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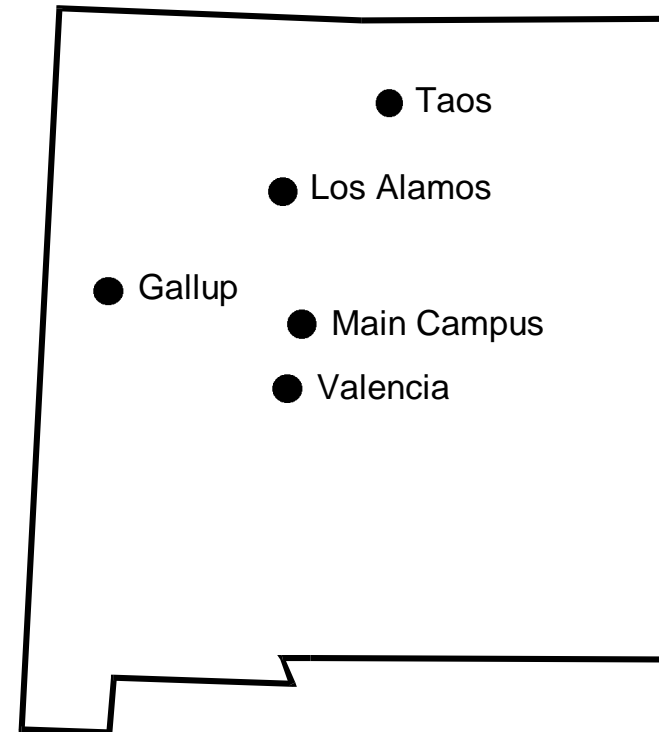

Introduction

In Fall 2005, the campuses of the University of New Mexico served 32,914 students; employed 3,183 faculty, 6,986 staff, and 5,040 students (an additional 4,453 staff work at University Hospital); and had a total operating and capital budget of about \$1.57 billion. In the previous academic year, UNM awarded 4,929 degrees and certificates.

This fact book presents data for all UNM campuses. UNM consists of a Main Campus located in Albuquerque, which includes the Health Sciences Center, Extended University, and Continuing Education, and four branch campuses, which have a two-year degree mission: UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, UNM-Taos, and UNM-Valencia. The Extended University provides access to courses on-site and via technologies—including satellite broadcasts, videoconferencing, and on-line instruction—throughout the state. The Extended University also offers courses at centers located in Espanola, Farmington, Gallup, Kirtland Air Force Base, Los Alamos, Santa Fe, Taos, Valencia, and UNM West (Rio Rancho). The UNM Health Sciences Center and its programs—which include the School of Medicine, College of Nursing, and College of Pharmacy—are sometimes reported in the Fact Book as part of the Main Campus and sometimes separately. Footnotes and labels should make it clear in each case what is included.

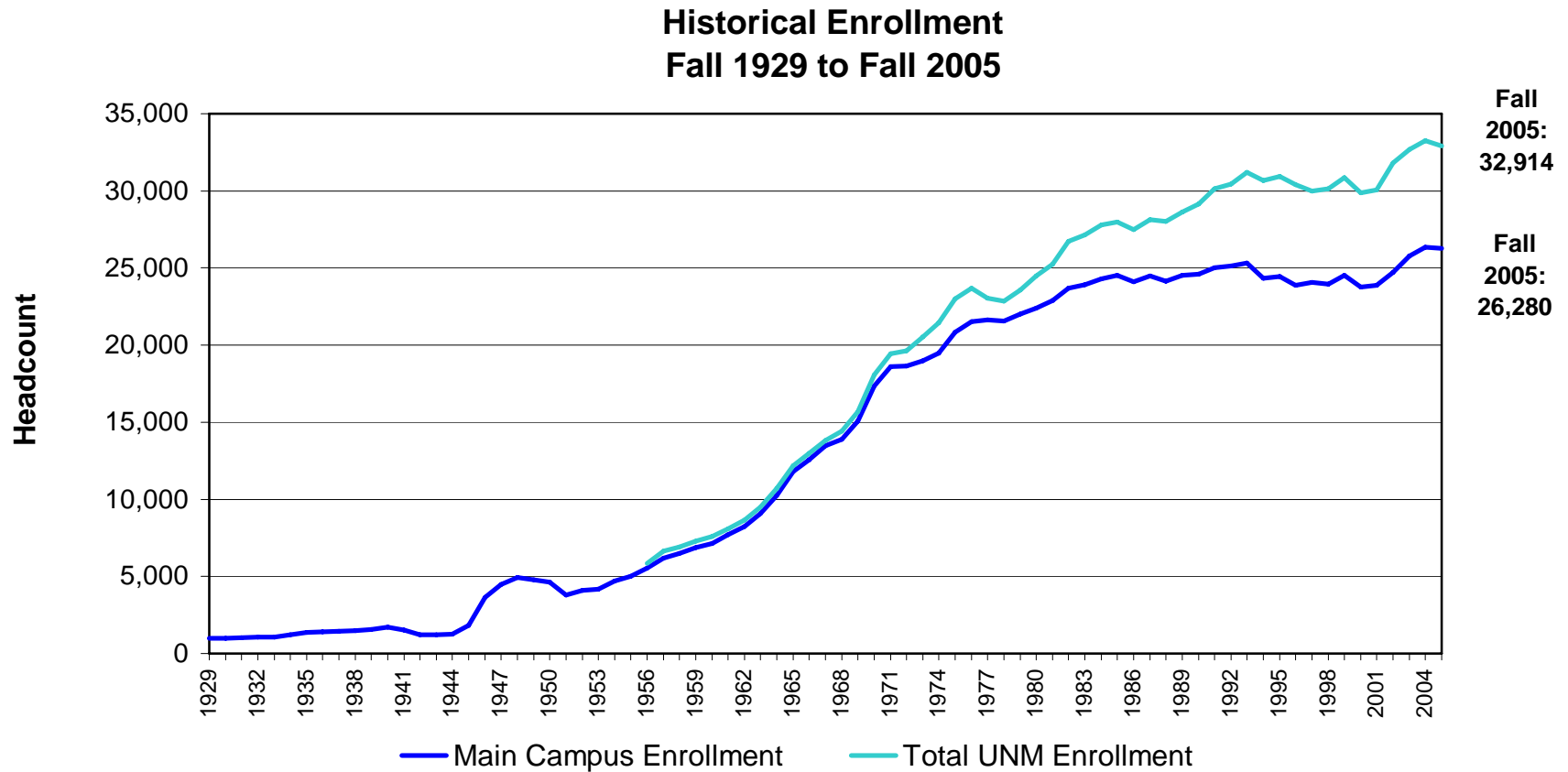


An additional unit of the University of New Mexico is the Division of Continuing Education and Community Services, which serves approximately 20,000 students annually in various non-credit or certificate courses, workshops, and training sessions. Approximately 200,000 community and UNM participants use the Conference Center facility each year.

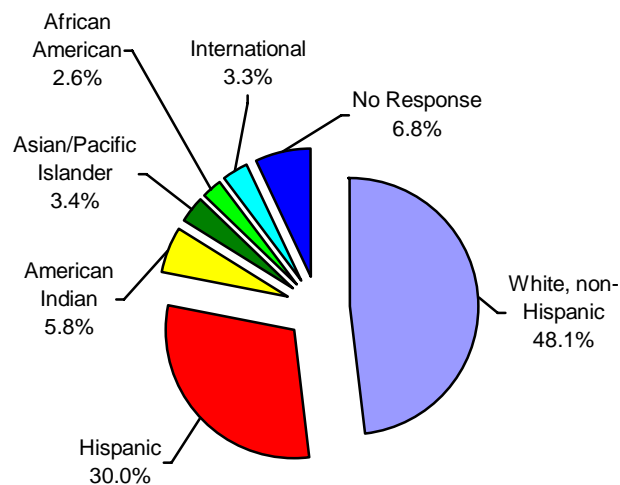

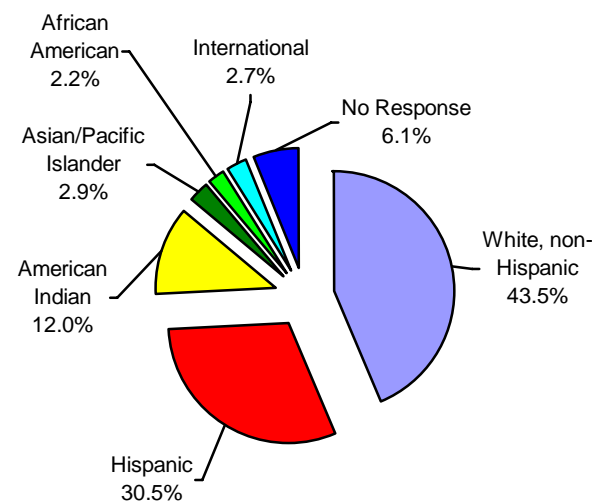

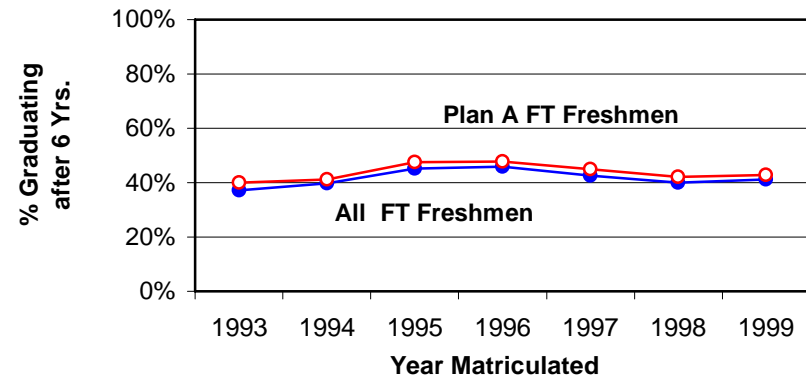

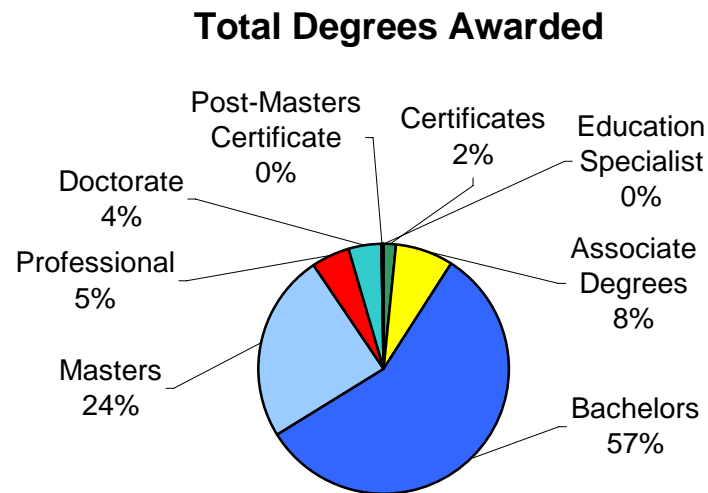
6-Year Graduation Rates Full-time Freshmen

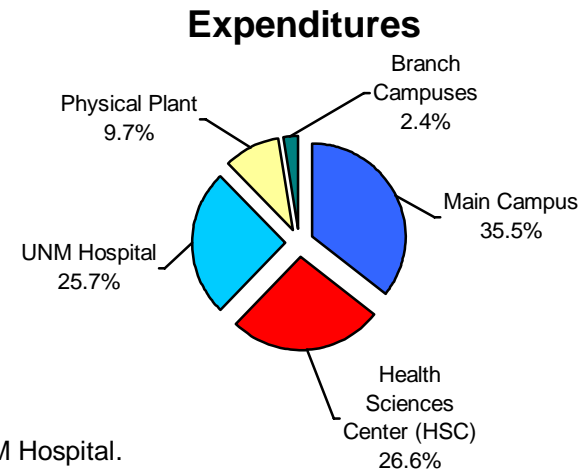

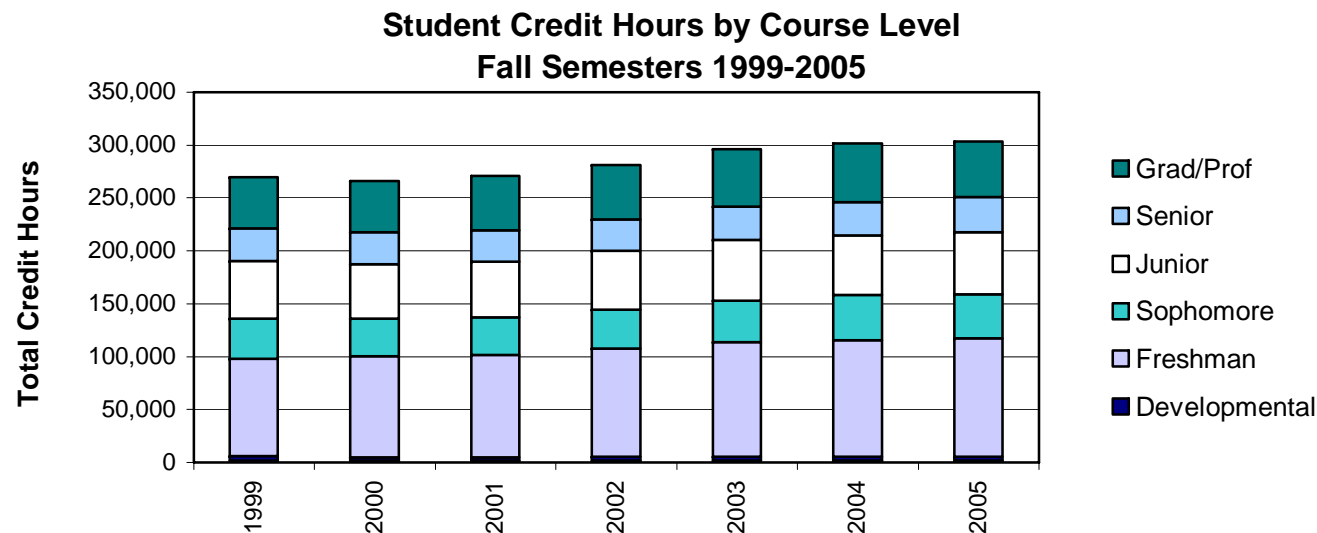

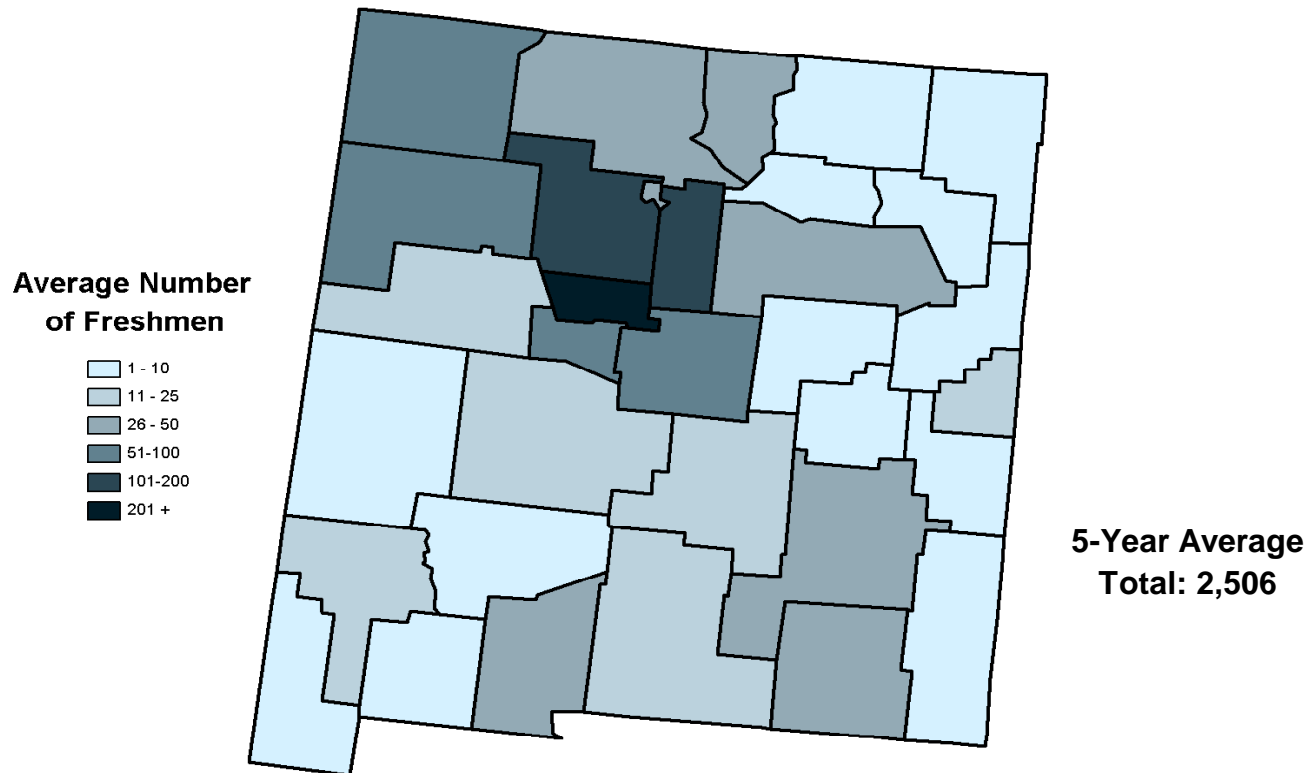

County of Origin of Recent HS Graduates from NM High Schools Main Campus, Average Number of Freshmen (Fall 2001-2005)

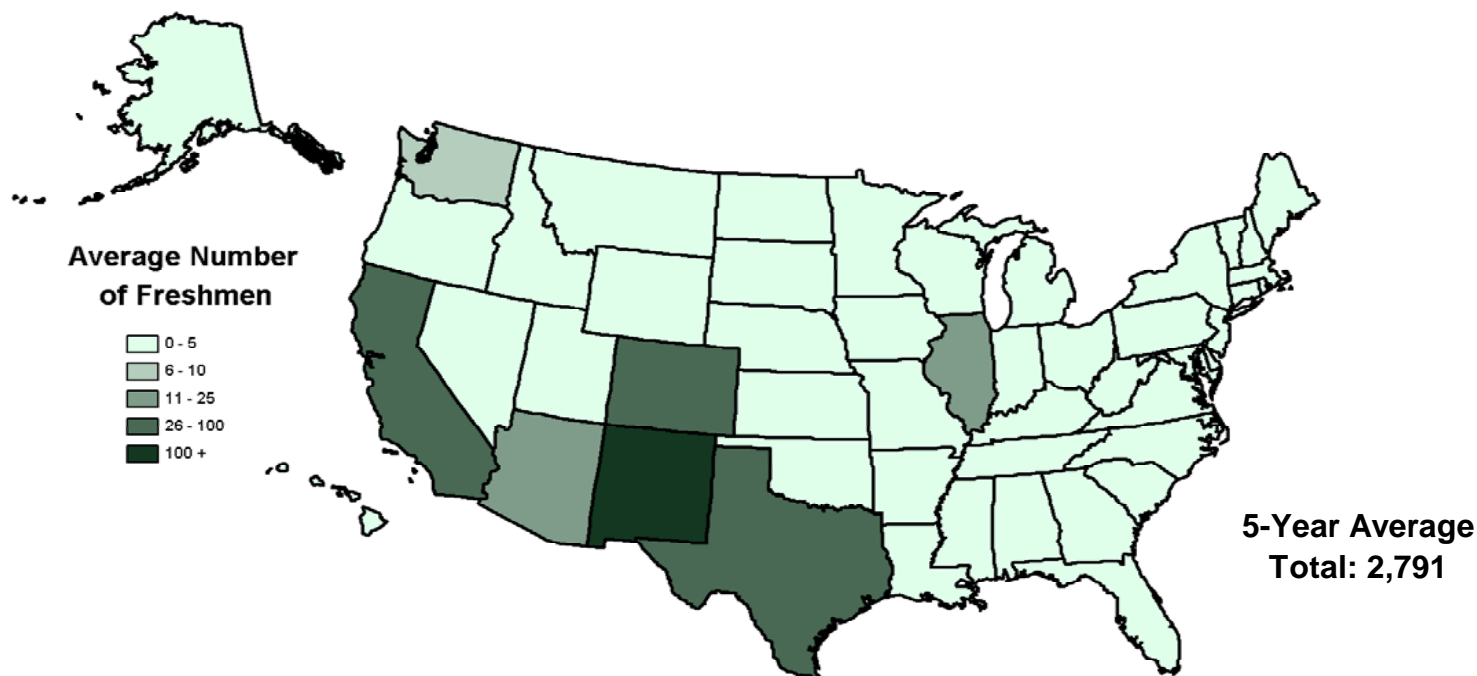

UNM's Main Campus offers over 215 degree and certificate programs. There are 93 baccalaureate, 70 masters, and 37 doctoral level degree programs. Many of the degree programs have additional concentrations and options; for example, the Bachelors in Business Administration degree has a number of concentrations. (See the UNM catalog for information on degree concentrations.) In addition, there are 3 first-professional degree programs—in law, medicine, and pharmacy—as well as 5 education specialist certificates (graduate programs beyond the masters level), 5 graduate certificate programs, 1 undergraduate certificate program, and 2 associate degree programs.

The University offers an Evening and Weekend Degree Program (EWDP) in which nearly 40 complete degree programs are available, and core courses are offered in a number of additional degree programs. About 1,000 classes are offered each semester after 4:00 p.m. or on weekends. Approximately 12,000 non-traditional, working students attend UNM at night each semester. Several academic and technical programs leading to AA, AS, and AAS degrees are offered, as well as one-year certificates and customized training.

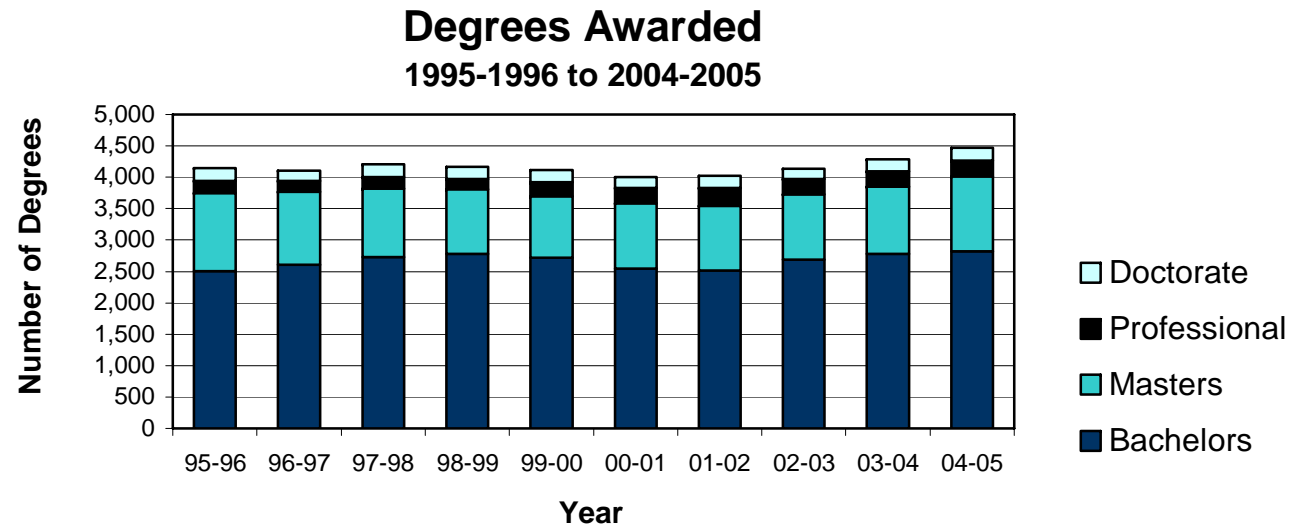
UNM-Valencia

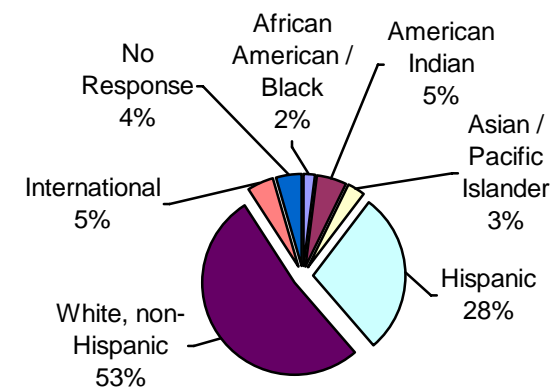

(by Ethnicity)**

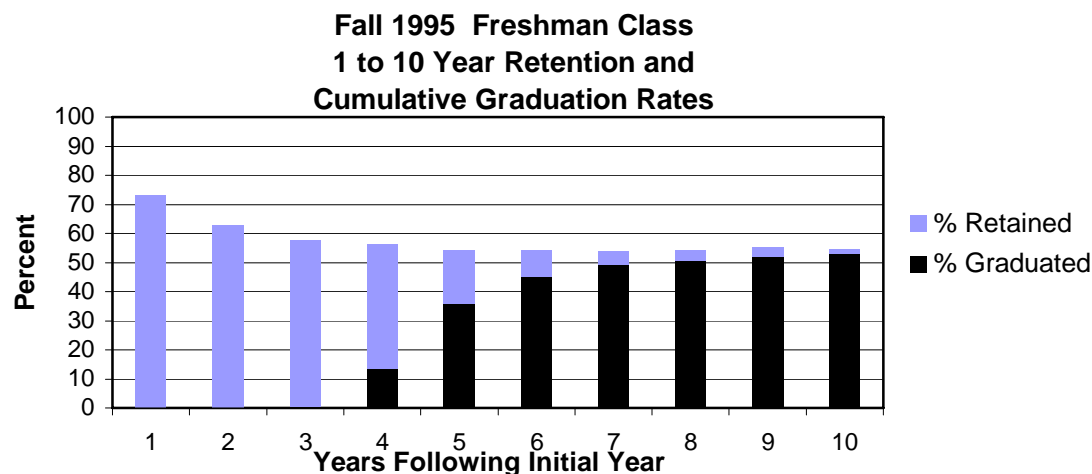

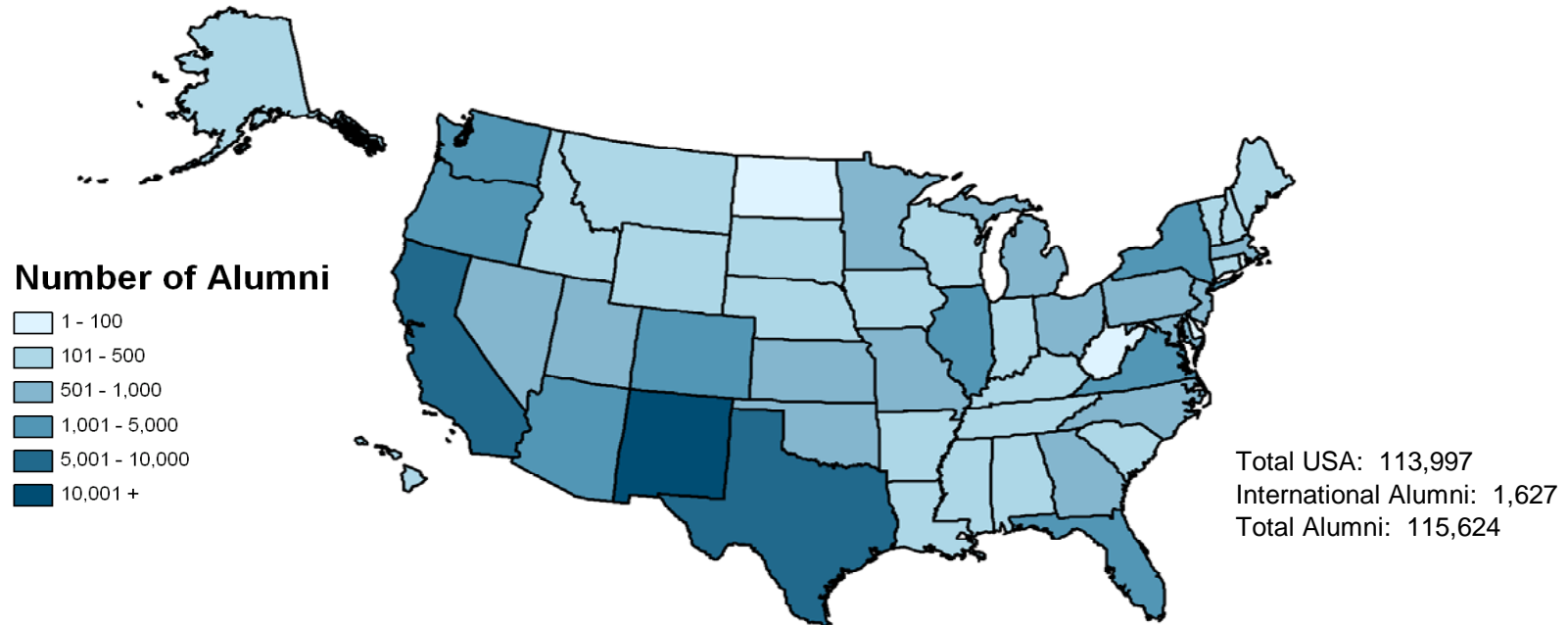

Main and Branch Campus Alumni Combined



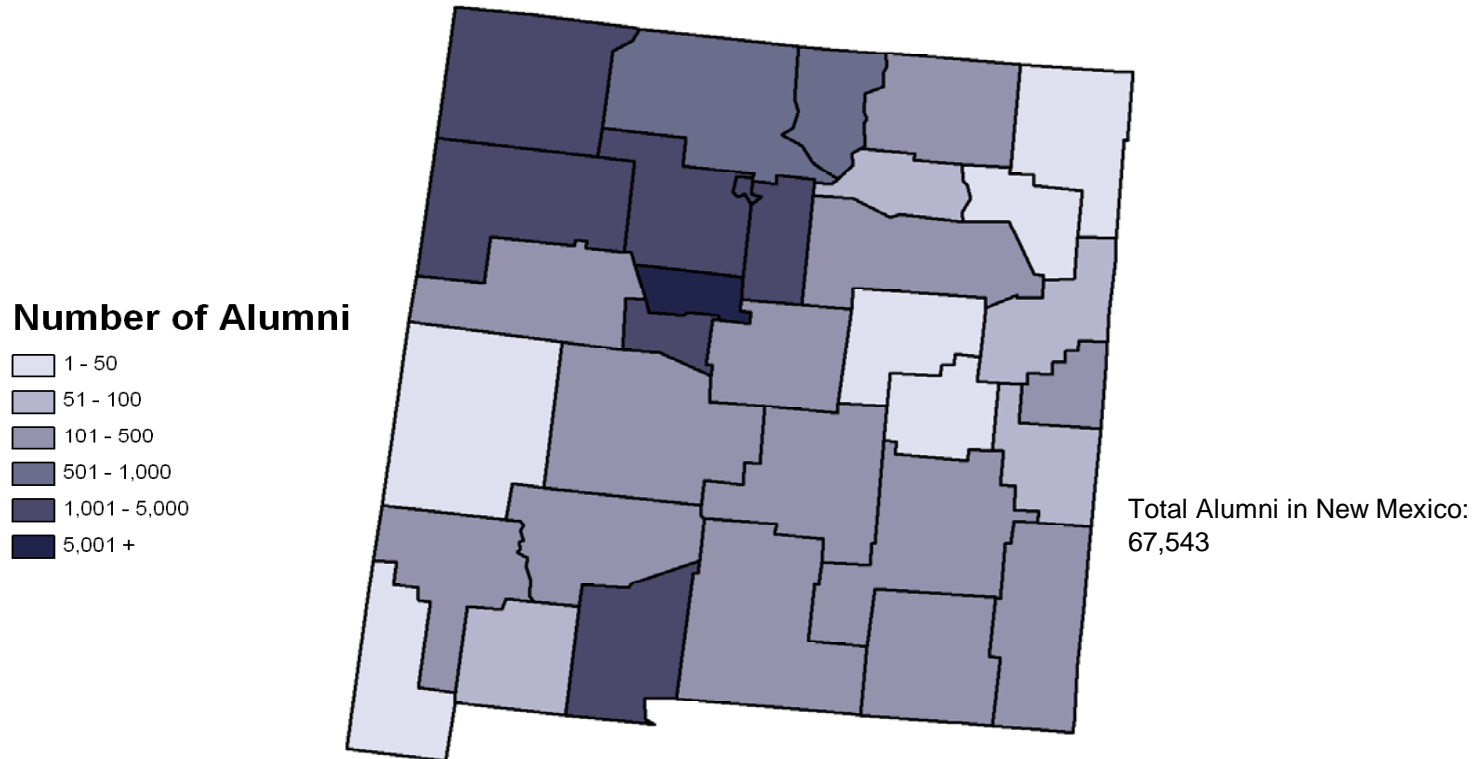

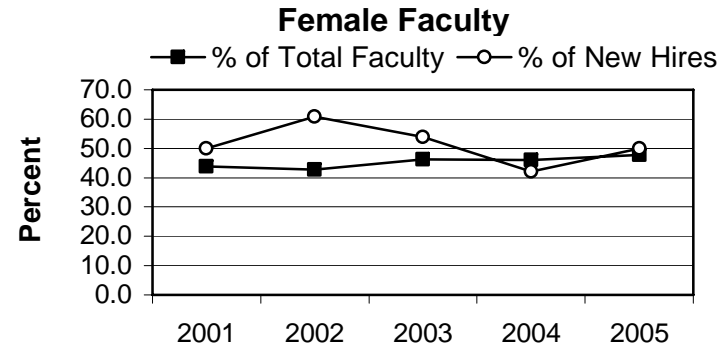

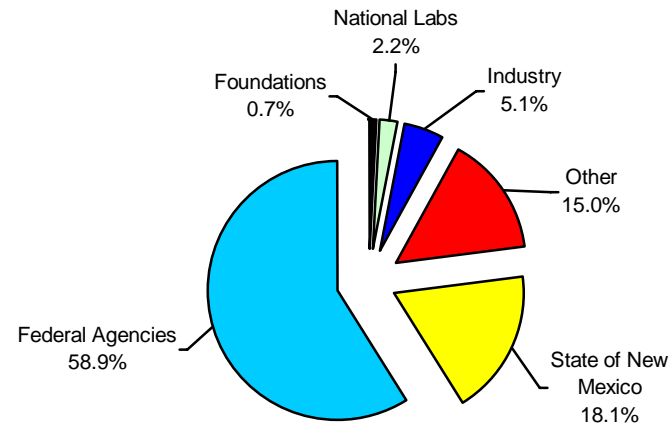

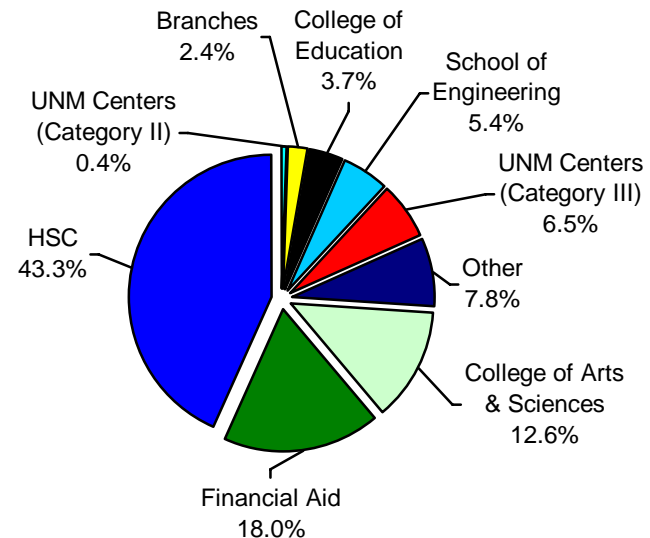

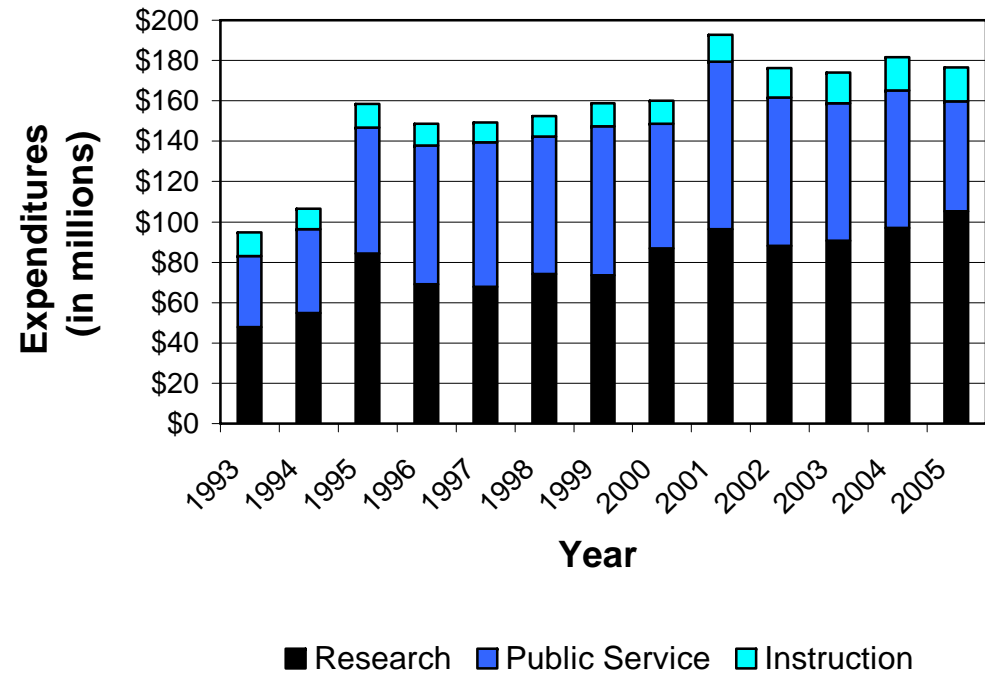

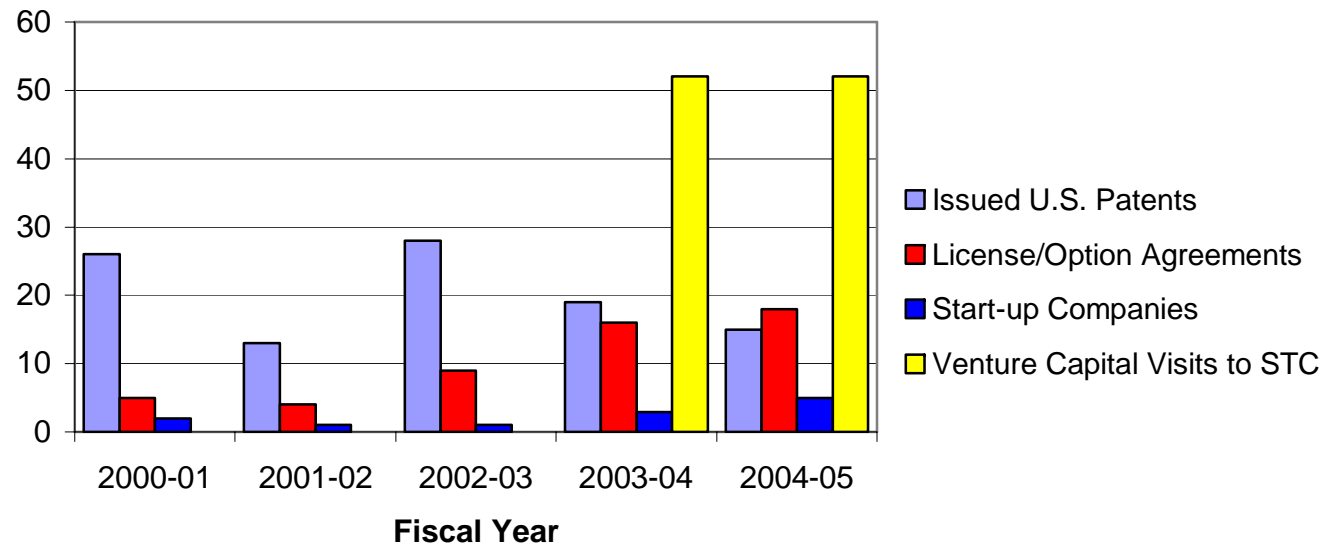

University Libraries is comparable to a non-departmentalized college within the University and is administered by the Dean of University Libraries who reports to the Provost and Executive VP for Academic Affairs. HSLIC reports to the Executive VP for Health Sciences. The Law Library reports to the Dean of the School of Law.

Other libraries (Other) include the following main campus libraries: Bainbridge Bunting Memorial Slide Library, Tireman Learning Materials Library, and the Native American Studies Center Library.

The UNM main campus libraries represent the largest academic collections in the state. Materials are collected in a wide variety of formats in addition to books and journals—including electronic journals and books, manuscripts, recordings, and photographs among others. Access to our collections and the collections of other libraries in the state is available on-line via the LIBROS electronic catalog. The LIBROS catalog is hosted by the University Libraries for the state, serving 25 academic and special library collections in New Mexico. Instruction on research strategies and use of library resources is provided for faculty, students, and staff through formal classes and one-on-one instruction. In 2004, the main campus libraries ranked 69 out of 113 academic libraries in the Association of Research Libraries (ARL). UNM holds membership in the largest information scientific and technology consortium in America—the Alliance for Innovation in Science and Technology Information. The University Libraries is also a Federal Depository, an Official Patent and Trademark Library, and houses the Map and Geographic Information Center. The libraries' lending network includes the OCLC (50,540 libraries), the Greater Western Library Alliance (30 libraries), the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (5,432 libraries)—a program of the National Library of Medicine, and the Amigos network (754 libraries).

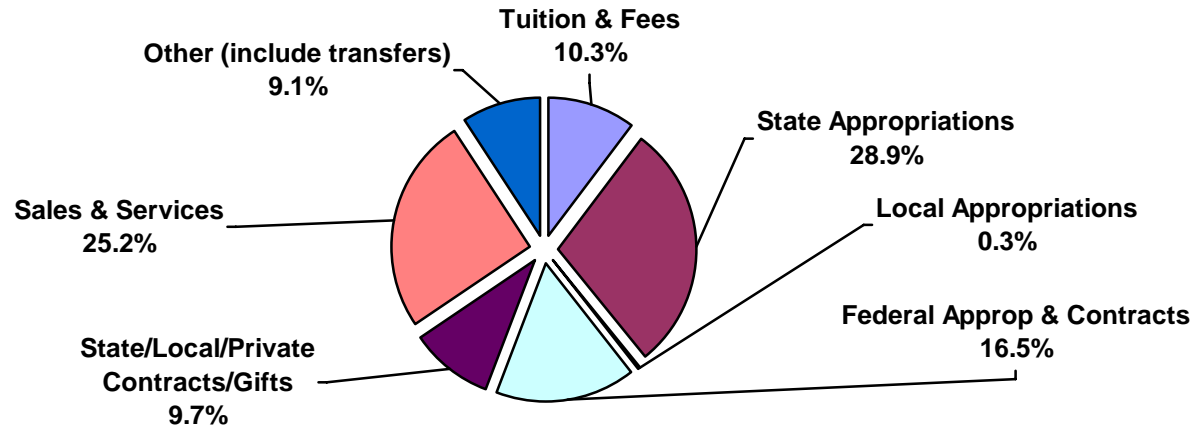

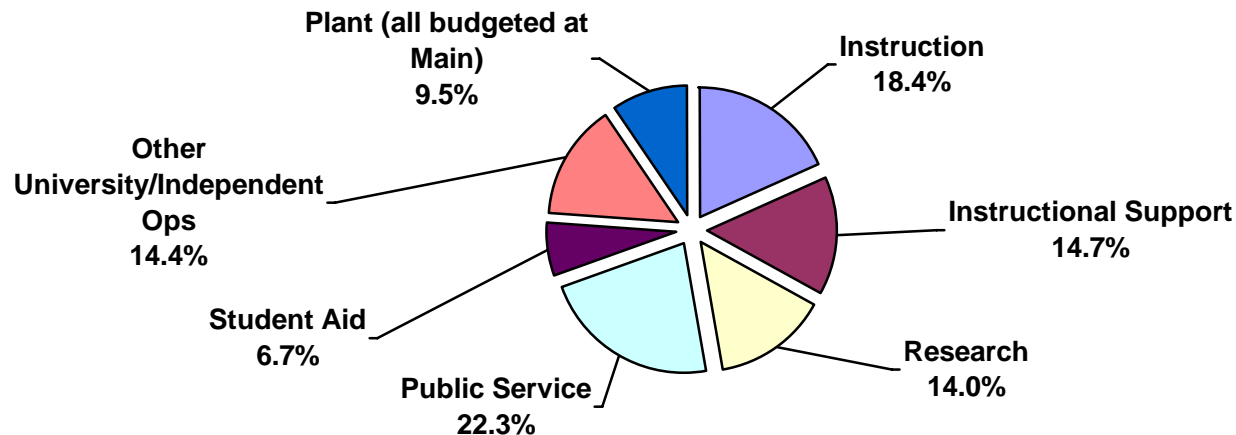

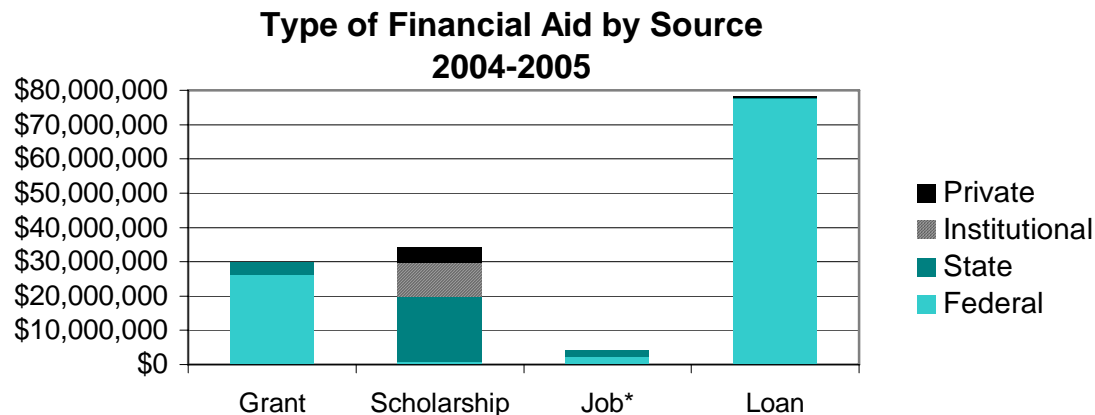

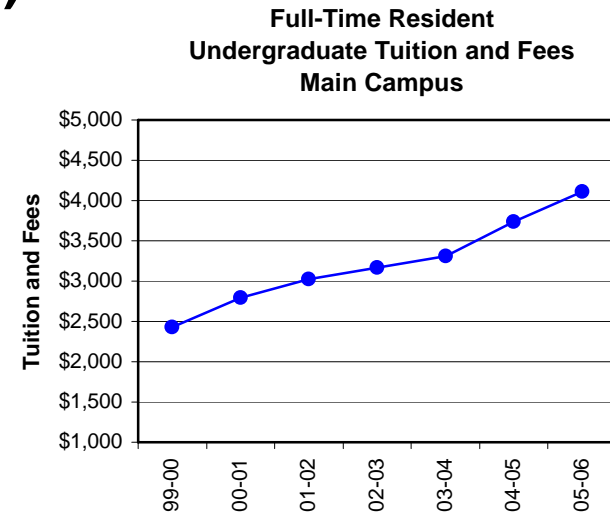

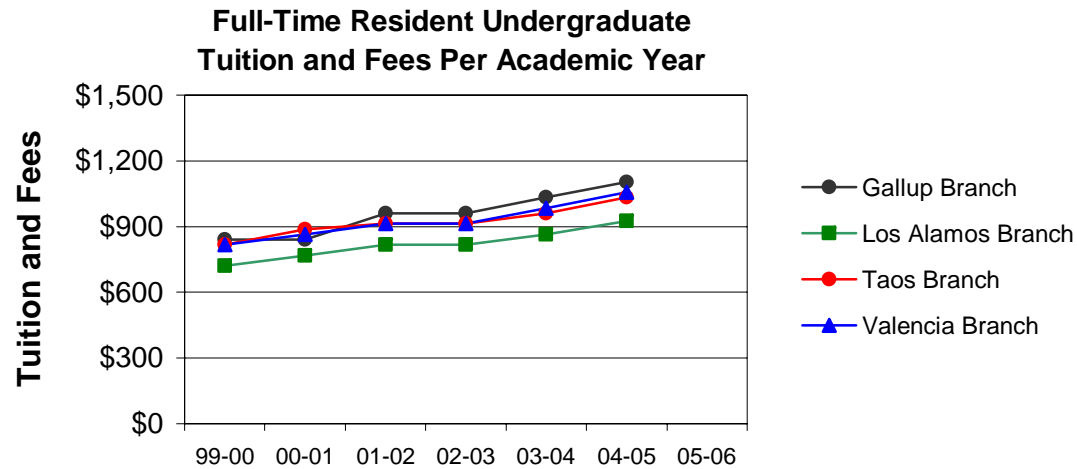

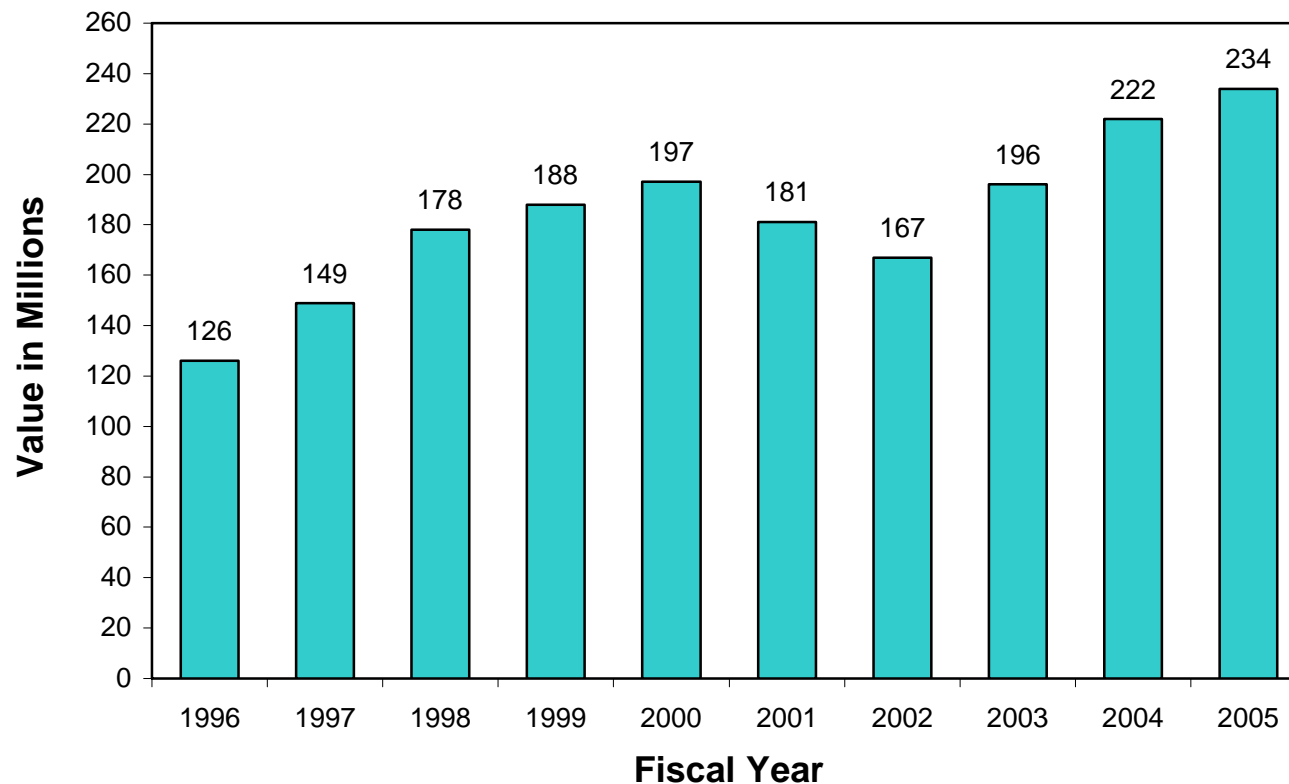

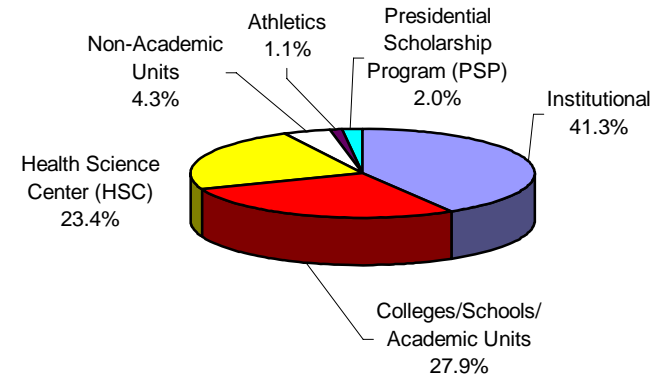

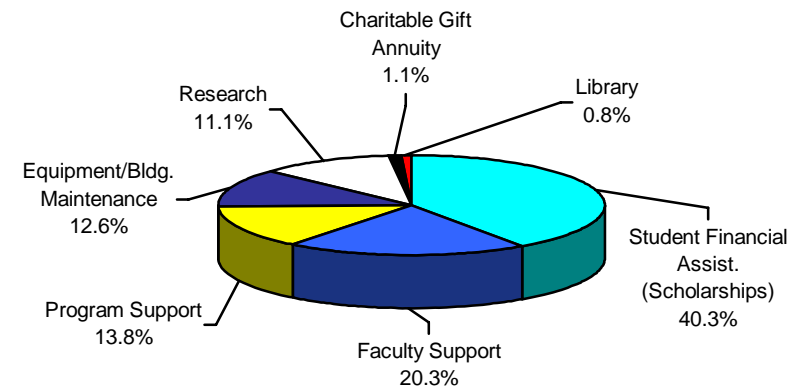

(FY 2005)**



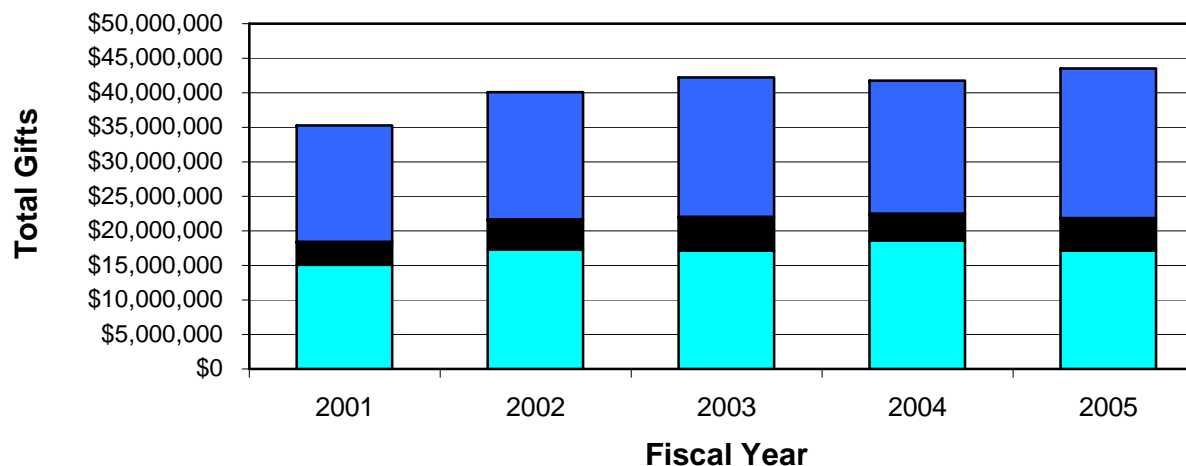

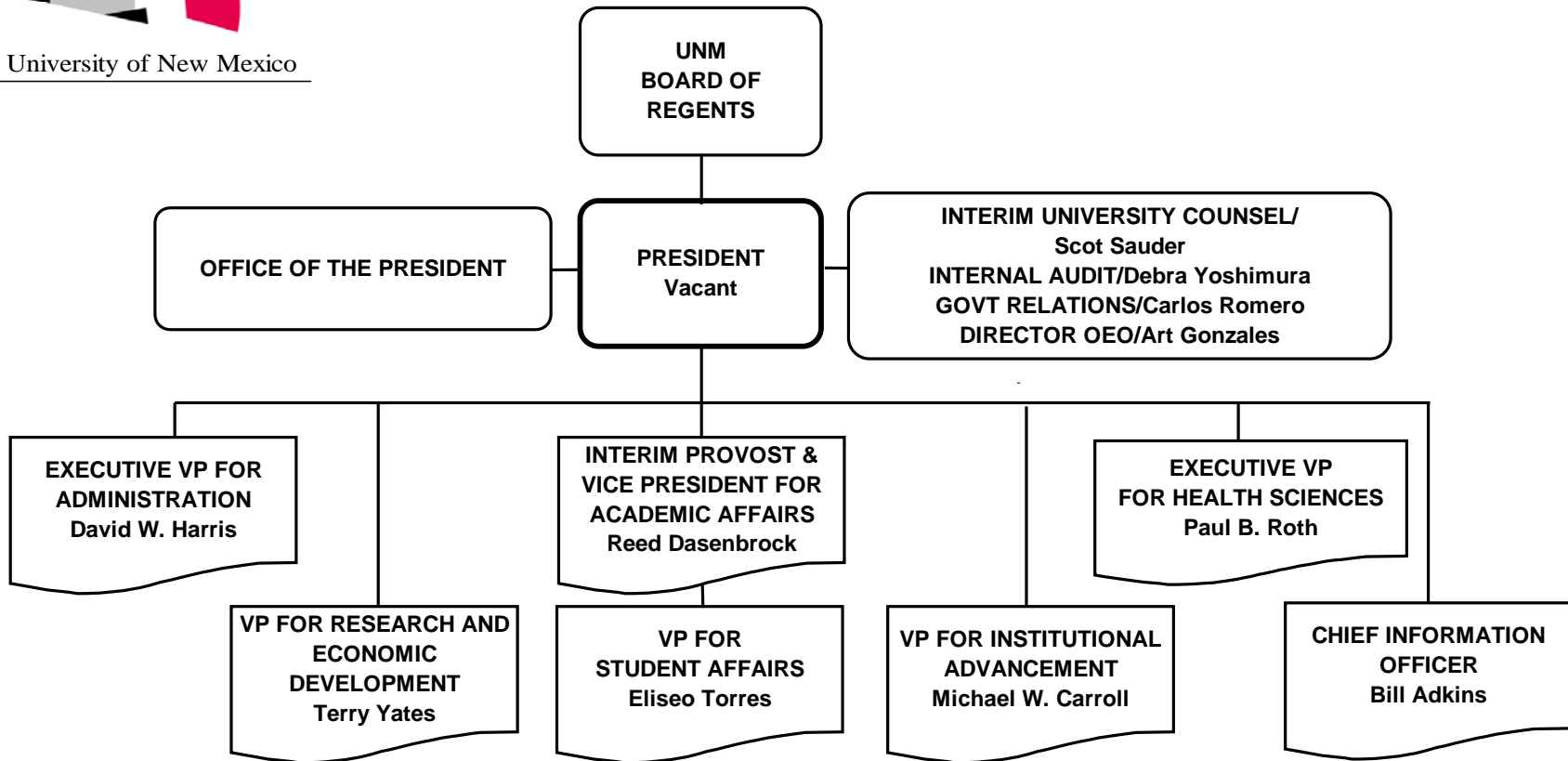
UNM Organizational Structure, 2005-06

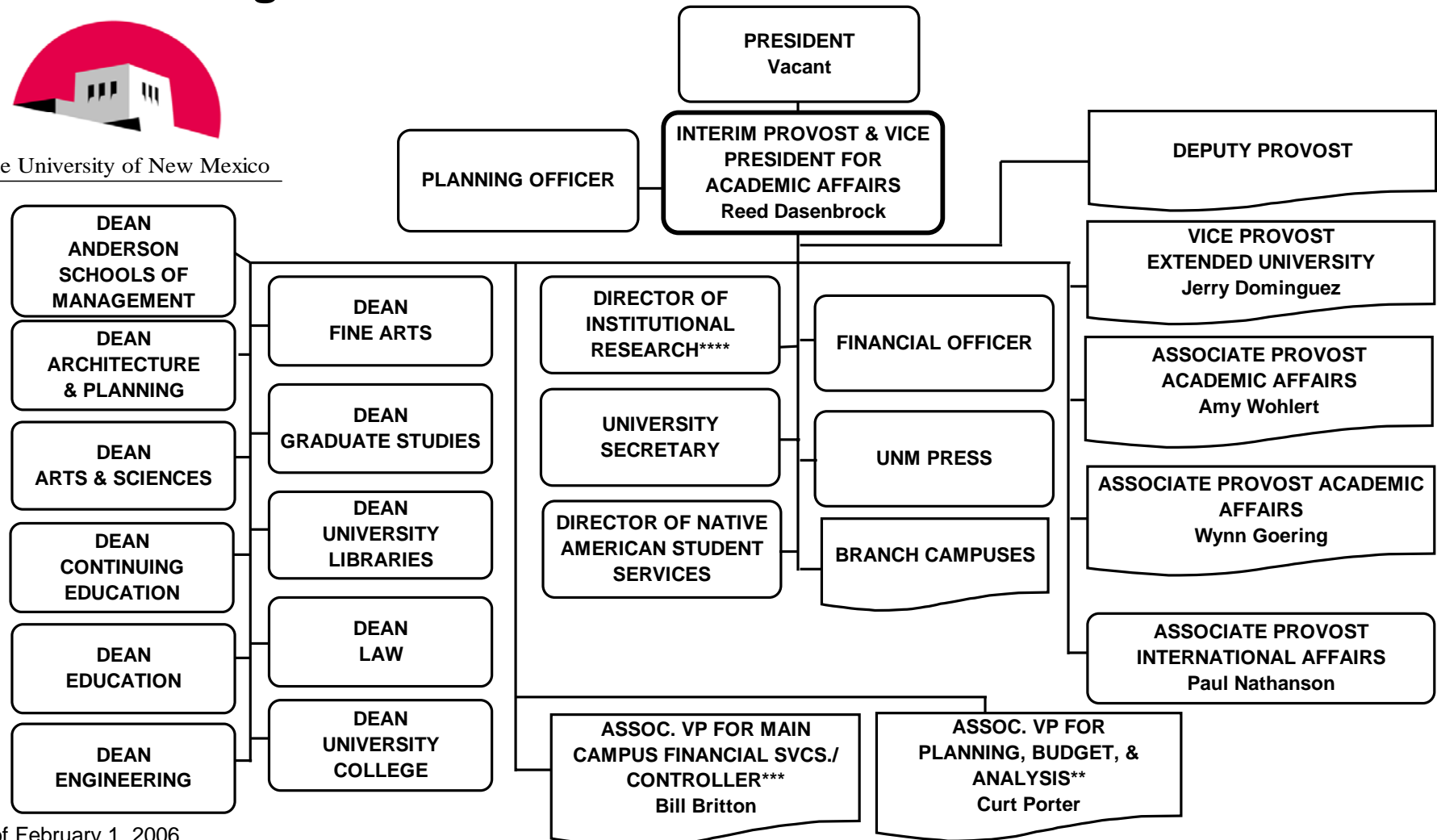

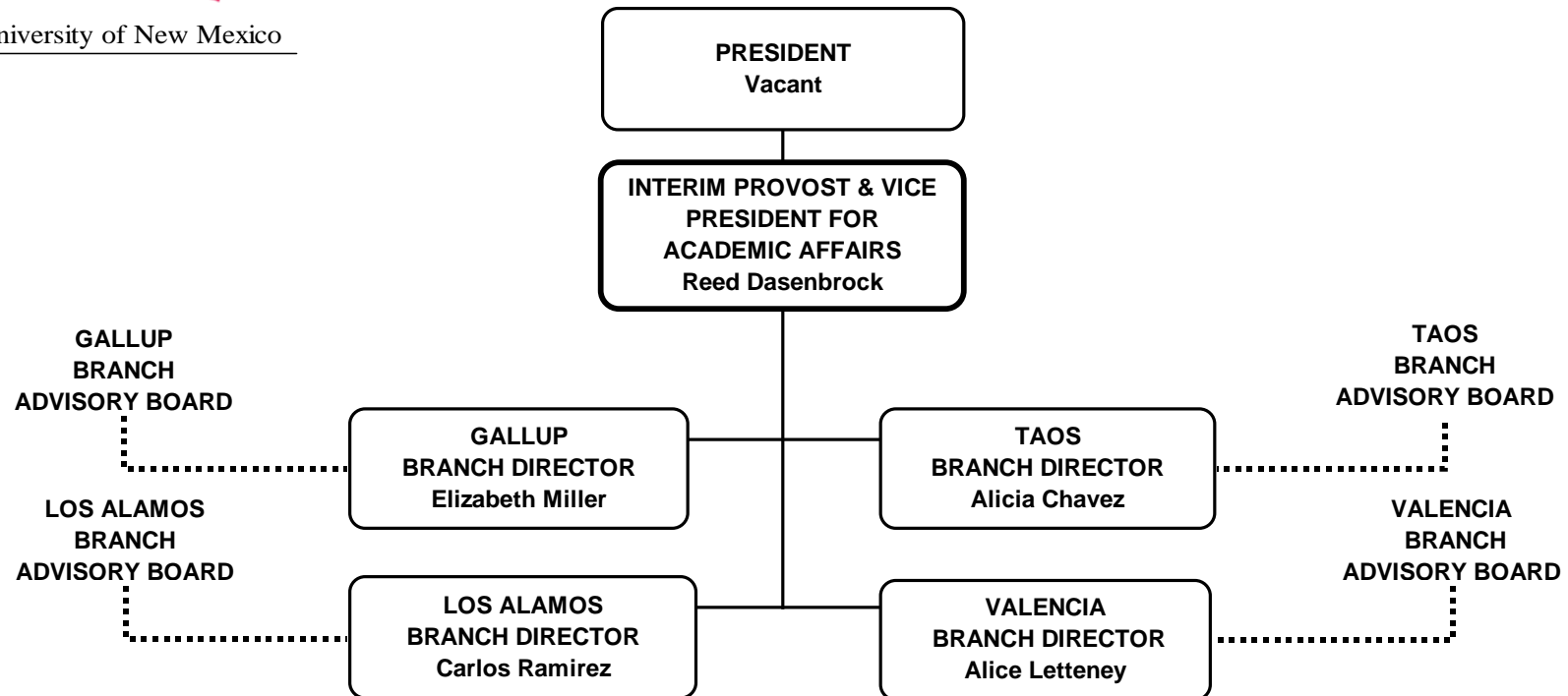

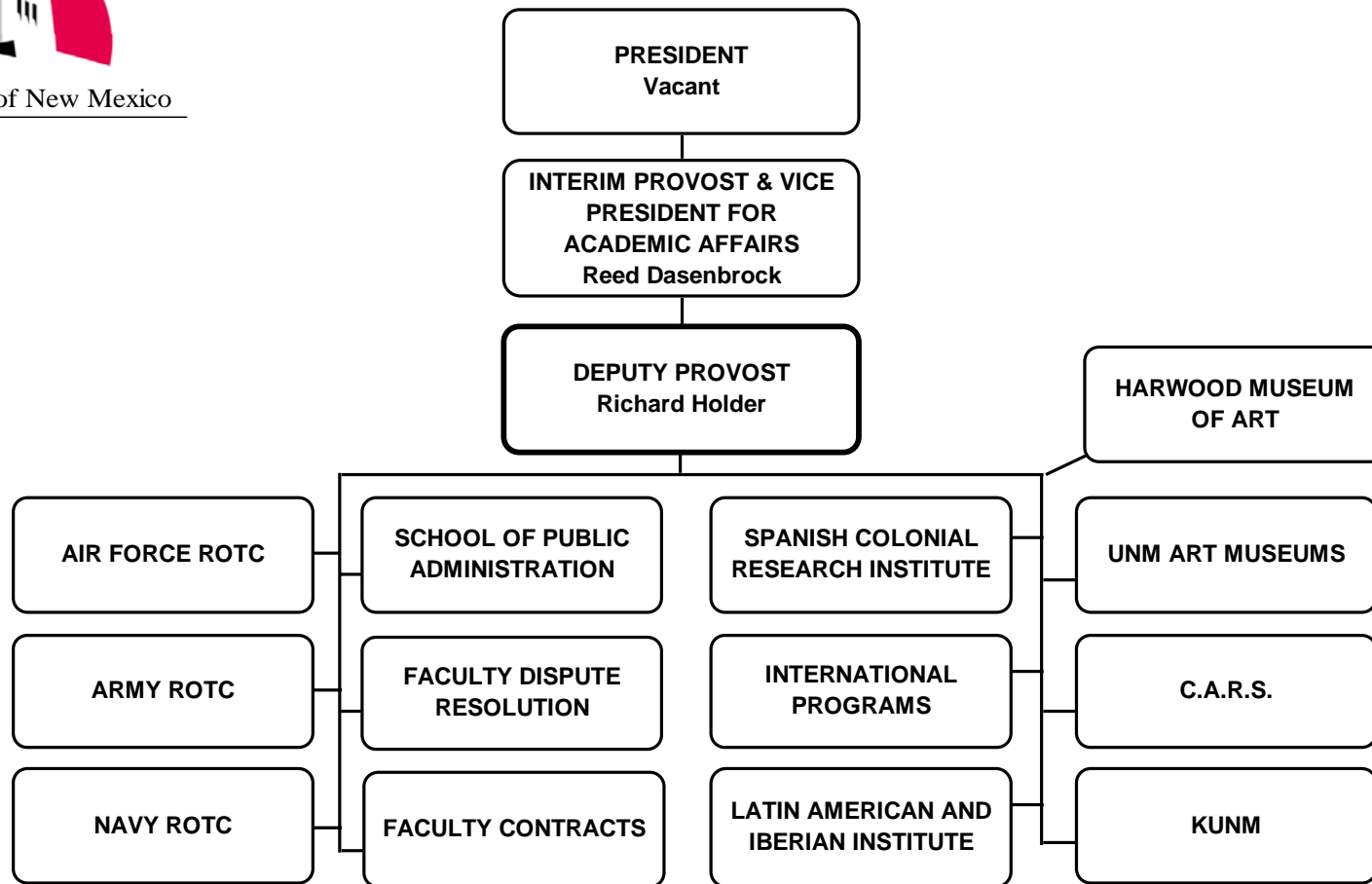

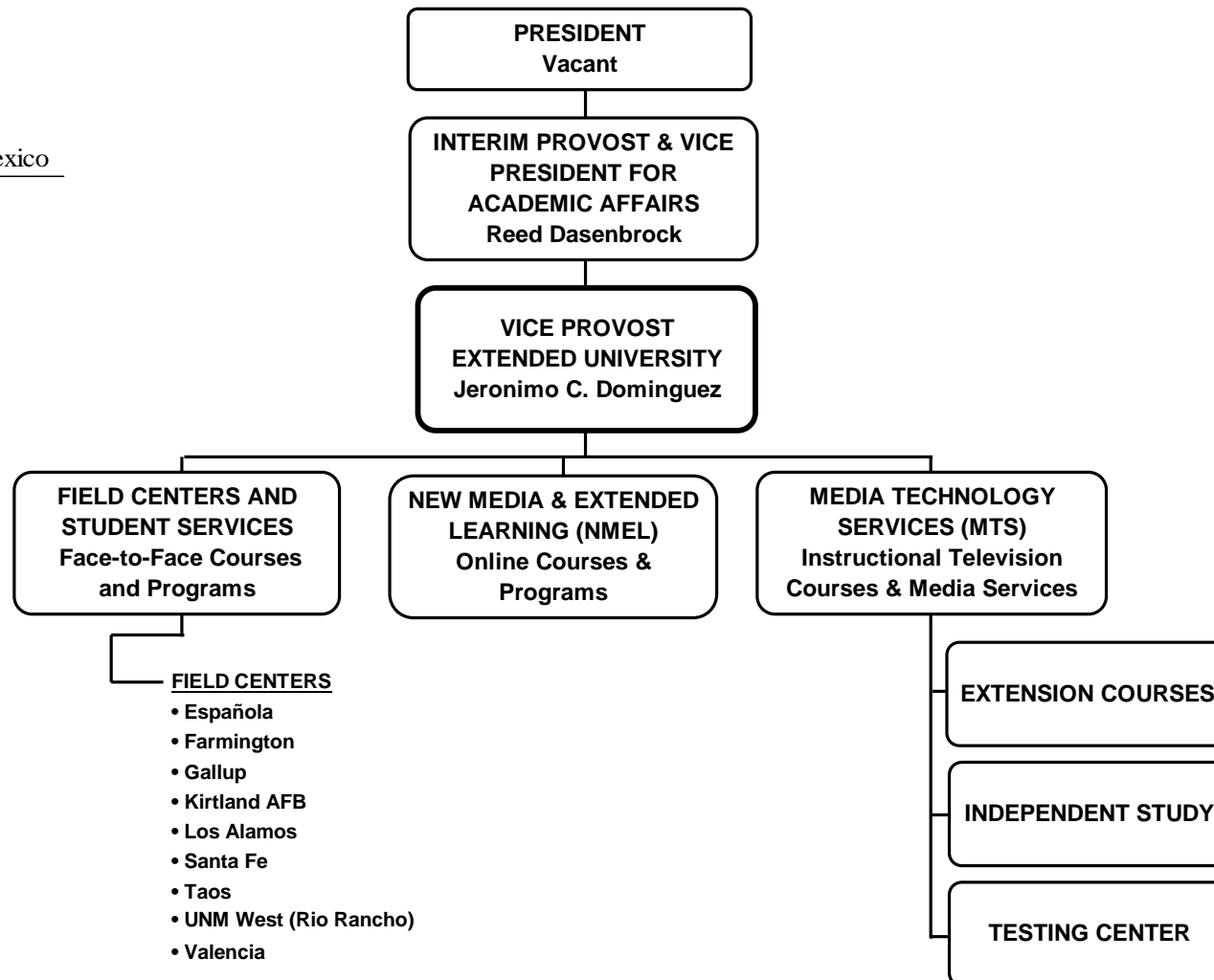

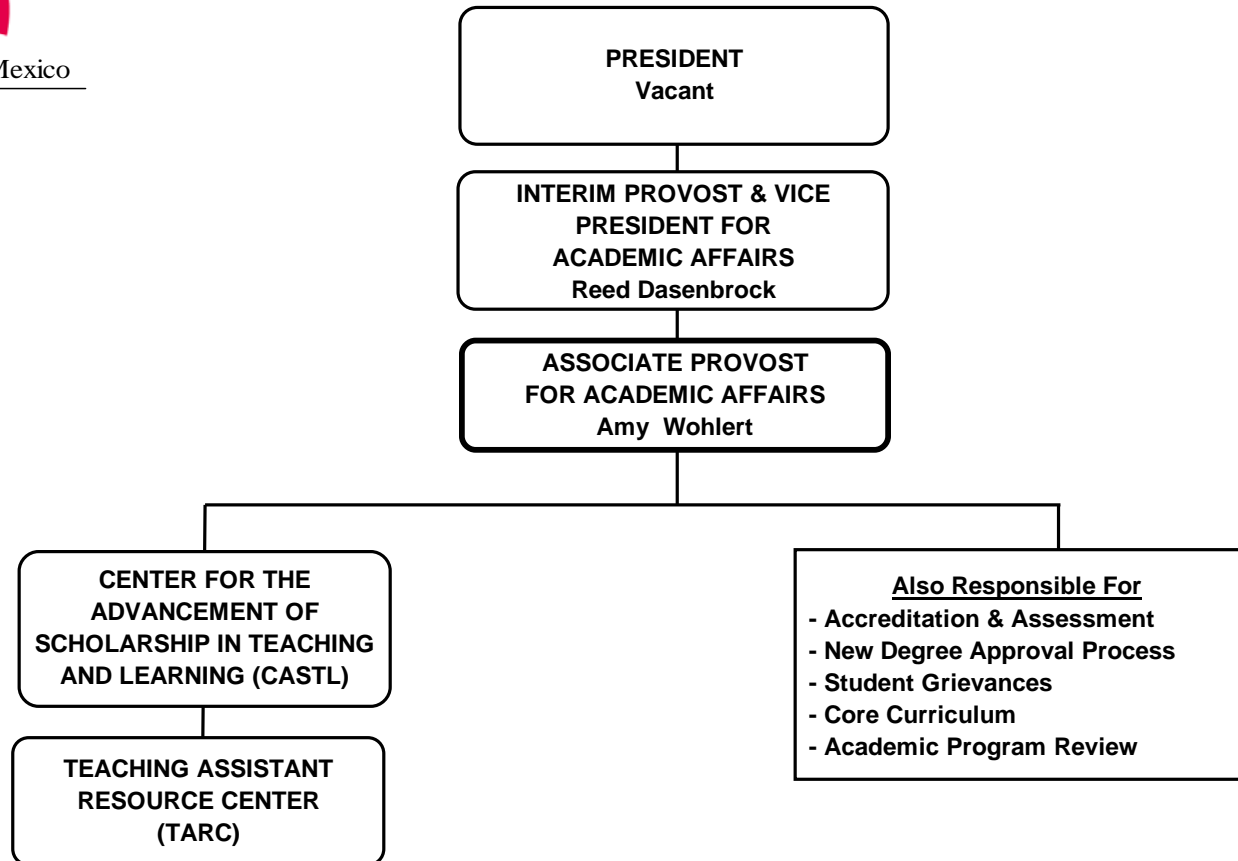

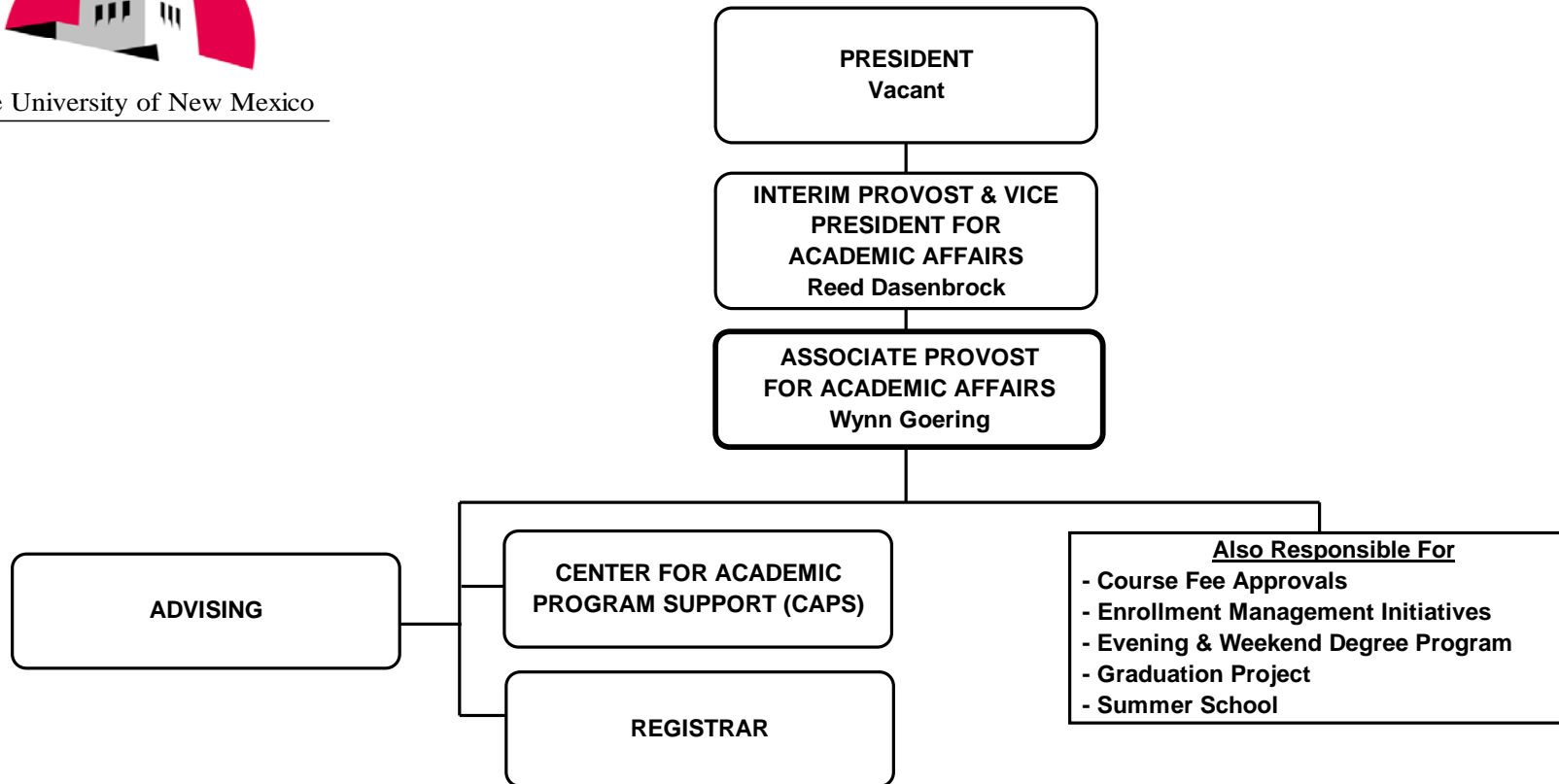

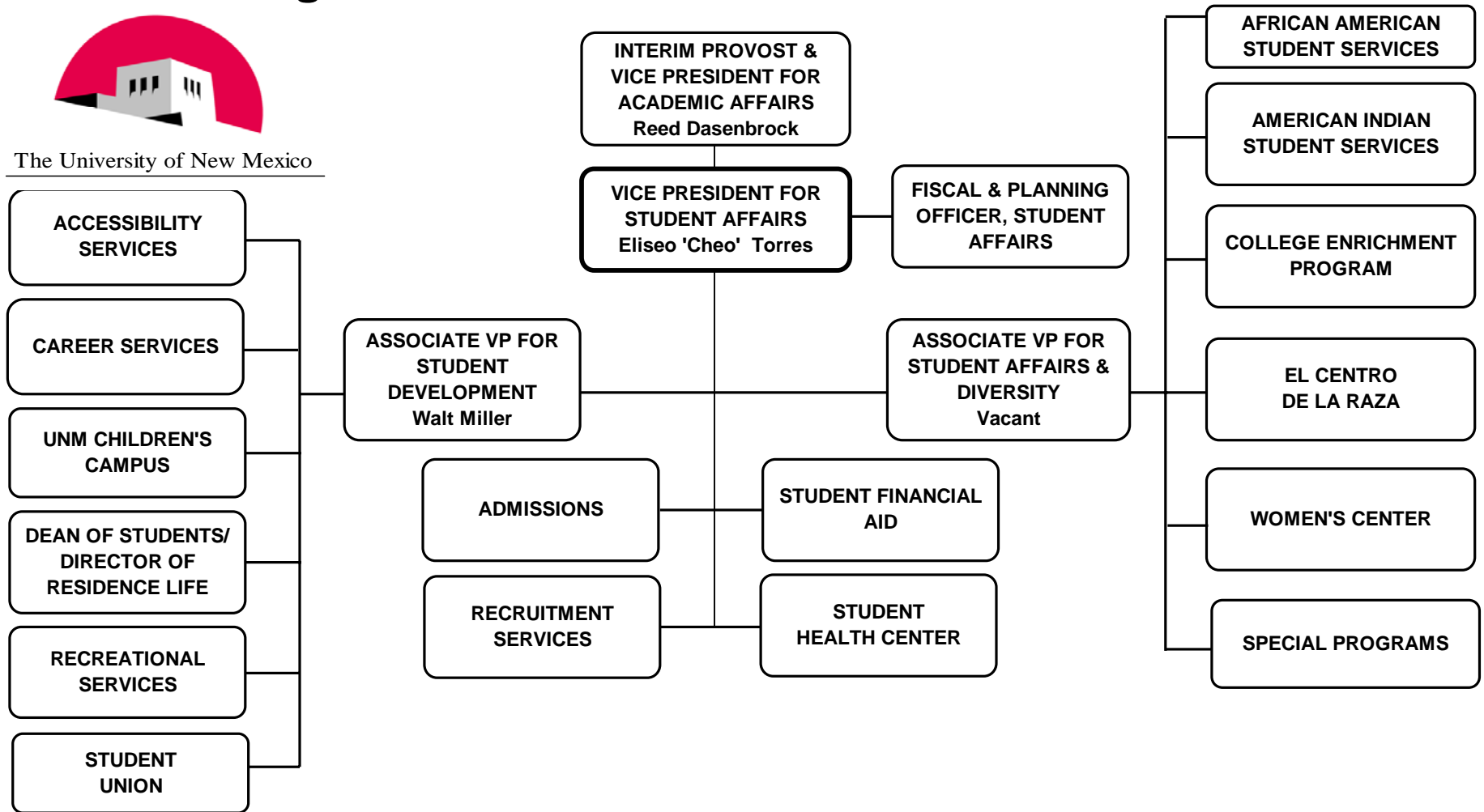

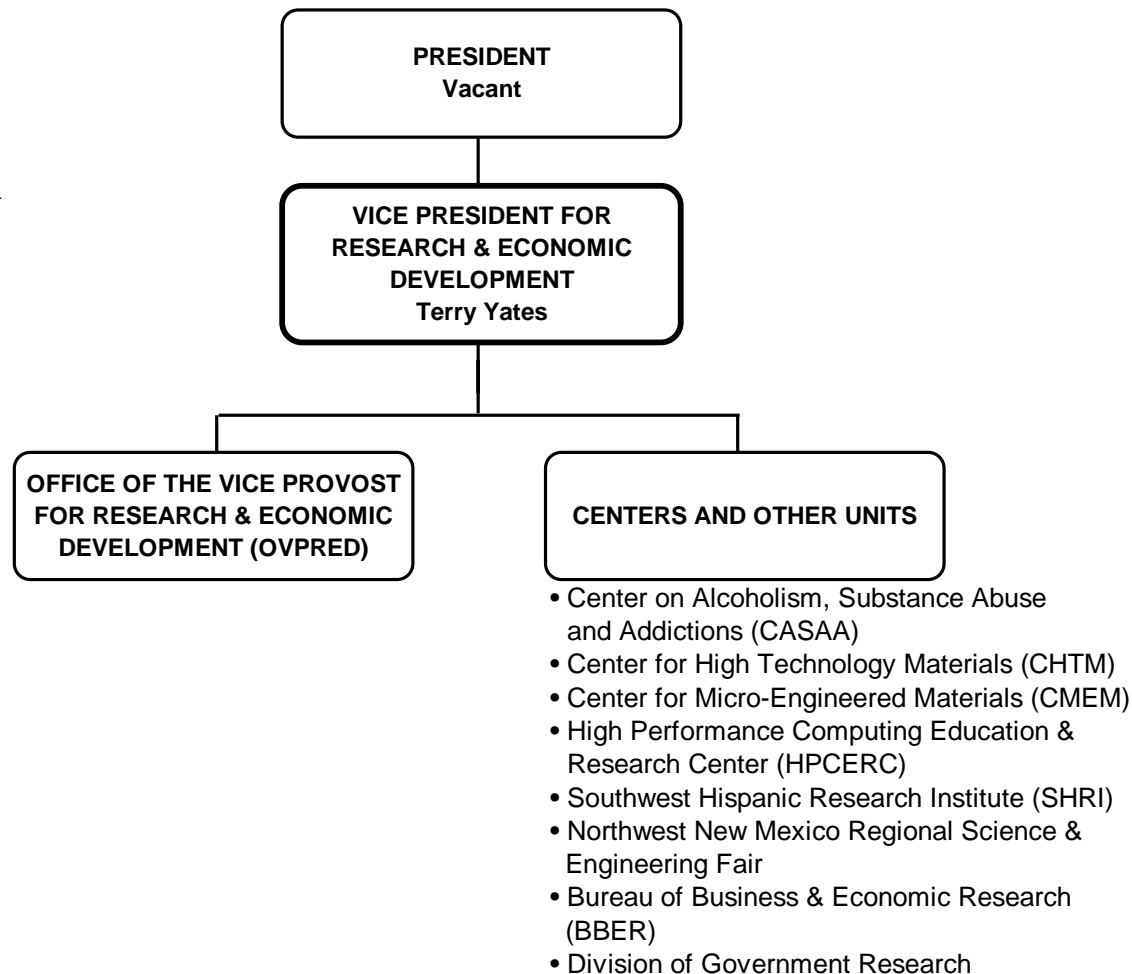

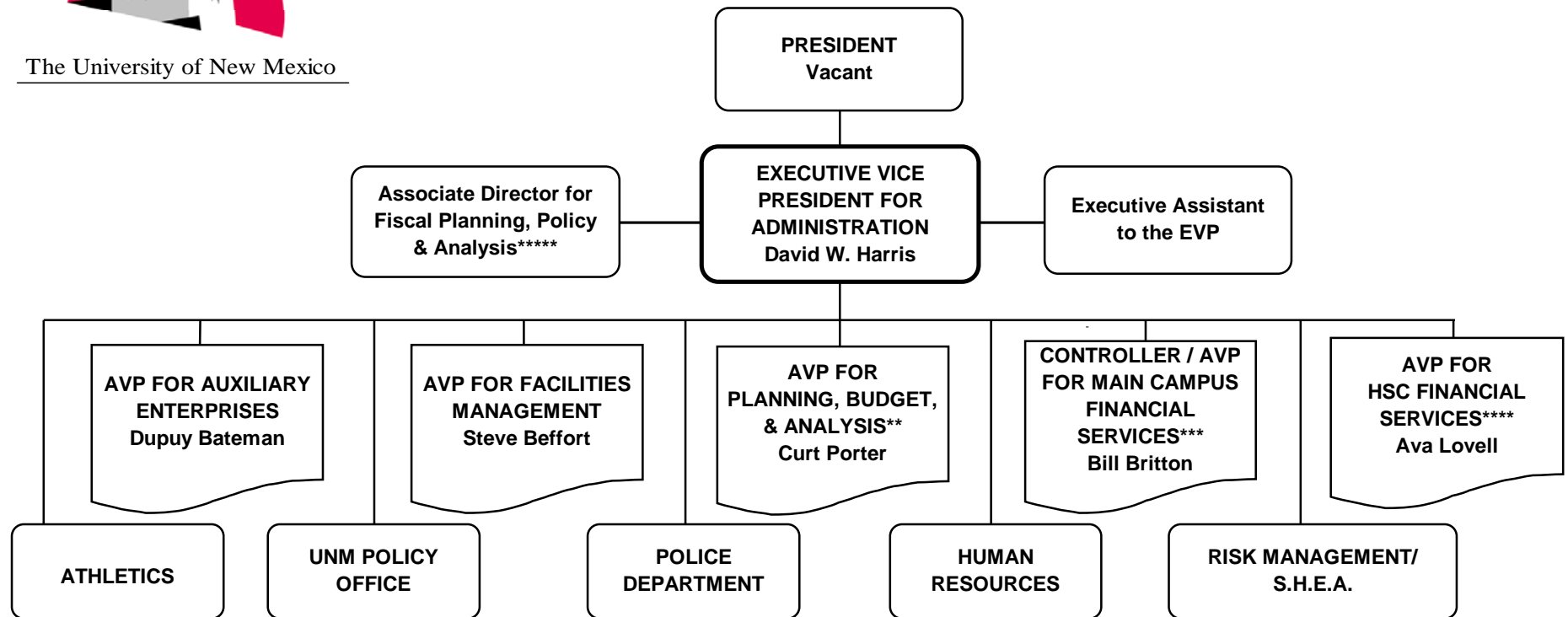

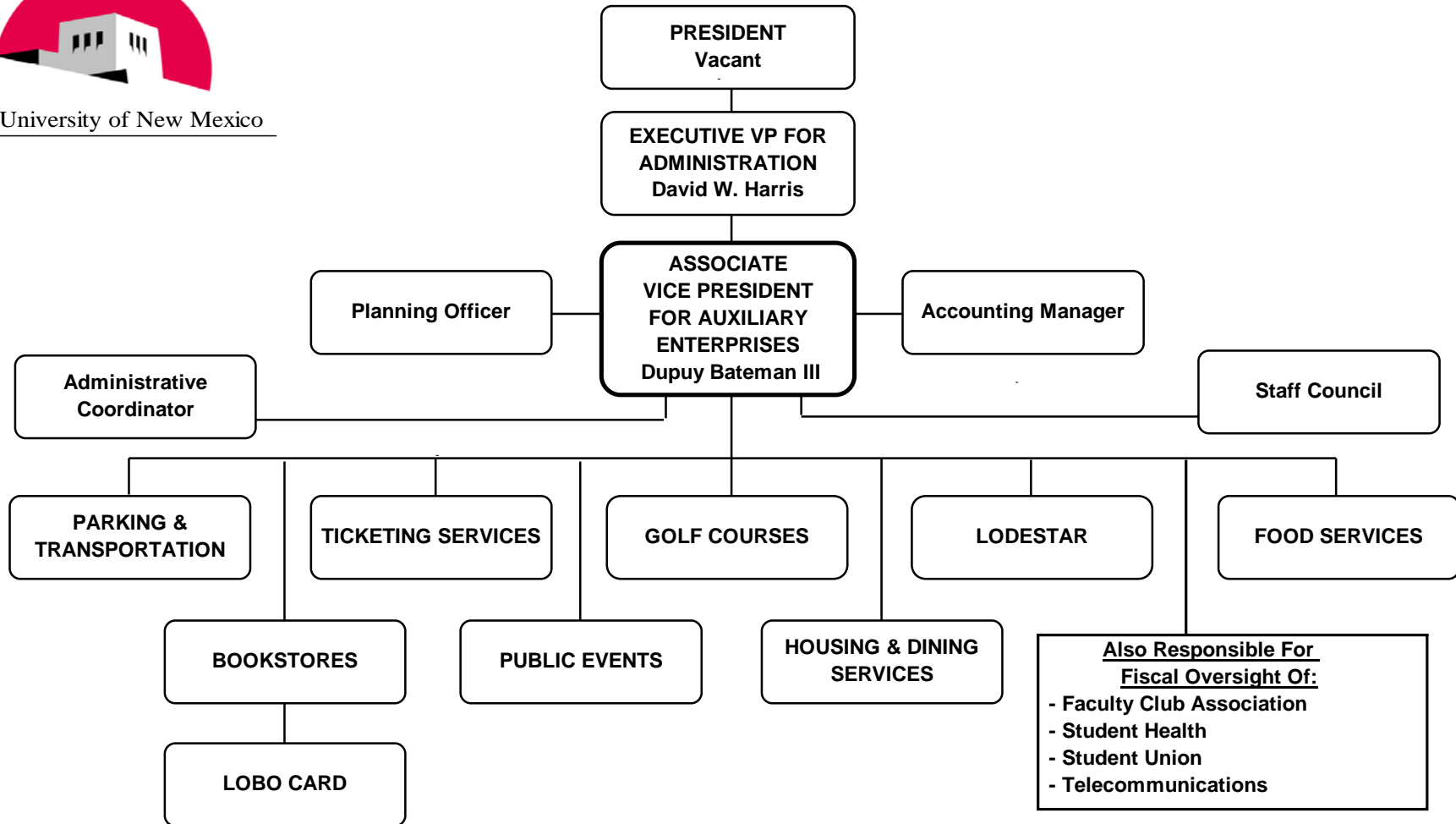

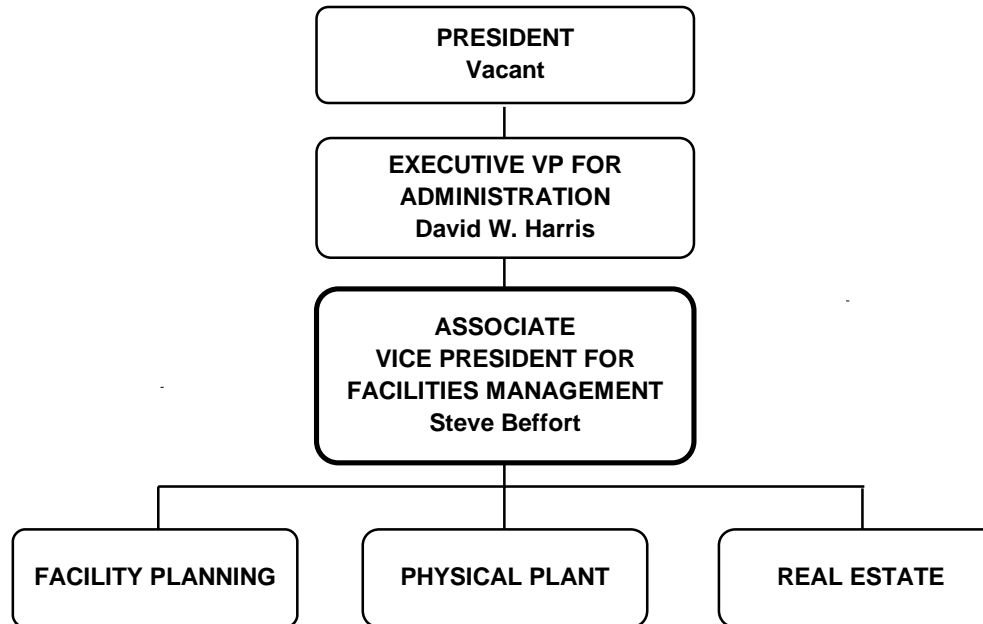

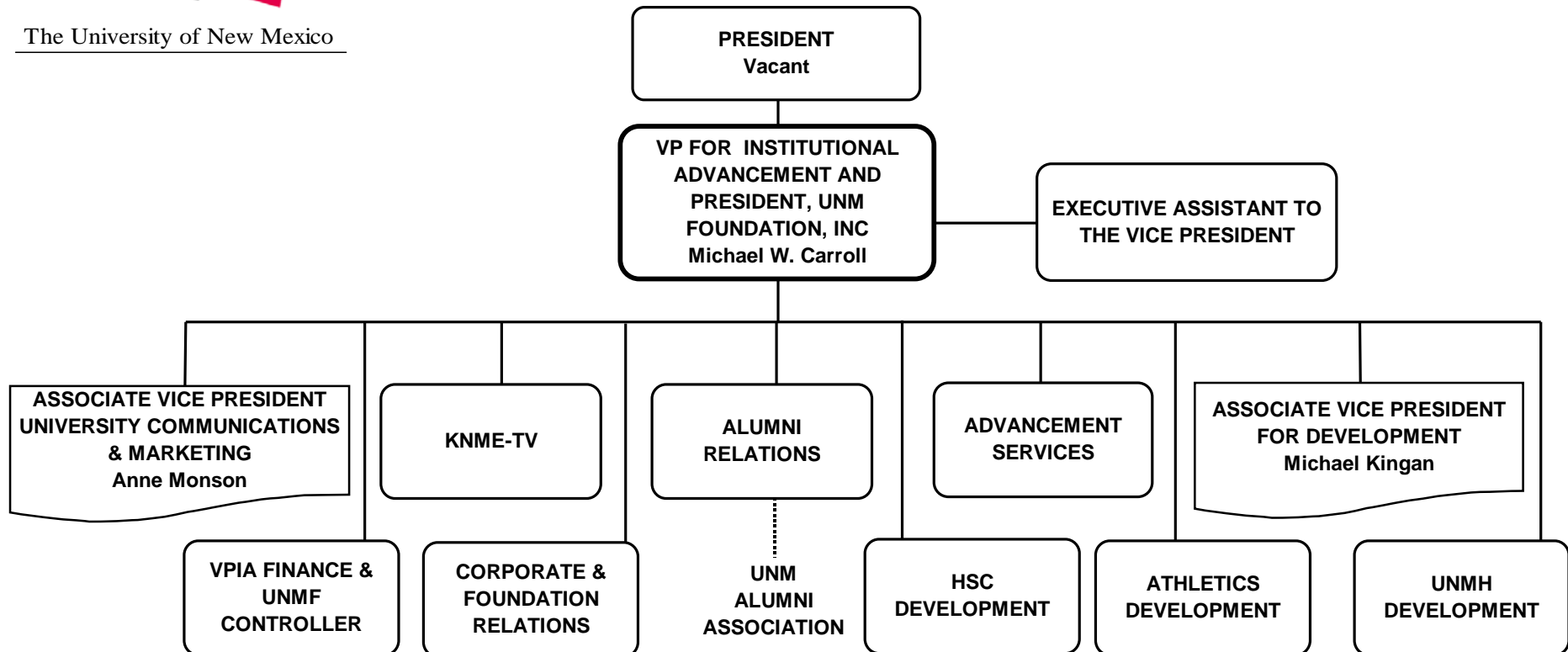

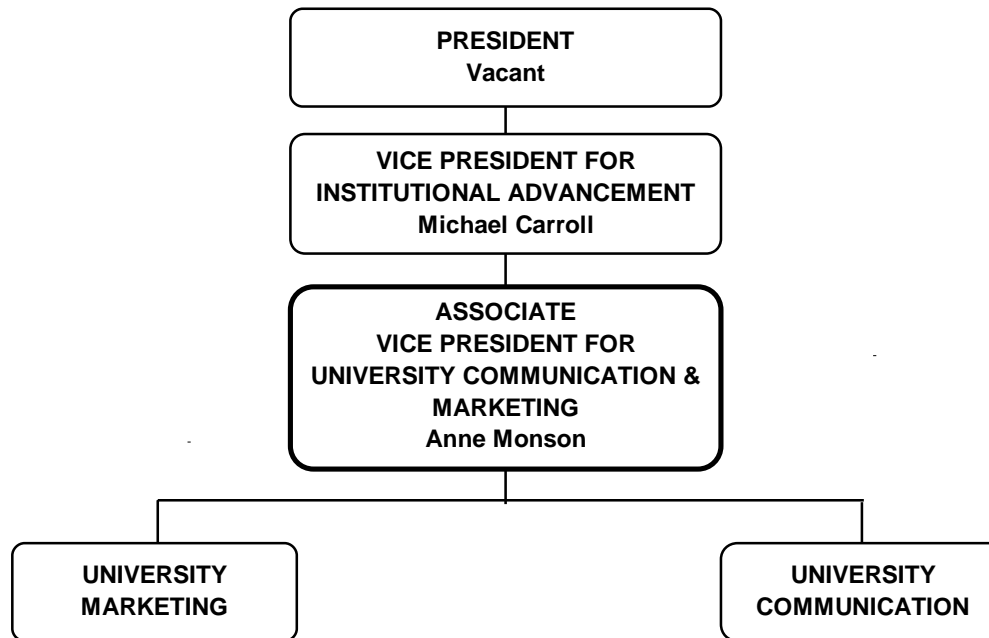

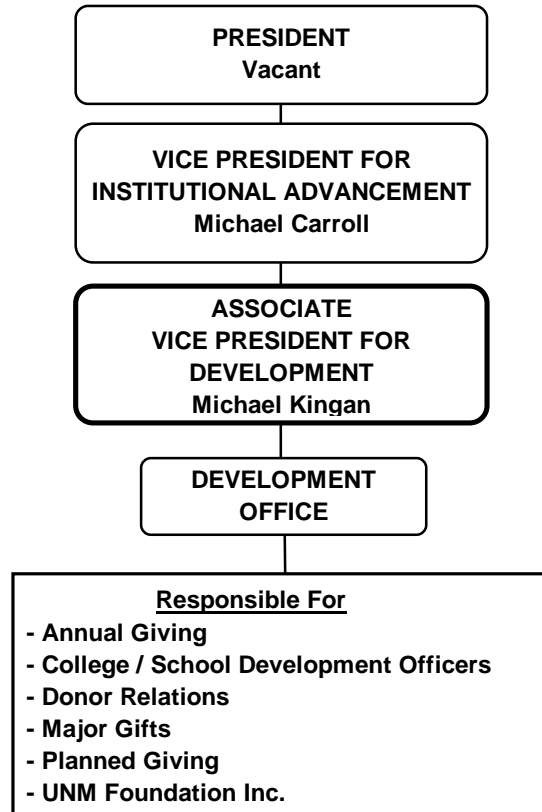

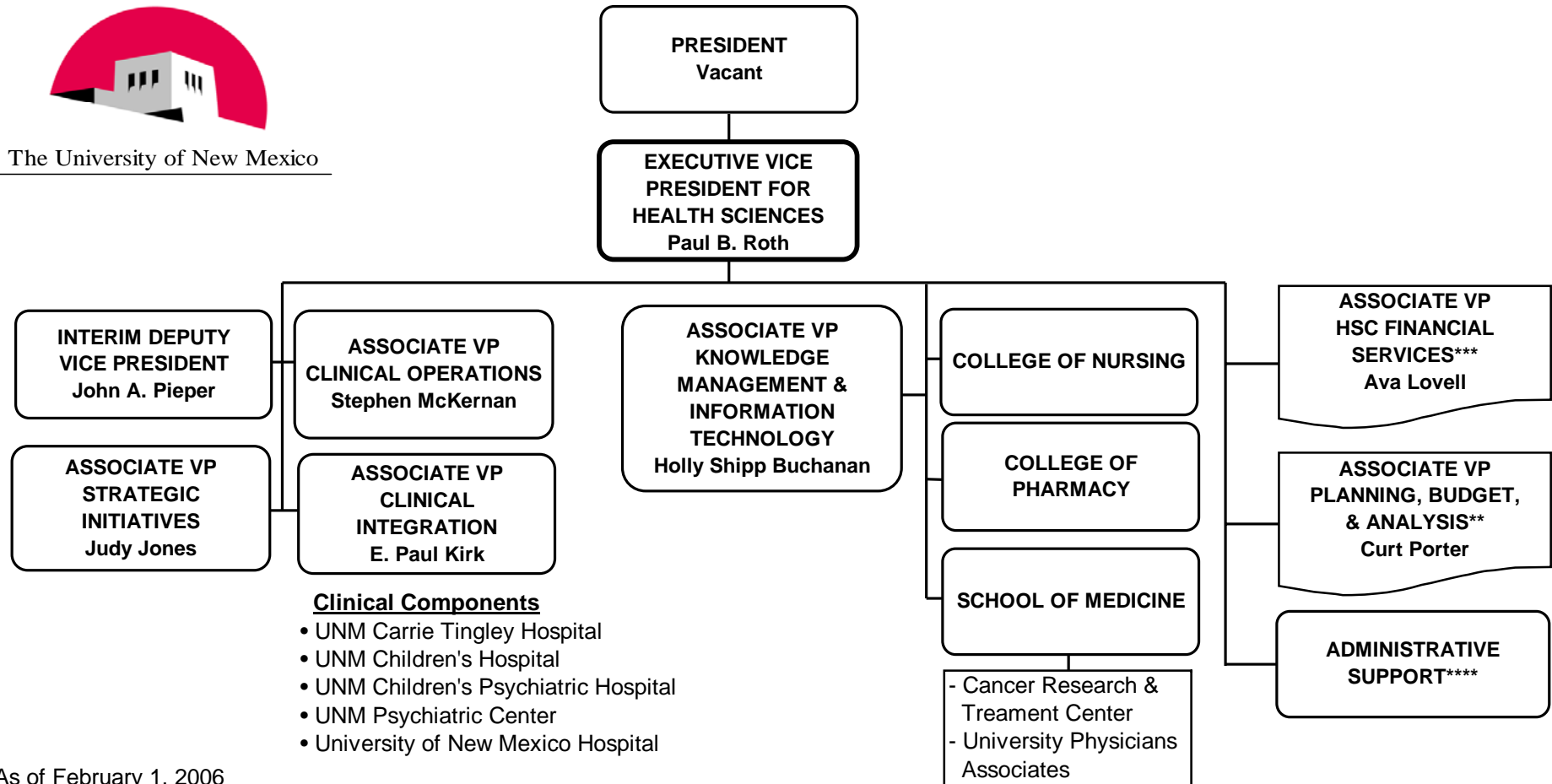

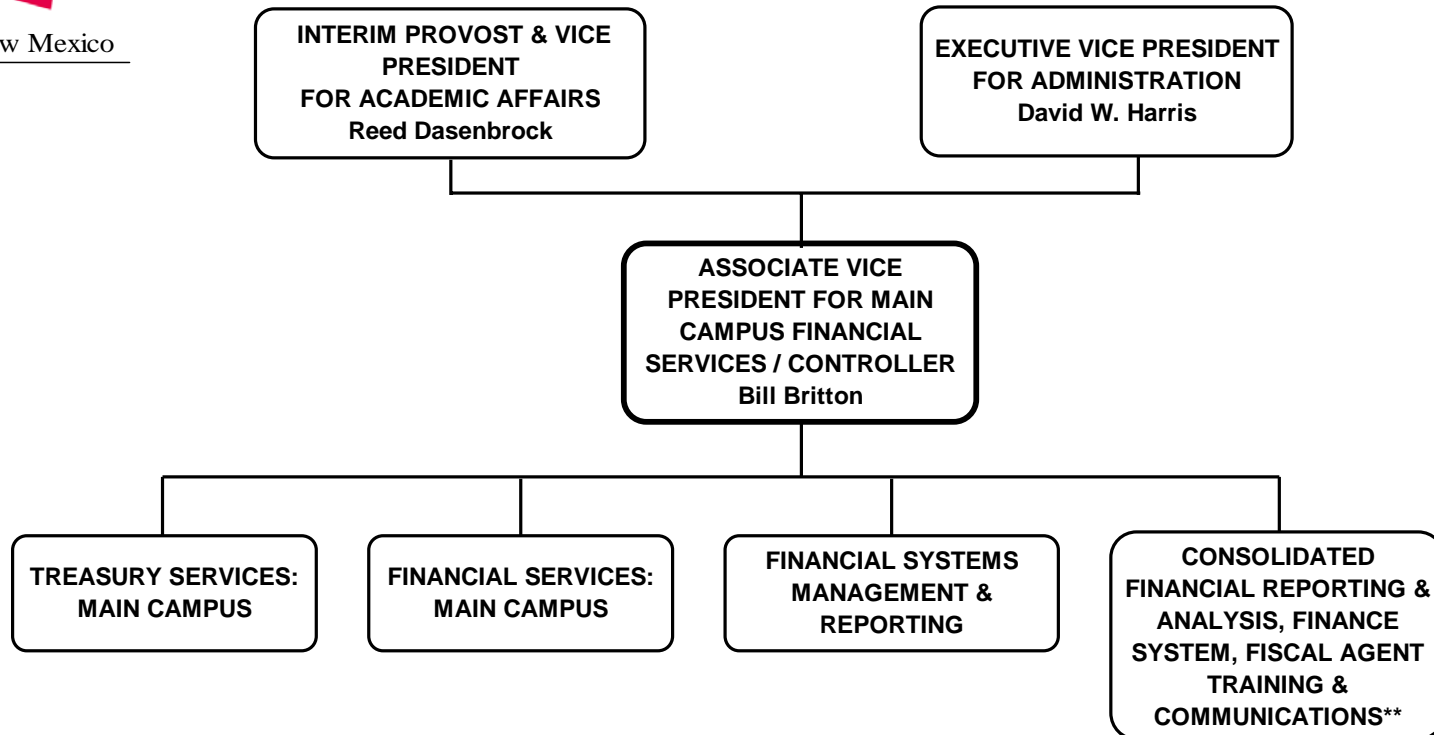

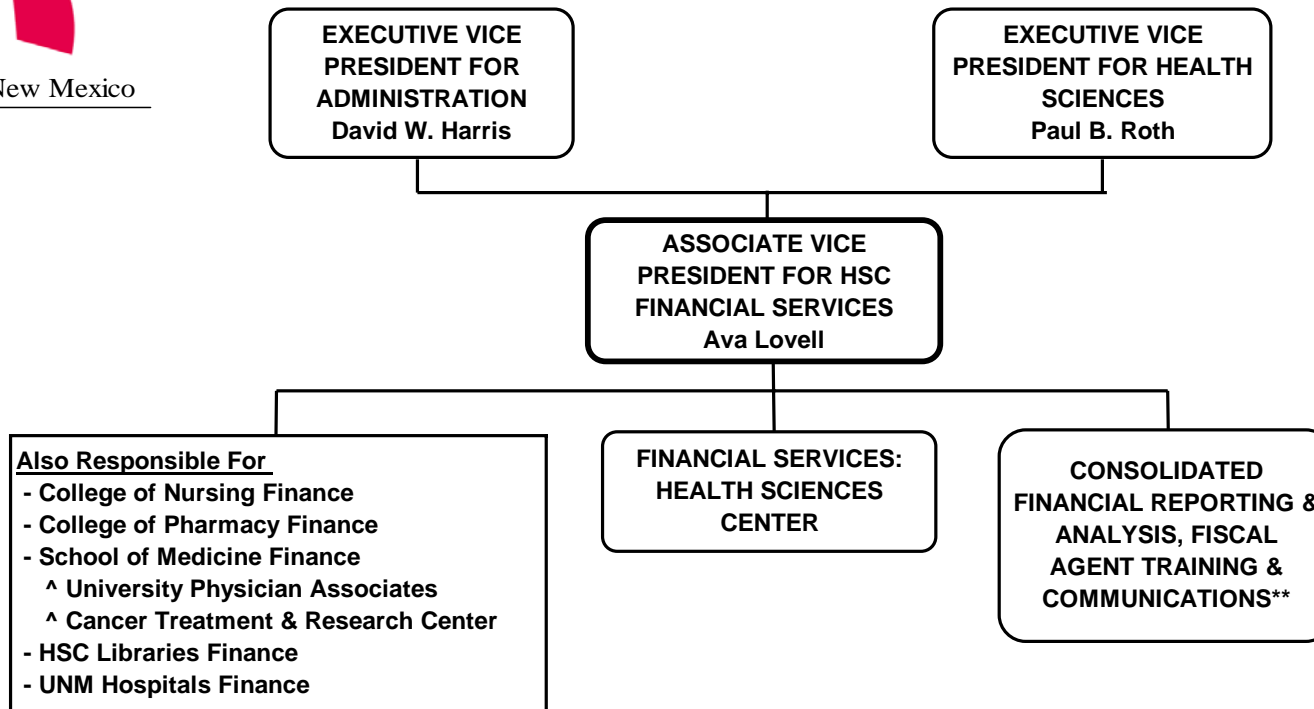

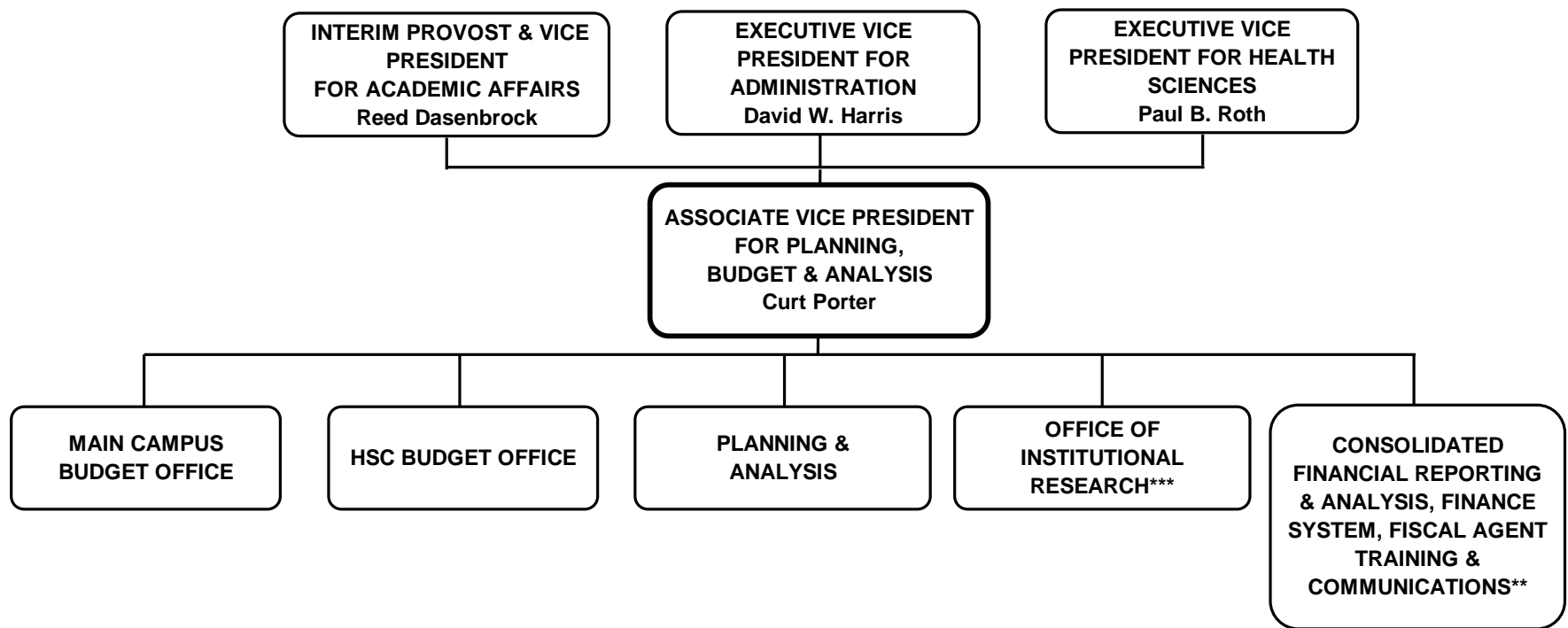

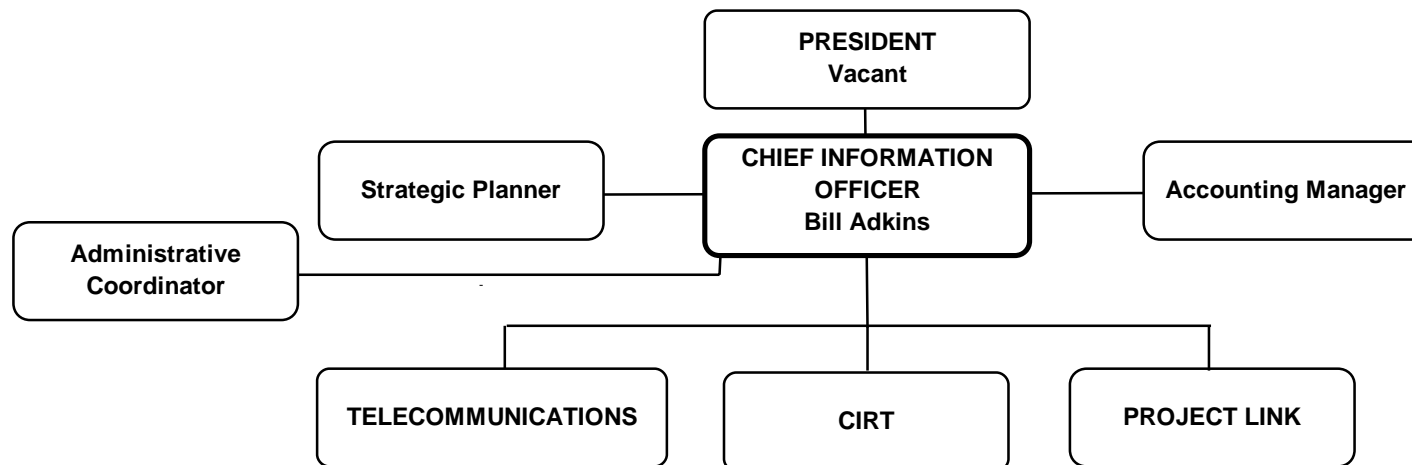

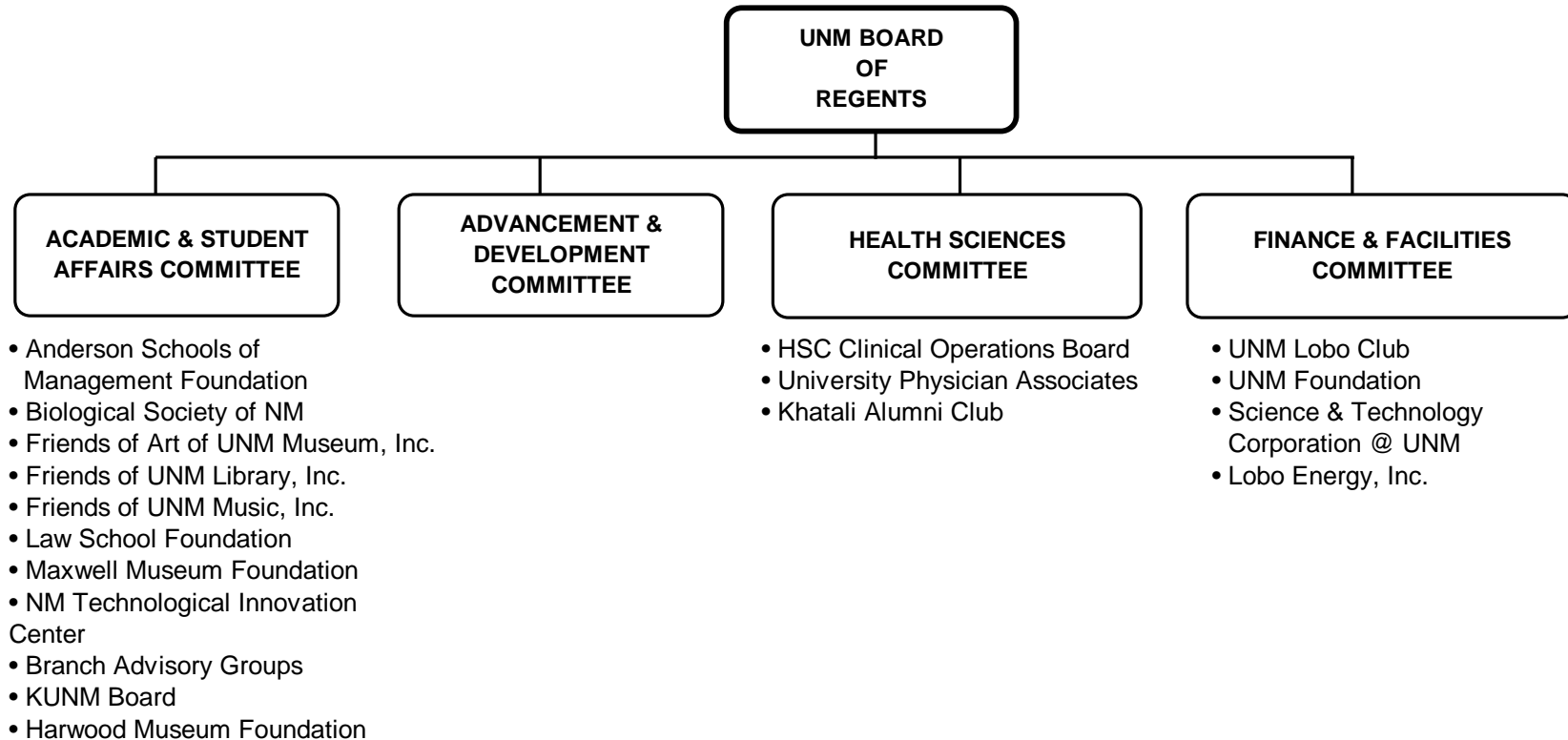
UNM Board of Regents Committees
