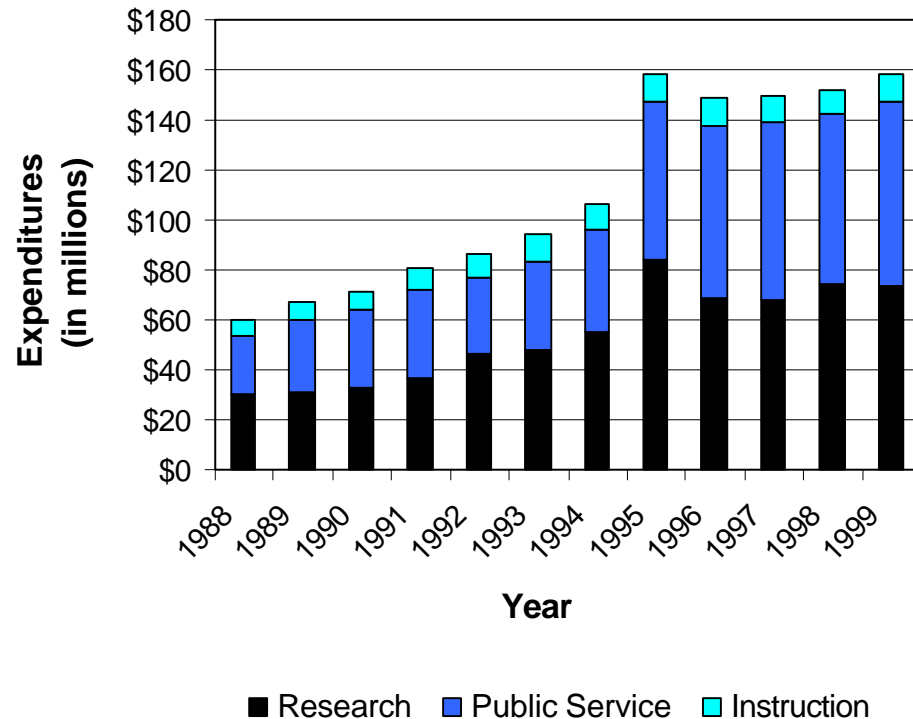

FY 1988 to FY 1999



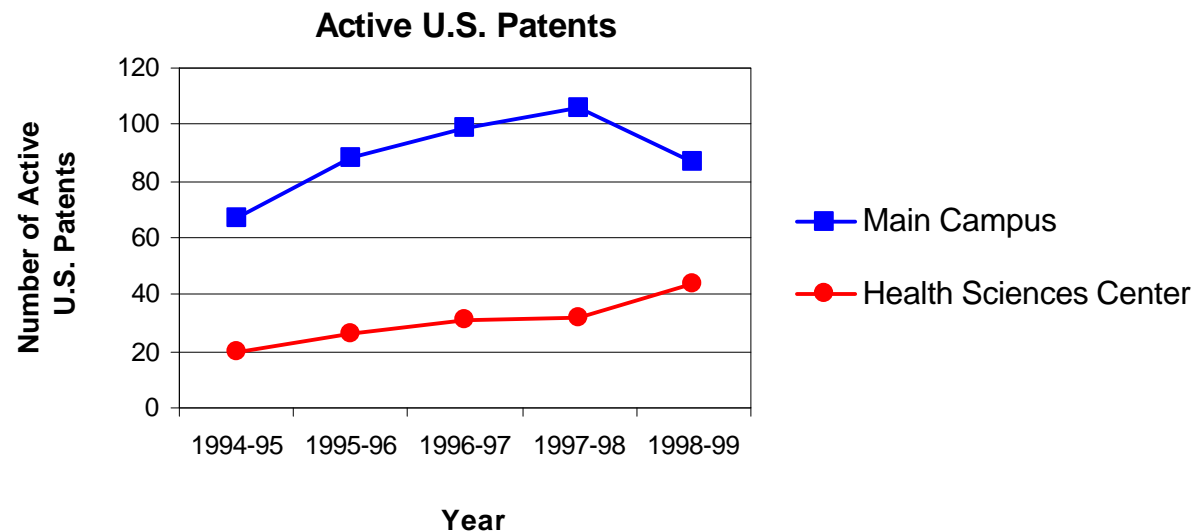

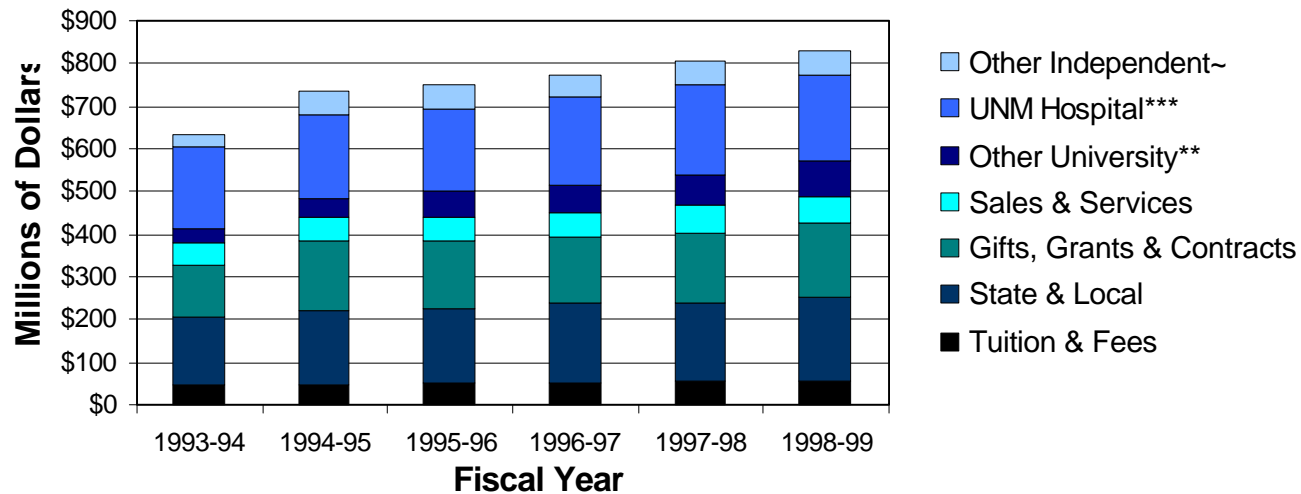

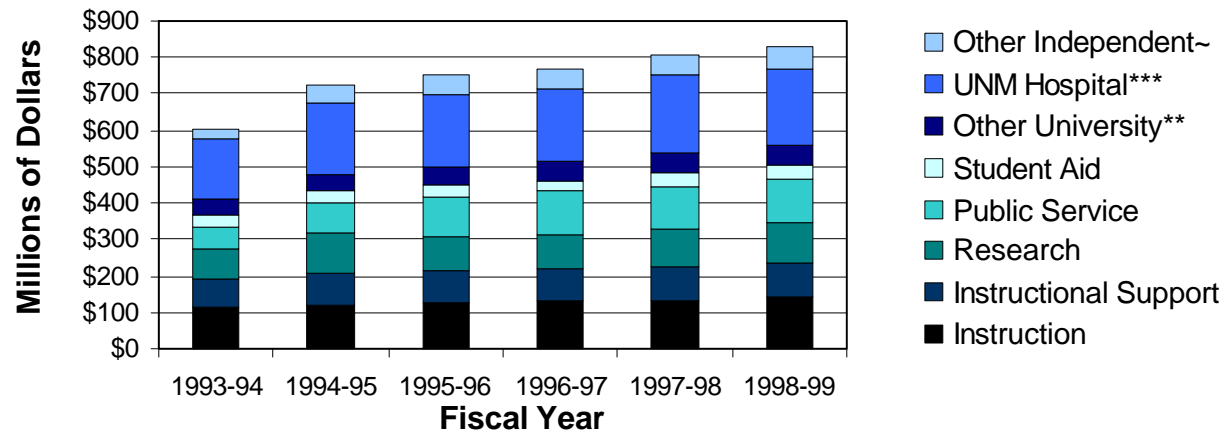

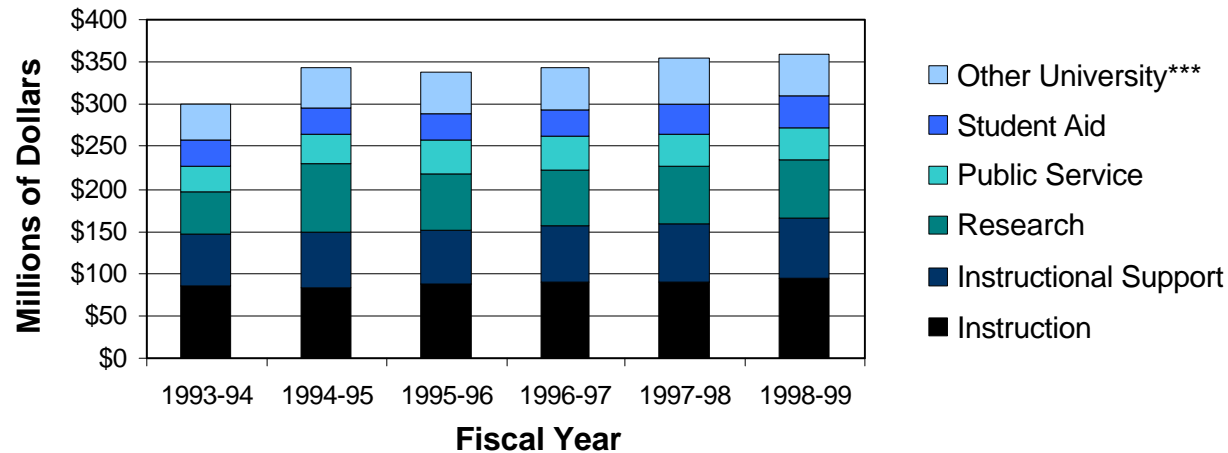

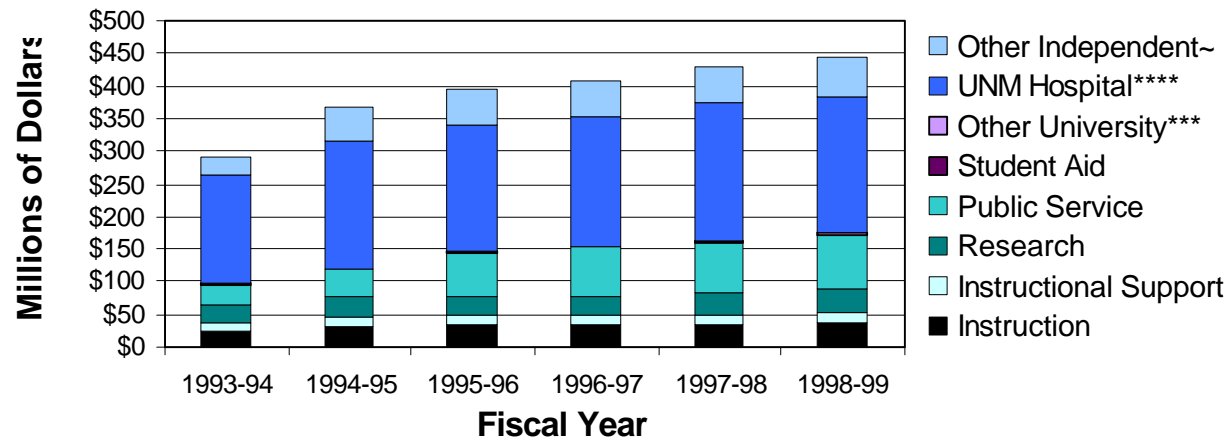

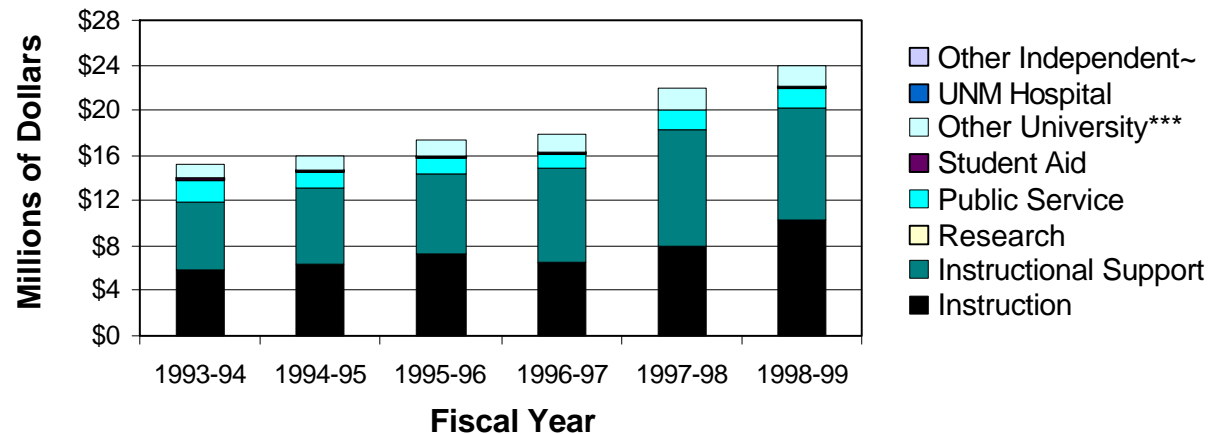

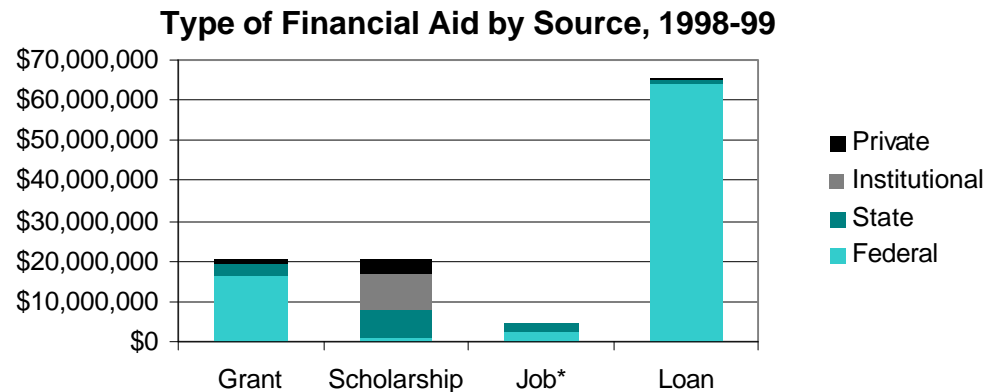

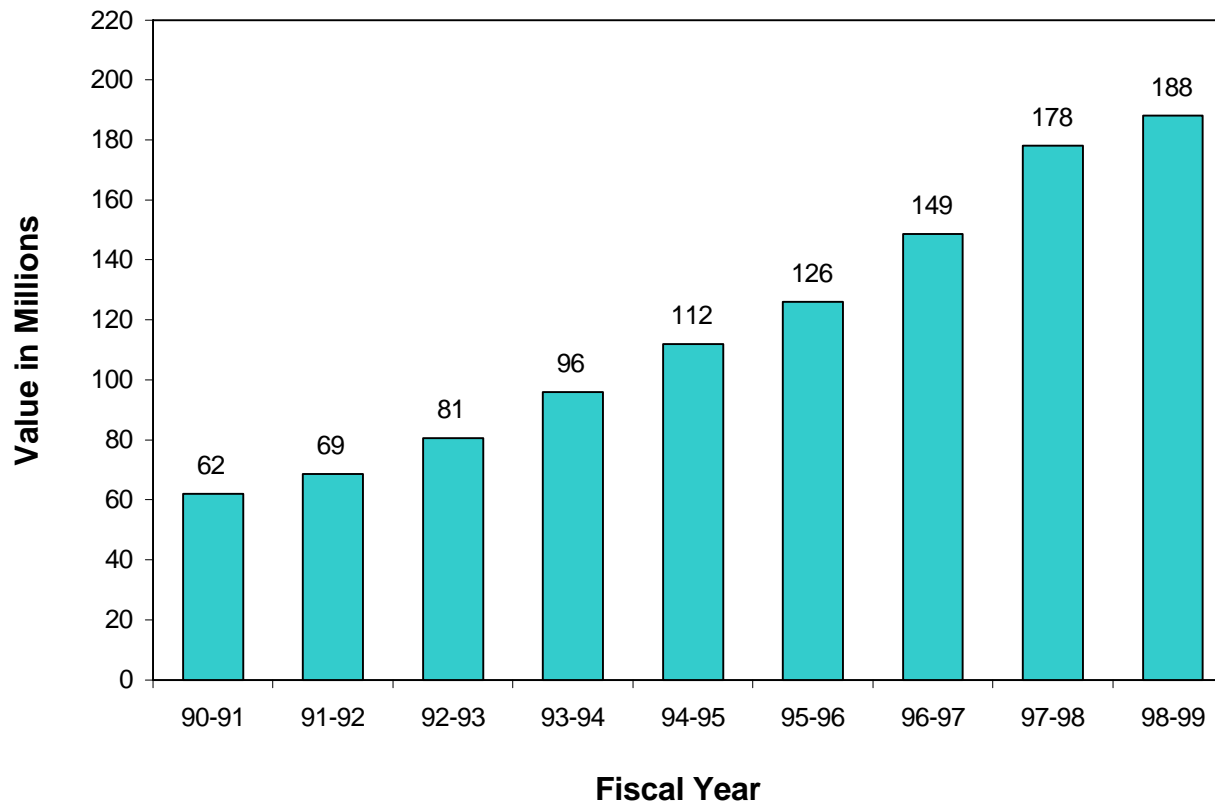

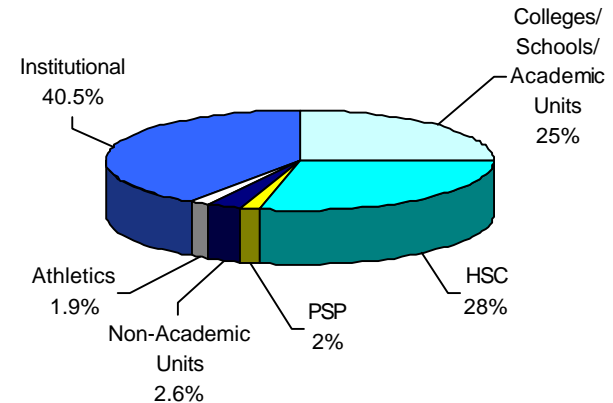

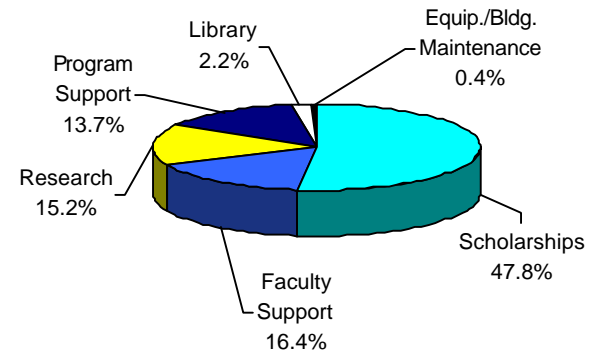

(FY 1998-99)**

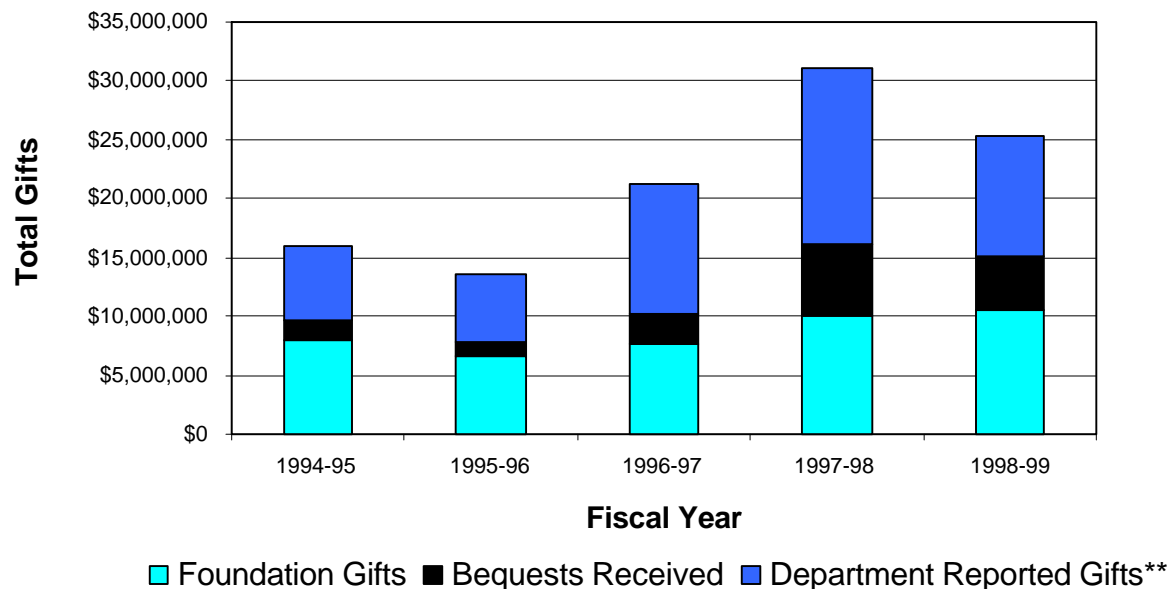

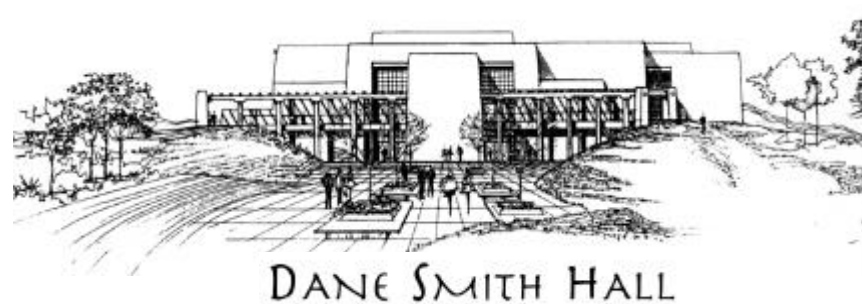

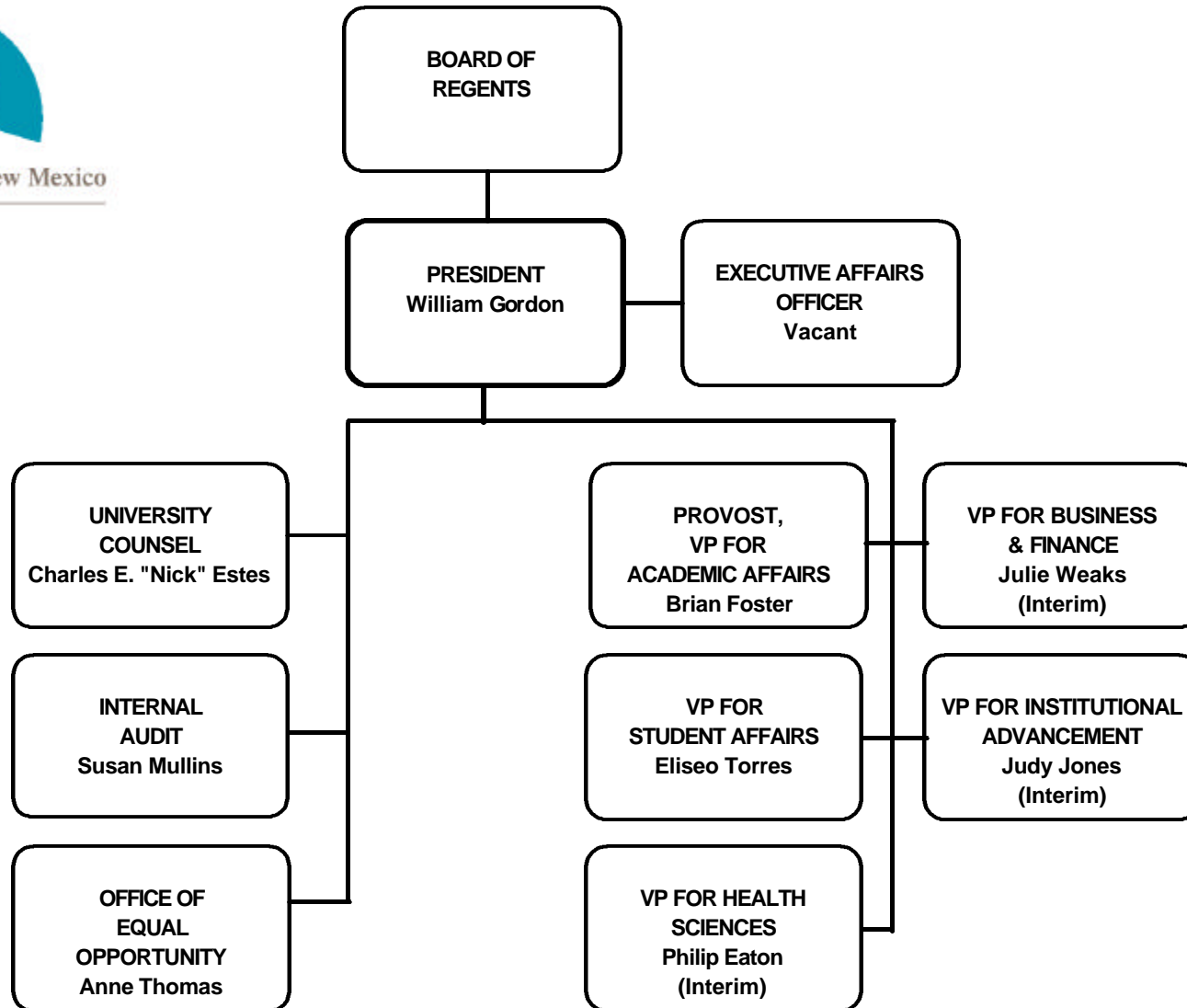

The University of New Mexico

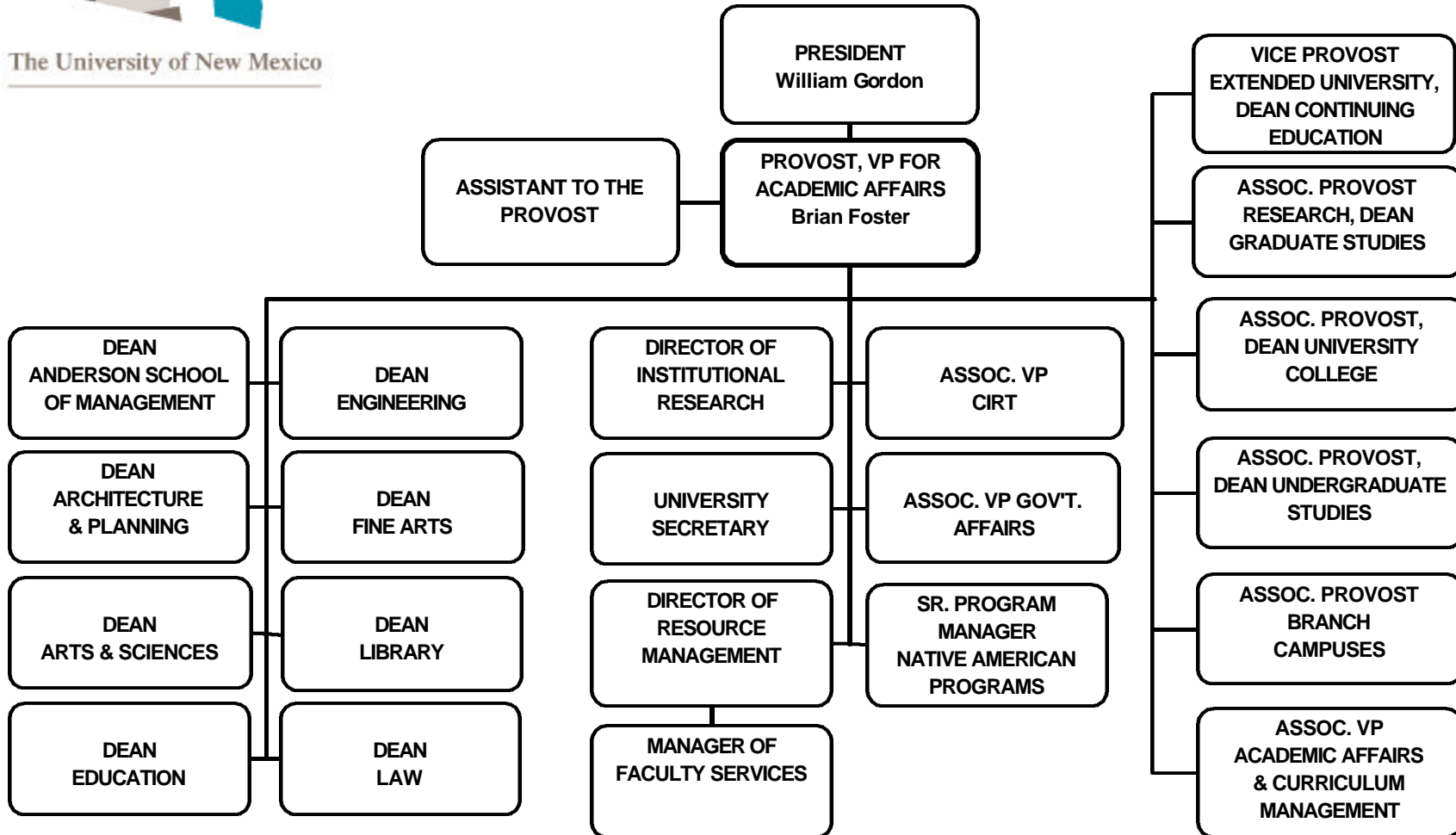
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

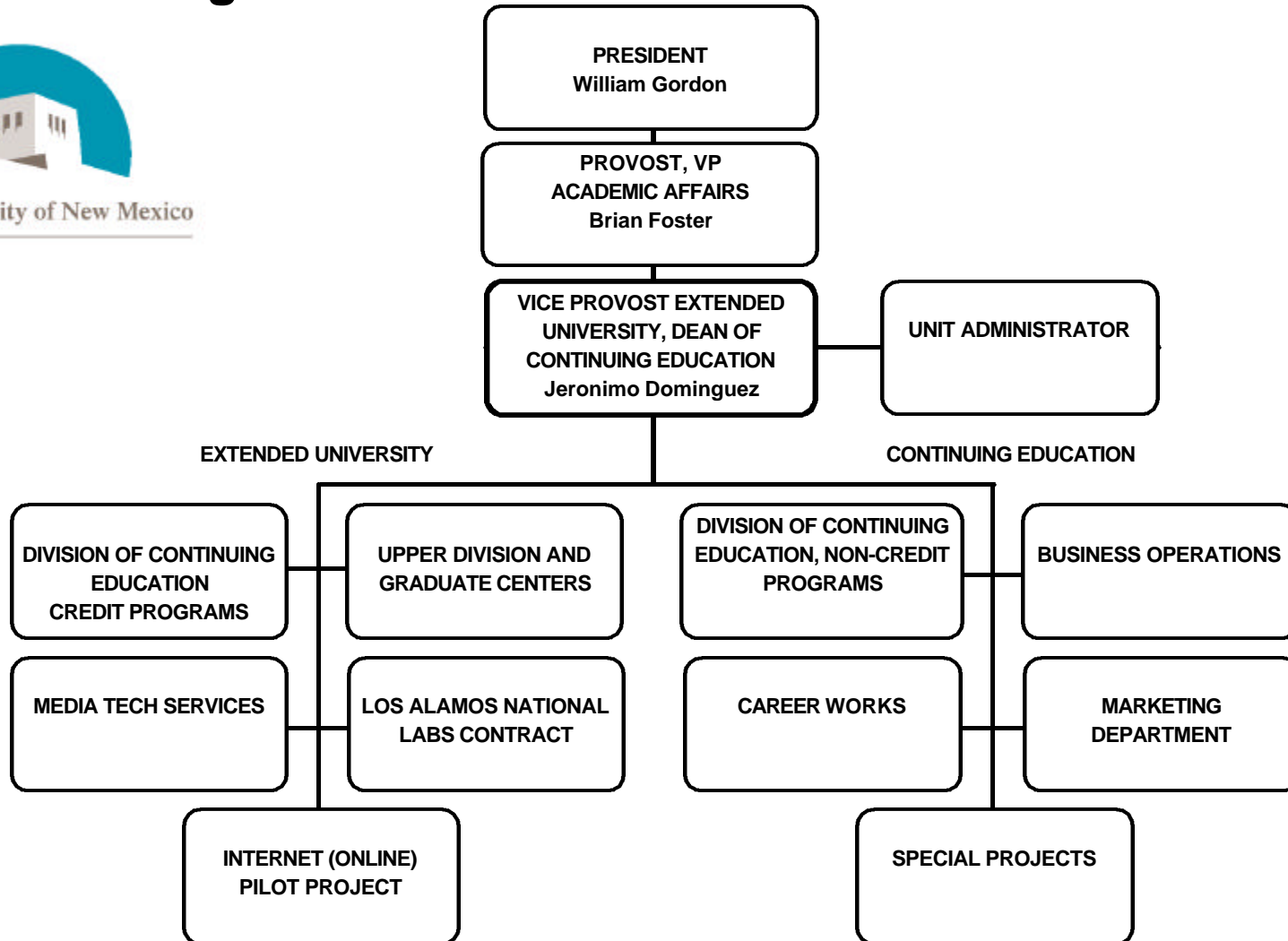
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

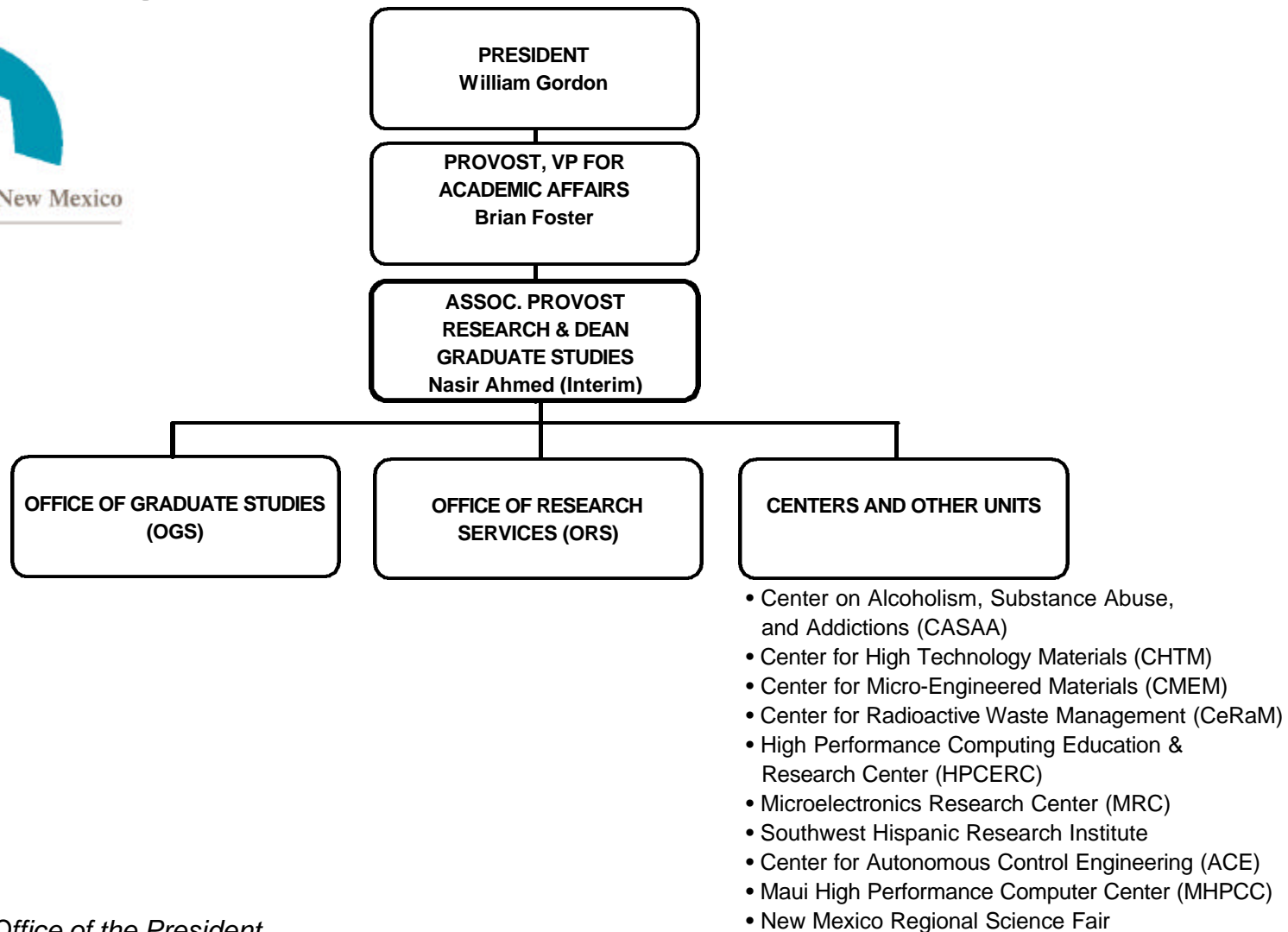
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

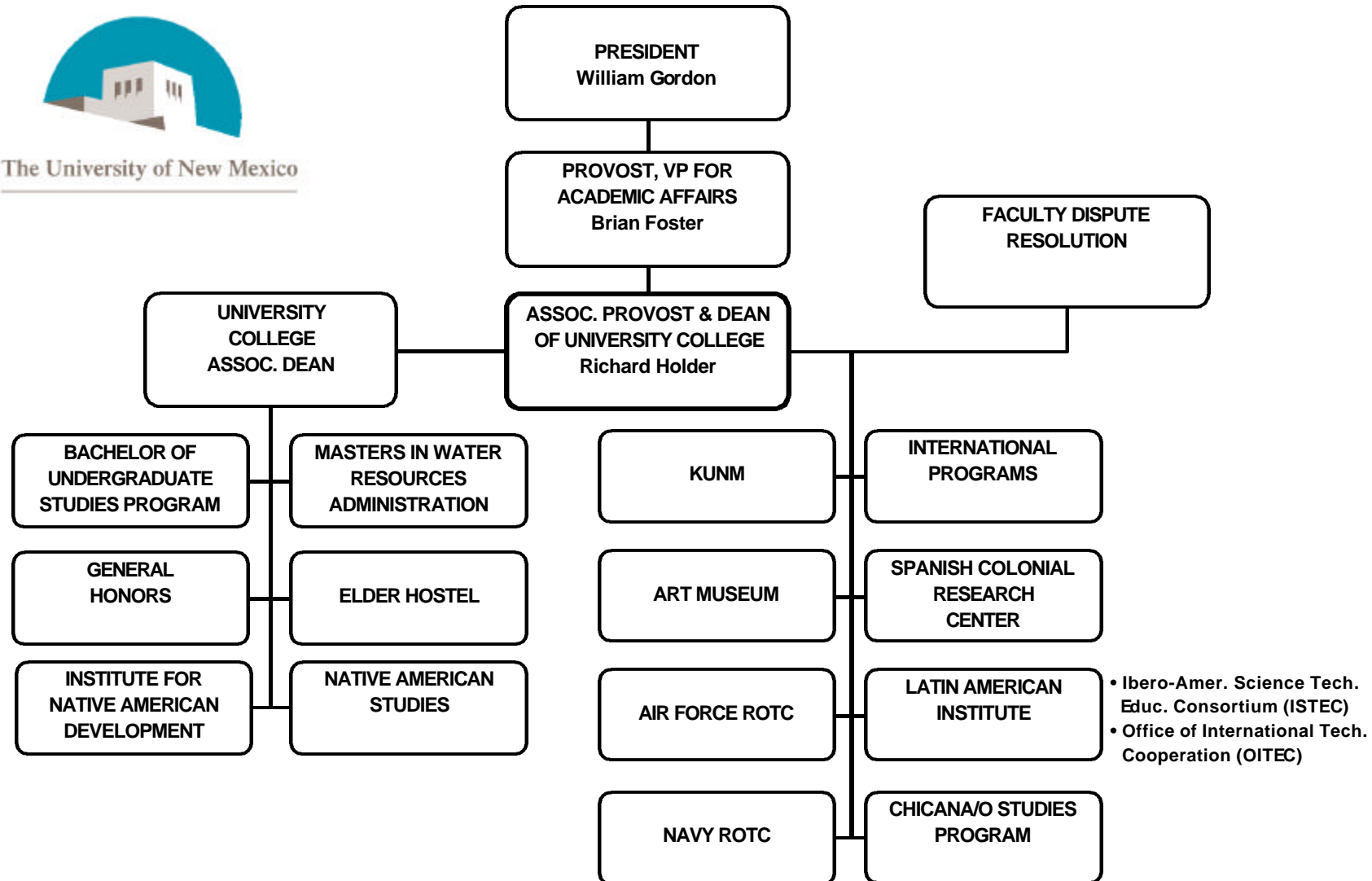
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

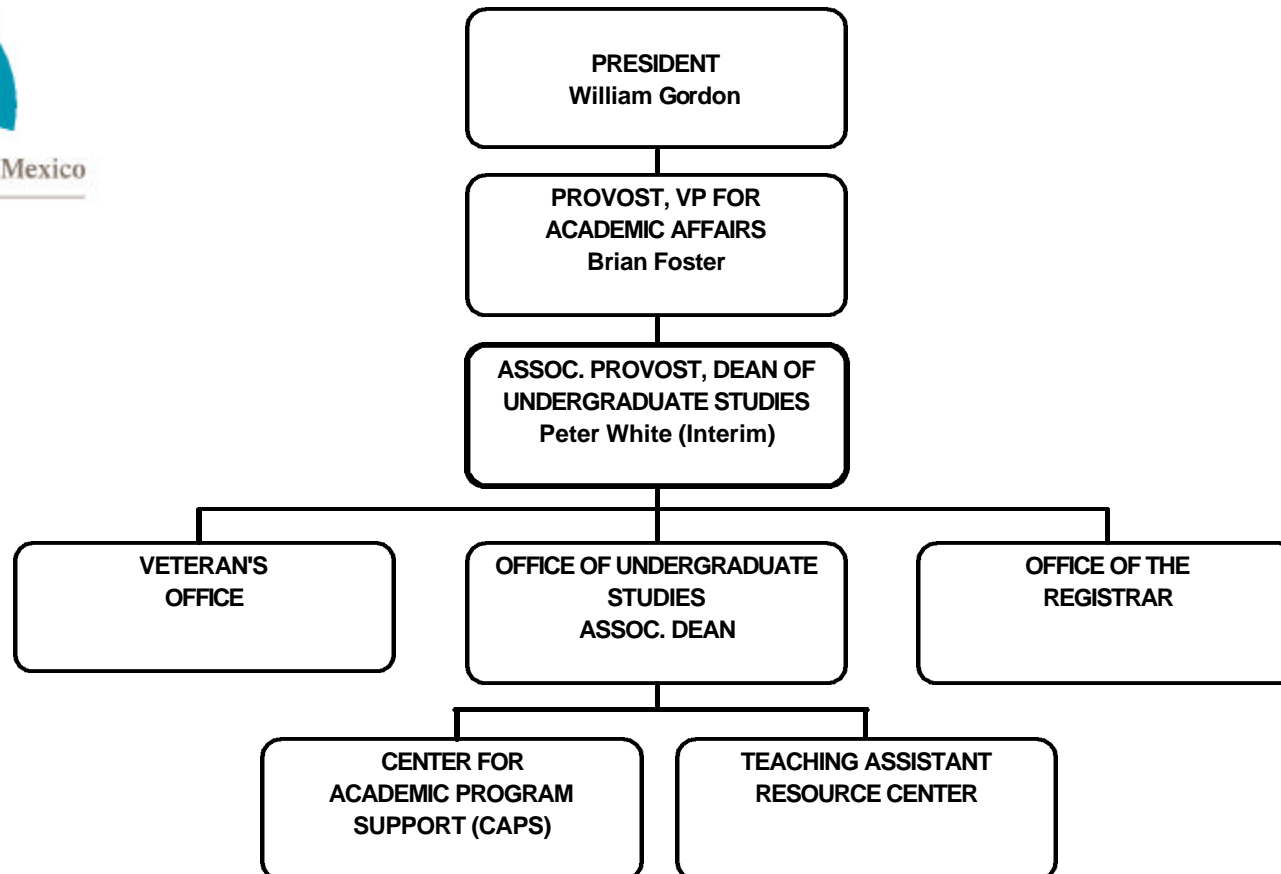
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

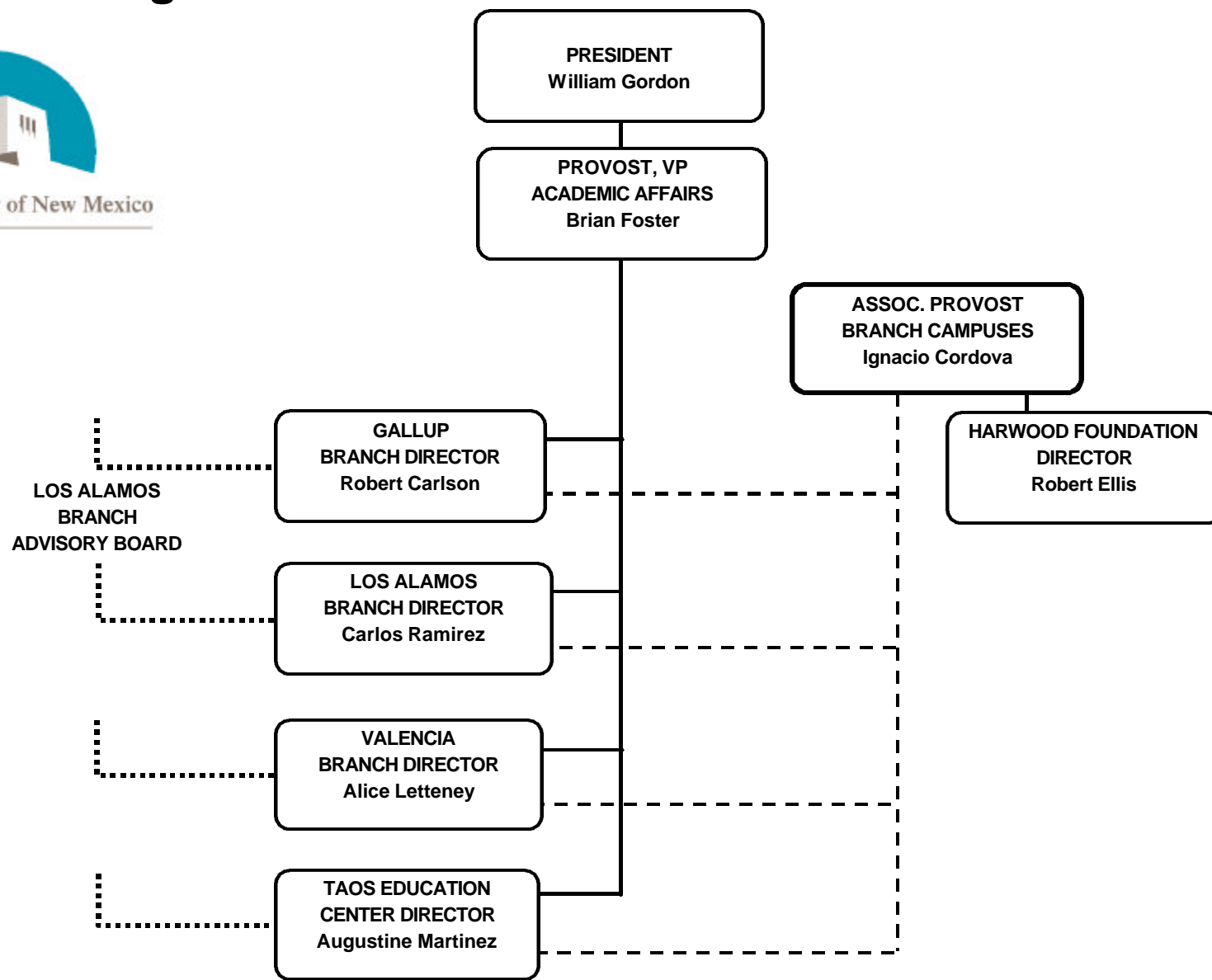
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

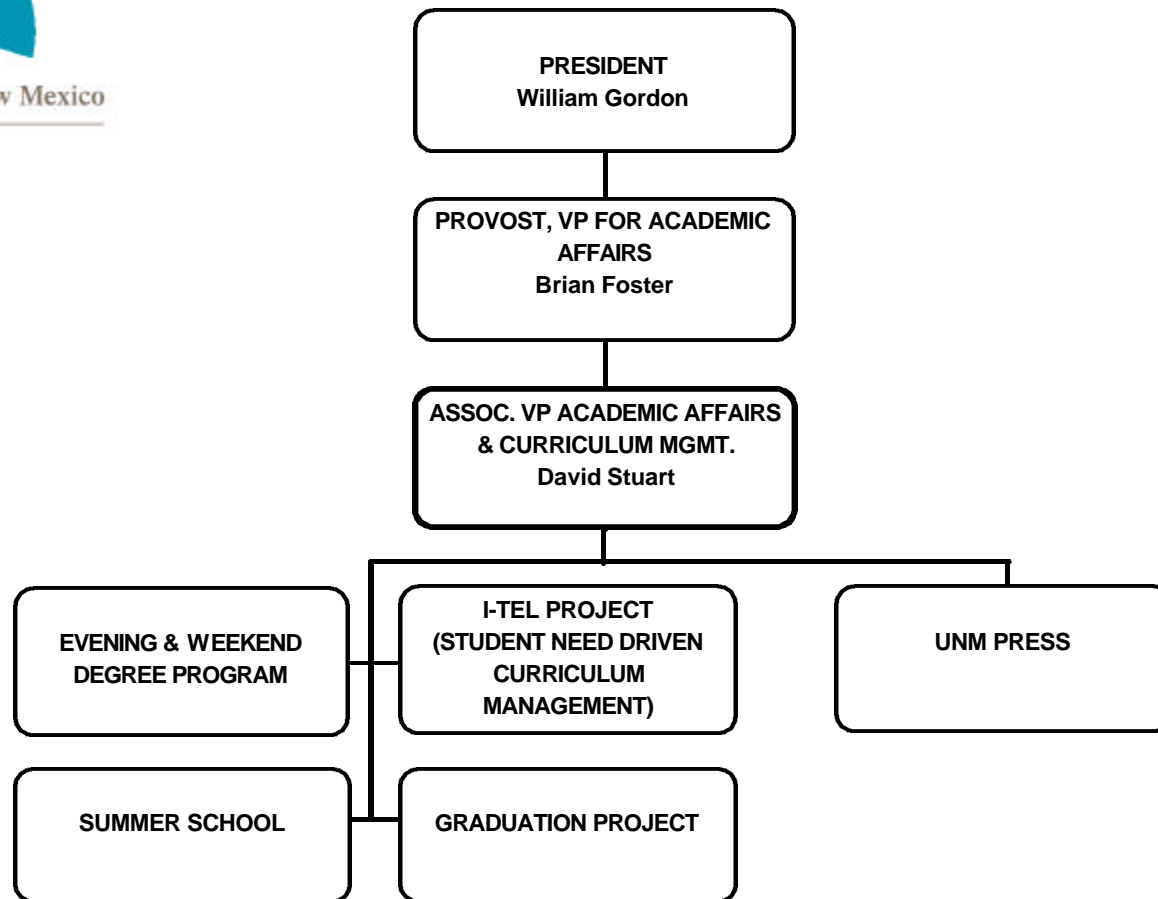

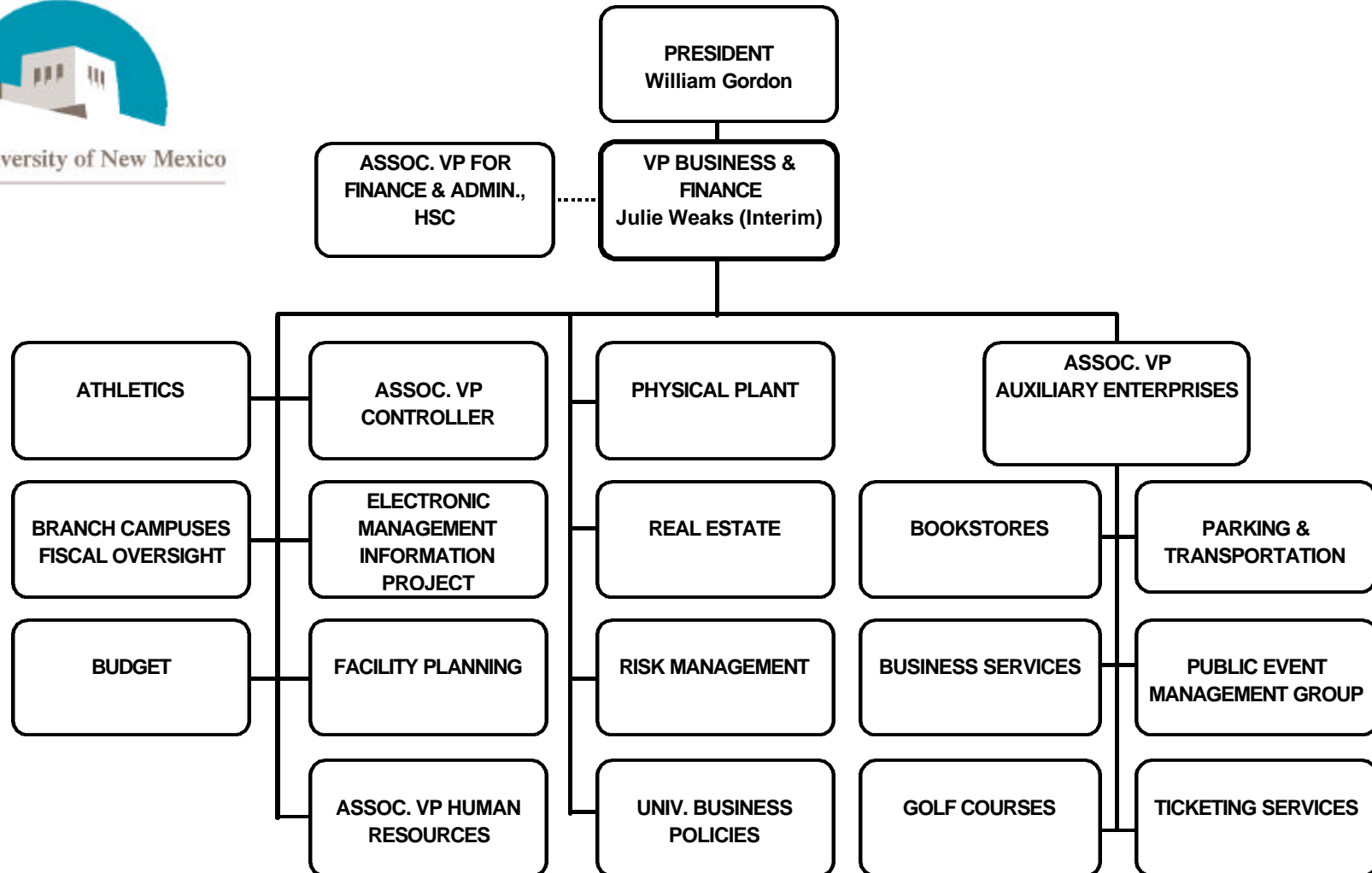
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

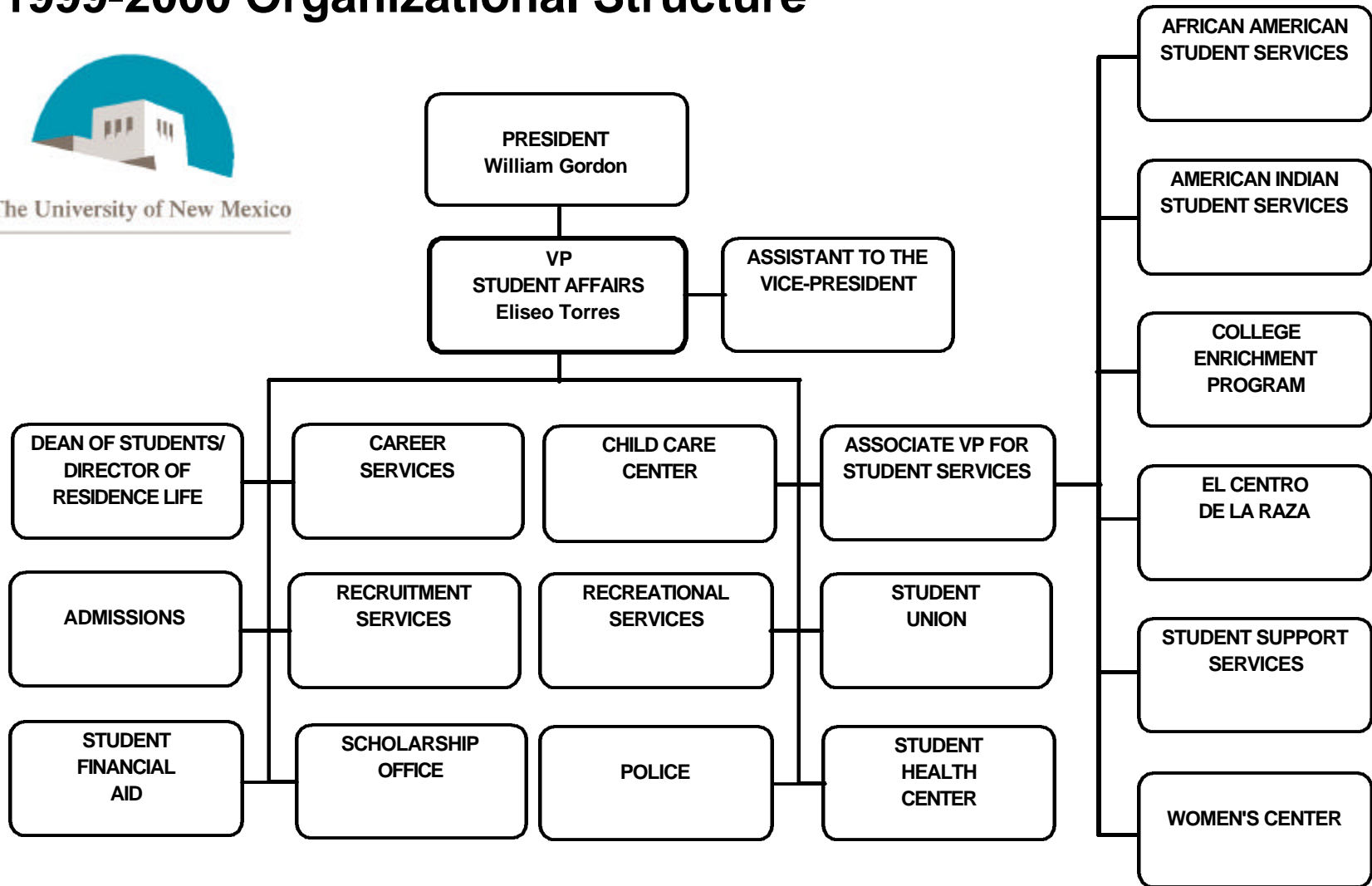
1999-2000 Organizational Structure

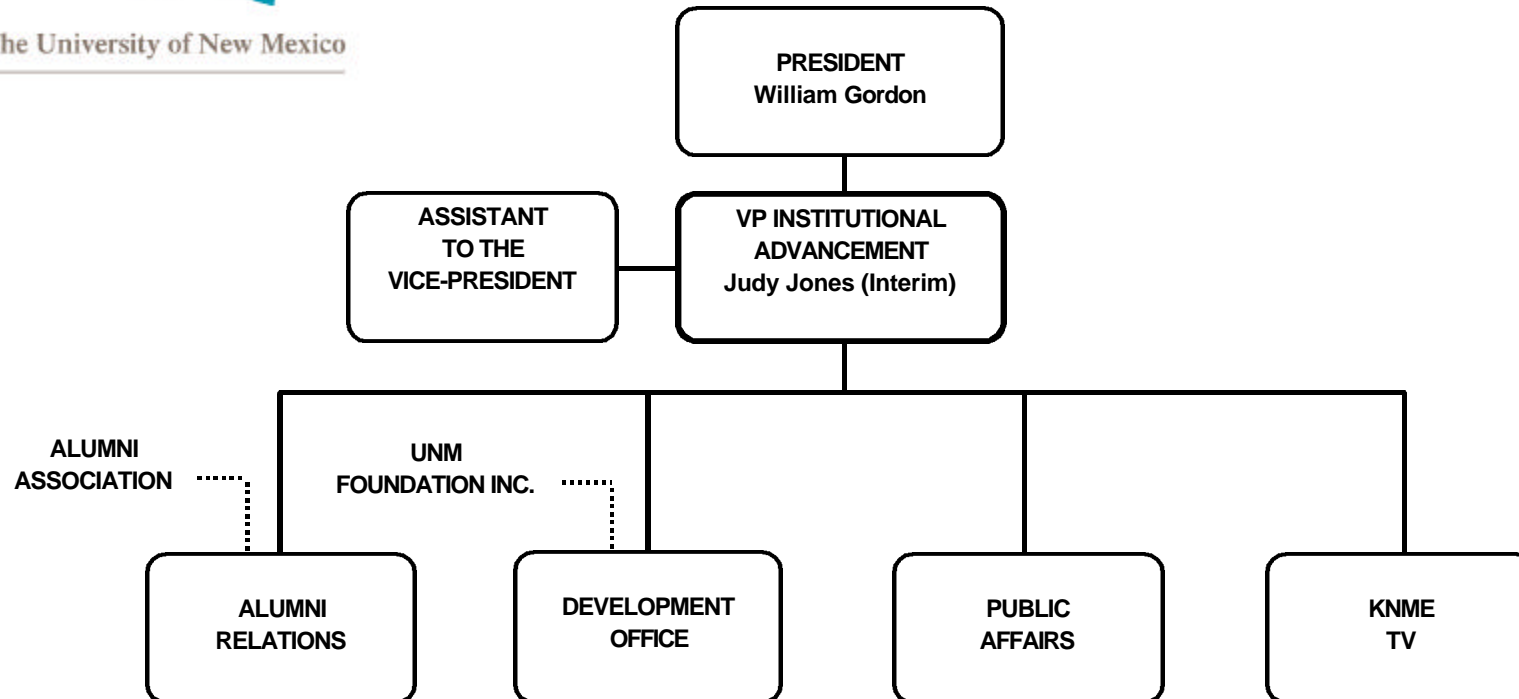

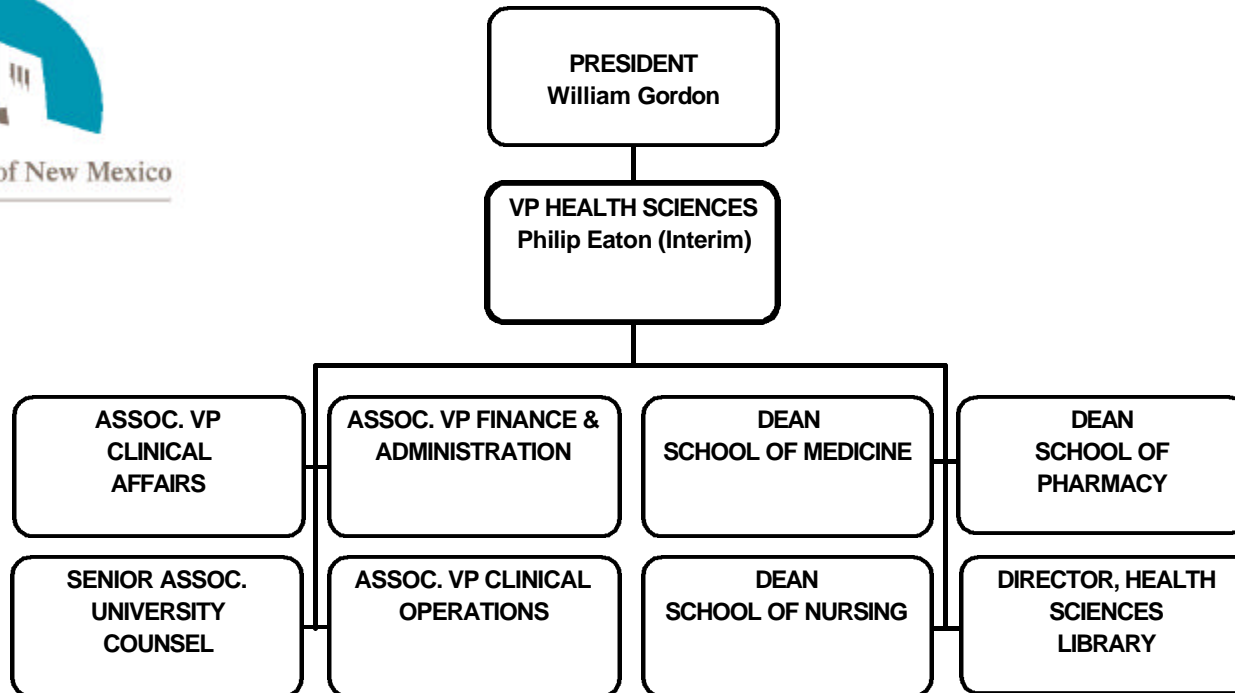

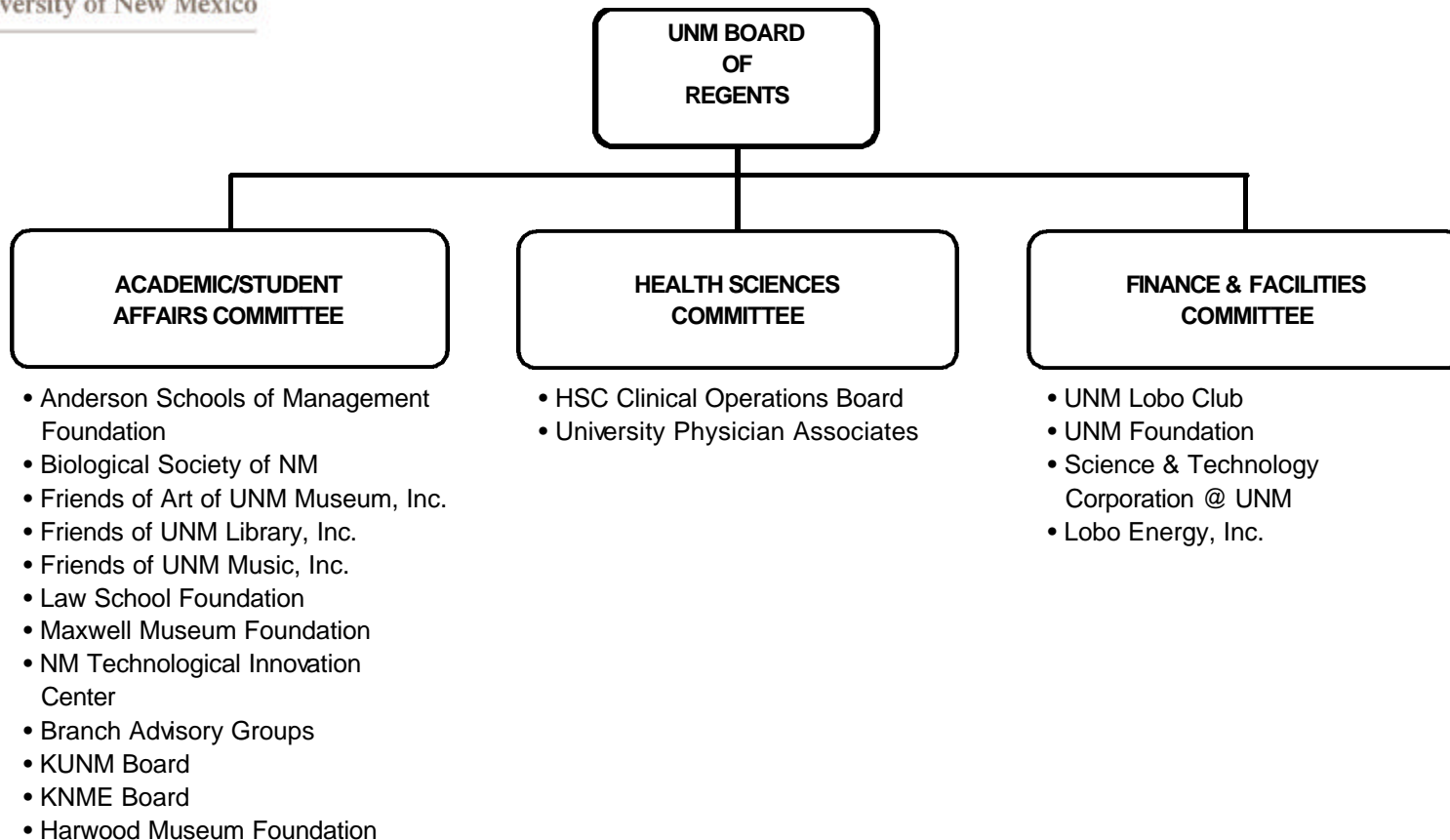
