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

Introduction

In fall 2000, the campuses of the University of New Mexico served 29,952 students, employed 2,901 faculty and 11,256 staff, and had a total operating and capital budget of about \$1.1 billion. In the previous academic year, UNM awarded 4,528 degrees and certificates.


This fact book presents data for all UNM campuses. UNM consists of a Main Campus located in Albuquerque, which includes the Health Sciences Center; three branch campuses which have a two-year degree mission: UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, and UNM-Valencia; an Education Center which functions very much like a branch campus: UNM-Taos; and an Extended University which delivers courses, both on-site and via technology, throughout the state. The Upper Division & Graduate Centers at Los Alamos and Santa Fe are incorporated into the Extended University in this year's report. The UNM Health Sciences Center and its programs—which include the School of Medicine, College of Nursing, and College of Pharmacy—are included in the UNM Fact Book, sometimes as part of the Main Campus and sometimes separately. Footnotes and labels should make it clear in each case what is included.



UNM's Extended University also includes the Division of Continuing Education, which has over 55,000 enrollments every year in both credit and non-credit courses.

Historical Enrollment Fall 1928 to Fall 2000

























Residency of First-Time Freshmen


County of Origin of Recent HS Graduates from NM High Schools Main Campus, Average Number of Freshmen (Fall 1996-2000)

Degree Programs, Degrees Awarded & Alumni

Degree Programs¹ (Main Campus)

UNM's Main Campus offers over 200 degree programs. There are 92 baccalaureate, 65 masters, and 36 doctoral level degree programs. Many of the degree programs have additional concentrations and options; for example, the Bachelors in Business Administration degree has a number of concentrations. (See the UNM catalog for information on degree concentrations.) In addition, there are 3 graduate certificate programs; 2 associate degree programs; 5 education specialist degrees (graduate programs beyond the masters level); and 3 first-professional degree programs in law, medicine, and pharmacy.

The University offers an Evening and Weekend Degree Program (EWDP) in which at least 19 complete degree programs are available, and core courses are offered in at least 36 additional degree programs. Over 850 classes are offered each semester after 4:00 p.m. or on weekends, with a total (duplicated) enrollment of about 16,000. The following list of degree programs are marked with an * if the entire program is available in the EWDP and with a + if several core courses in a program are offered through EWDP.







Total Degrees 1999-2000² (by Ethnicity)





UNM Alumni in New Mexico by County











Contract & Grant Expenditures FY 1988 to FY 2000









University of New Mexico (FY 1994-95 to FY 1999-00)





Main Campus (FY 1994-95 to FY 1999-00)





UNM Health Sciences Center (FY 1994-95 to FY 1999-00)













Consolidated Investment Fund (CIF) Market Value by Donor-Designated by Recipient (Value as of October, 2000)



Consolidated Investment Fund (CIF) Disbursements by Purpose (FY 2000)








2000-2001 Organizational Structure*








Vice Provost Extended University & Dean of Continuing Education




2000-2001 Organizational Structure


2000-2001 Organizational Structure






VP, Student Affairs




