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
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UNM Facts 2001-2002

Introduction

In fall 2001, the campuses of the University of New Mexico served 30,055 students, employed 2,854 faculty and 11,410 staff, and had a total operating and capital budget of about \$1.2 billion. In the previous academic year, UNM awarded 4,468 degrees and certificates.

This fact book presents data for all UNM campuses. UNM consists of a Main Campus located in Albuquerque, which includes the Health Sciences Center; three branch campuses, which have a two-year degree mission: UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, and UNM-Valencia; an Education Center, which functions very much like a branch campus: UNM-Taos¹; and an Extended University which provides access to courses on-site as well as via technologies—including satellite broadcasts, videoconferencing, and on-line instruction—throughout the state. The Extended University also encompasses the Upper Division & Graduate Centers at Los Alamos and Santa Fe and upper division and graduate course delivery at Taos, Gallup, Kirtland Airforce Base, and Rio Rancho. The UNM Health Sciences Center and its programs—which include the School of Medicine, College of Nursing, and College of Pharmacy—are included in the UNM Fact Book, sometimes as part of the Main Campus and sometimes separately. Footnotes and labels should make it clear in each case what is included.




An additional unit of the University of New Mexico is the Division of Continuing Education and Community Services, which serves approximately 33,000 students annually in various non-credit or certificate courses, workshops, and training sessions. The Division serves another 10,600 students and clients in a variety of areas, including testing for placement and certification and evaluation for training and educational services. An additional 9,000 students earning academic credits were served during 2000-2001 through units assigned to Continuing Education, including Non-Degree Advisement, Independent Study, and Extension Services.

Historical Enrollment, Fall 1929-2001





















County of Origin of Recent HS Graduates from NM High Schools Main Campus, Average Number of Freshmen (Fall 1997-2001)



UNM's Main Campus offers over 200 degree programs. There are 91 baccalaureate, 65 masters, and 36 doctoral level degree programs. Many of the degree programs have additional concentrations and options; for example, the Bachelors in Business Administration degree has a number of concentrations. (See the UNM catalog for information on degree concentrations.) In addition, there is 1 certificate program; 3 graduate certificate programs; 1 associate degree program; 5 education specialist degrees (graduate programs beyond the masters level); and 3 first-professional degree programs in law, medicine, and pharmacy.

The University offers an Evening and Weekend Degree Program (EWDP) in which at least 20 complete degree programs are available, and core courses are offered in at least 42 additional degree programs. About 1,000 classes are offered each semester after 4:00 p.m. or on weekends. Approximately 11,500 non-traditional, working students attend UNM at night each semester. 







UNM Alumni in New Mexico by County






Faculty Diversity - New Hires









UNM Main Campus libraries include the UNM General Library (UNMGL), the Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC), and the UNM Law Library (LL), representing three administratively distinct organizations. The UNM General Library encompasses Zimmerman Library (the University's main library), Centennial Science and Engineering Library, Parish Memorial Library, the Fine Arts Library, the Center for Regional Studies (CRS), and the Center for Southwest Research (CSWR). Other libraries (Other) include the following main campus libraries:

Bainbridge Bunting Memorial Slide Library, Multicultural Education Center(MEC)/Equity Library, Tireman Learning Materials Library, and the Native American Studies Center Library. UNMGL is comparable to a non-departmentalized college within the University and is administered by the Dean of Library Services who reports to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs. HSLIC reports to the Vice President for Health Sciences. LL reports to the Dean of the School of Law.

The UNM main campus libraries represent the largest academic collections in the state. They provide a large body of information in print and electronic sources accessible through workstations and the internet. In addition to providing access to resources, the libraries provide instructional opportunities for faculty, students, and staff through formal classes and one-on-one instruction. In 2000, the main campus libraries ranked 57 out of 112 academic libraries in the Association of Research Libraries (ARL). UNM holds membership in the largest information scientific and technology consortium in America—the Alliance for Innovation in Science and Technology Information. The library hosts the online catalog for the state serving 27 academic and special library collections in New Mexico. The libraries' lending network includes the OCLC (38,000 libraries); the Greater Western Library Alliance, formerly Big 12+ Consortium (32 libraries); and the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (more than 4,600 libraries), a program of the National Library of Medicine and the Amigos network (432 libraries).


Taos Education Center
















Consolidated Investment Fund (CIF) Market Value by Donor-Designated by Recipient (Value as of June 30, 2001)

Consolidated Investment Fund (CIF) Disbursements by Purpose (FY 2001)







UNM Organizational Structure



2001-2002 Organizational Structure*





Provost, VP for Academic Affairs: Branch Campuses








2001-2002 Organizational Structure






