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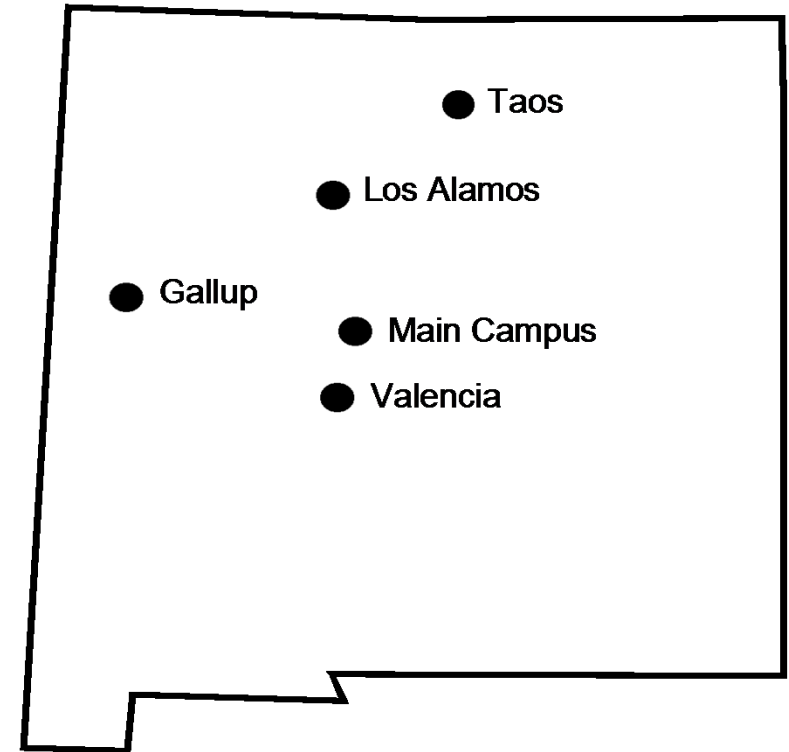

Introduction

In Fall 2009, the campuses of the University of New Mexico served 34,674 students; employed 3,707 faculty, 6,899 staff, and 5,123 students (an additional 5,951 staff work at University Hospital, 70 at the UNM Foundation, and 91 at the UNM Medical Group); and had a total operating and capital budget of about \$2.14 billion. In the previous academic year, UNM awarded 5,176 degrees and certificates.

This fact book presents data for all UNM campuses. UNM consists of a Main Campus located in Albuquerque, which includes the Health Sciences Center, Extended University, and Continuing Education, and four branch campuses, which have a two-year degree mission: UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, UNM Taos, and UNM-Valencia. The Extended University provides access to courses on-site and via technologies—including satellite broadcasts, videoconferencing, and on-line instruction—throughout the state. The Extended University also offers courses at centers located in Farmington, Gallup, Kirtland Air Force Base, Los Alamos, Santa Fe, Taos, and Valencia. The university is also offering courses at UNM West (Rio Rancho). The UNM Health Sciences Center and its programs—which include the School of Medicine, College of Nursing, and College of Pharmacy—are sometimes reported in the Fact Book as part of the Main Campus and sometimes separately. Footnotes and labels should make it clear in each case what is included.

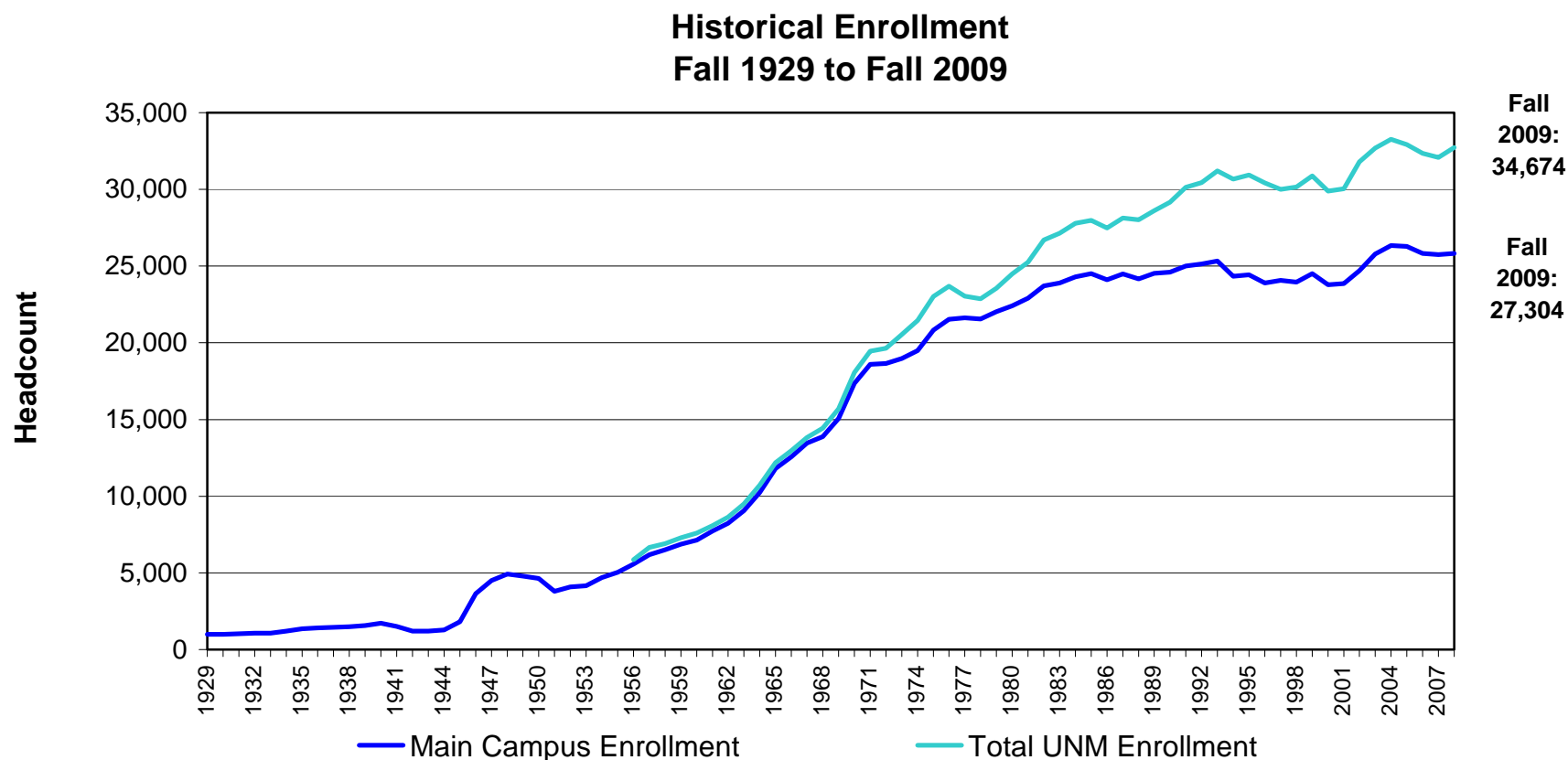


An additional unit of the University of New Mexico is the Division of Continuing Education and Community Services, which serves more than 31,500 students annually in various non-credit or certificate courses, workshops, and training sessions. Approximately 200,000 community and UNM participants use the Conference Center facility each year.

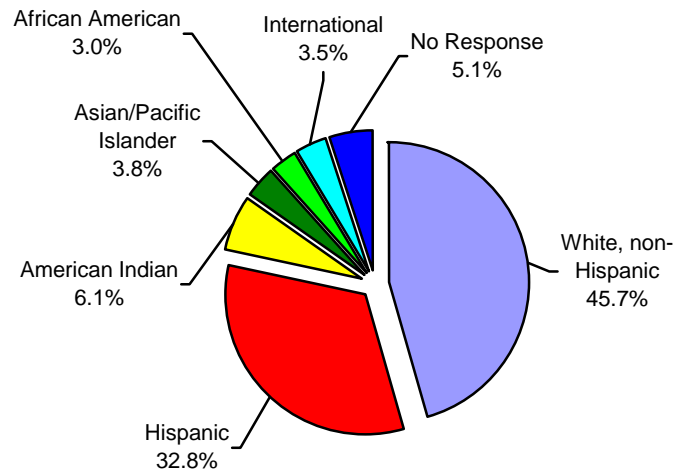

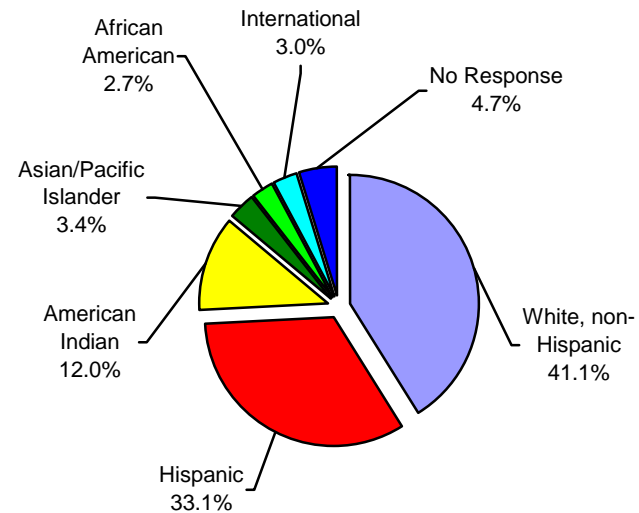

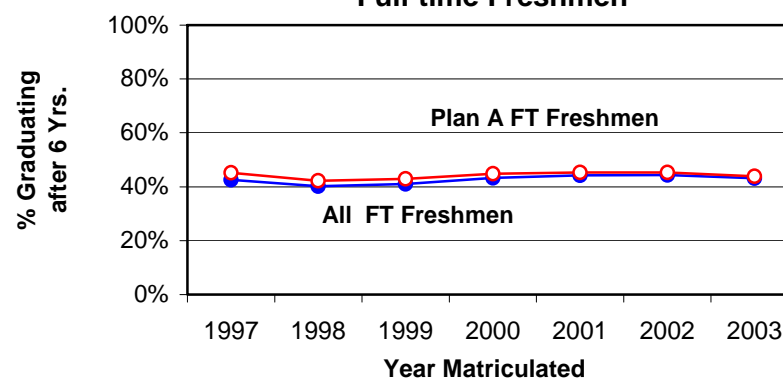

6-Year Graduation Rates Full-time Freshmen



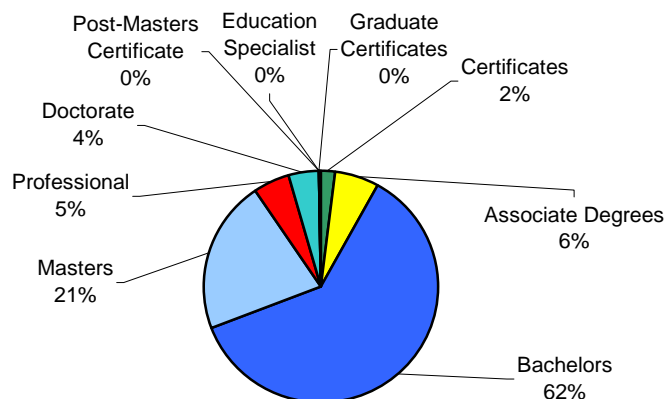

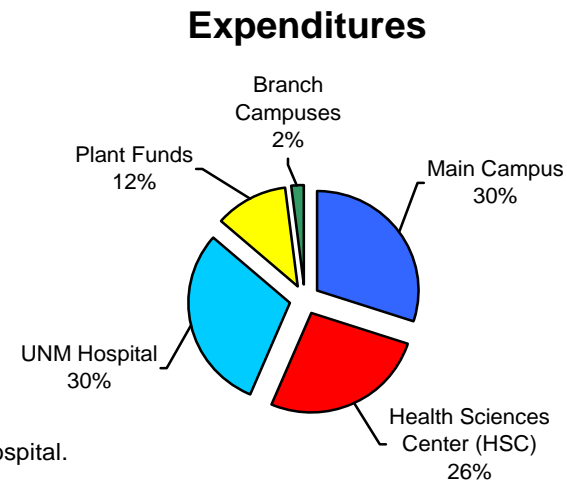

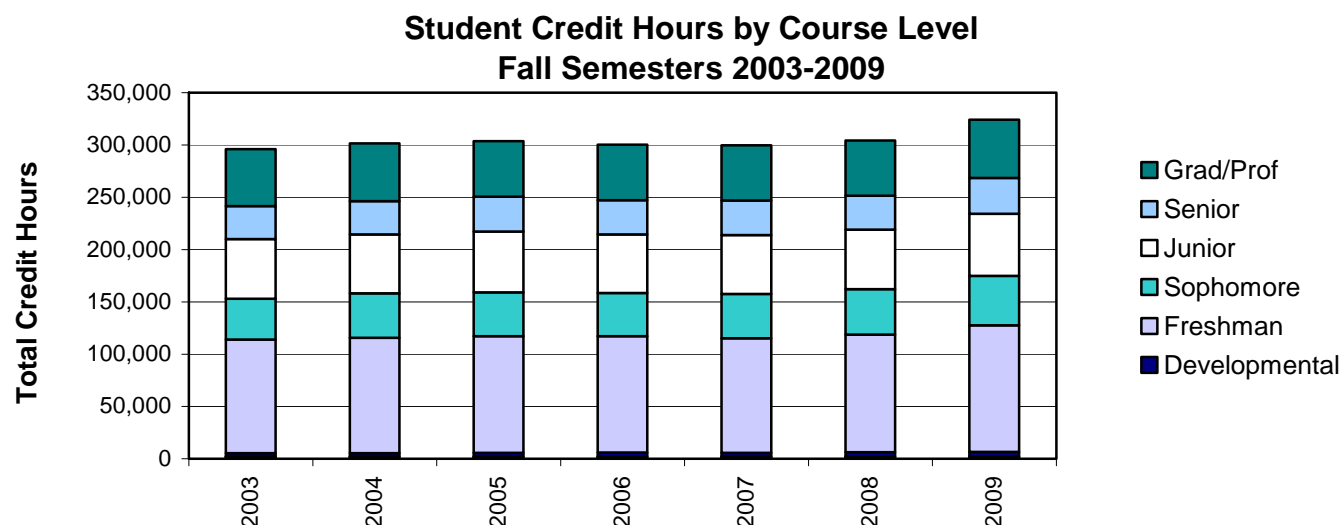

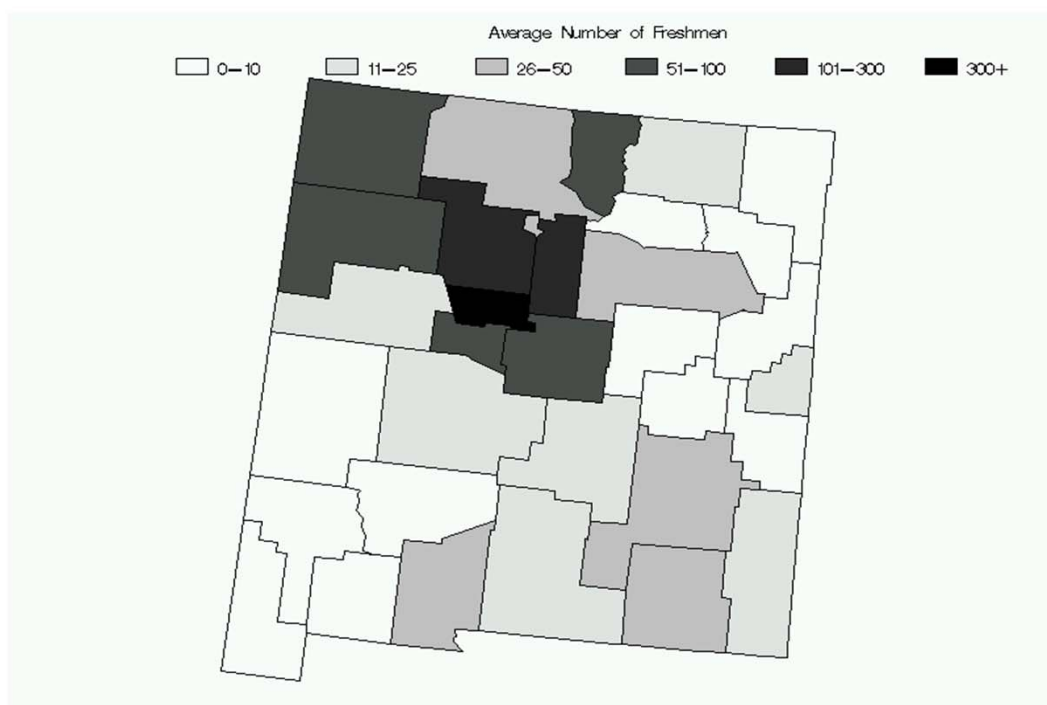

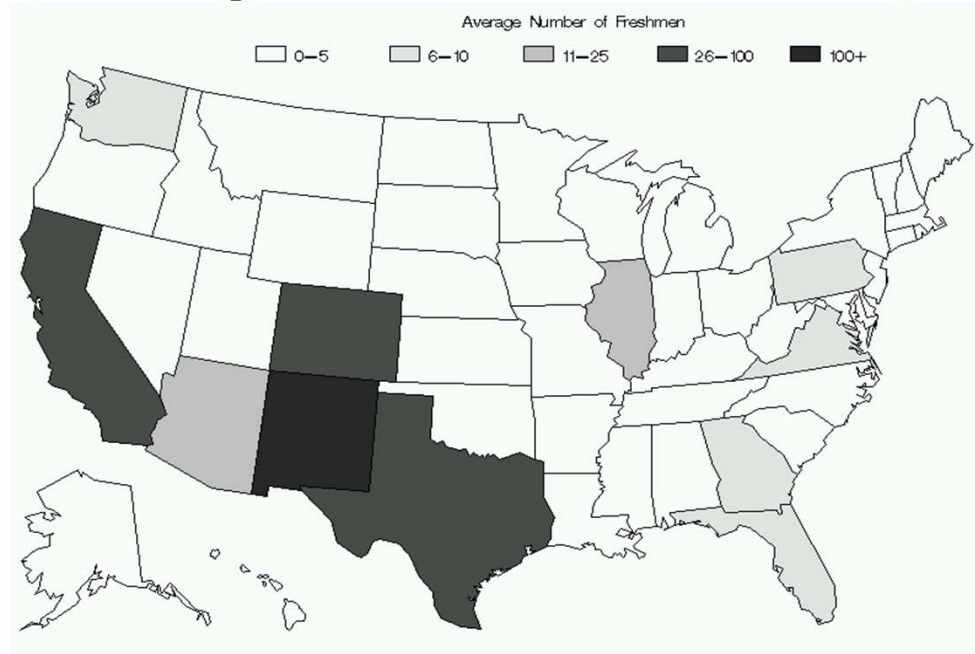

UNM's Main Campus offers over 218 active degree and certificate programs. There are 90 baccalaureate, 71 masters, and 38 doctoral level degree programs. In addition, there are 4 doctoral professional practice programs—in law, medicine, pharmacy, and physical therapy—as well as 4 education specialist certificates (graduate programs beyond the masters level), 9 graduate certificate programs, 5 undergraduate certificate programs, and 1 associate degree program. The University offers an Evening and Weekend Degree Program (EWDP) in which nearly 40 majors and minors are available, and core courses are offered in a number of additional degree programs. About 1,000 classes are offered each semester after 4:00 p.m. or on weekends. Approximately 12,000 non-traditional, working students attend UNM at night each semester. 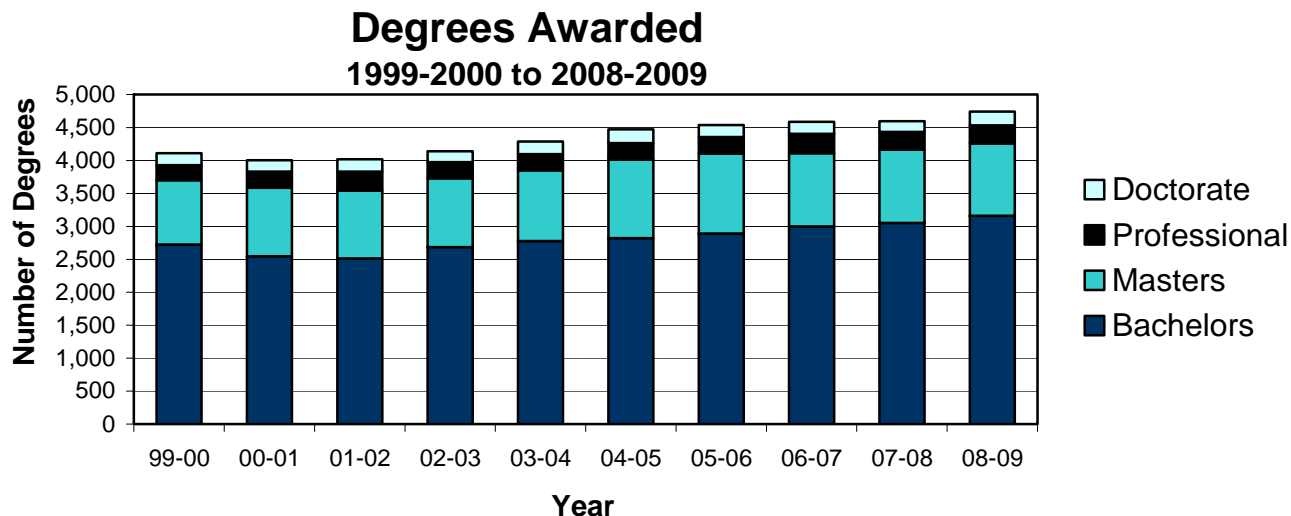

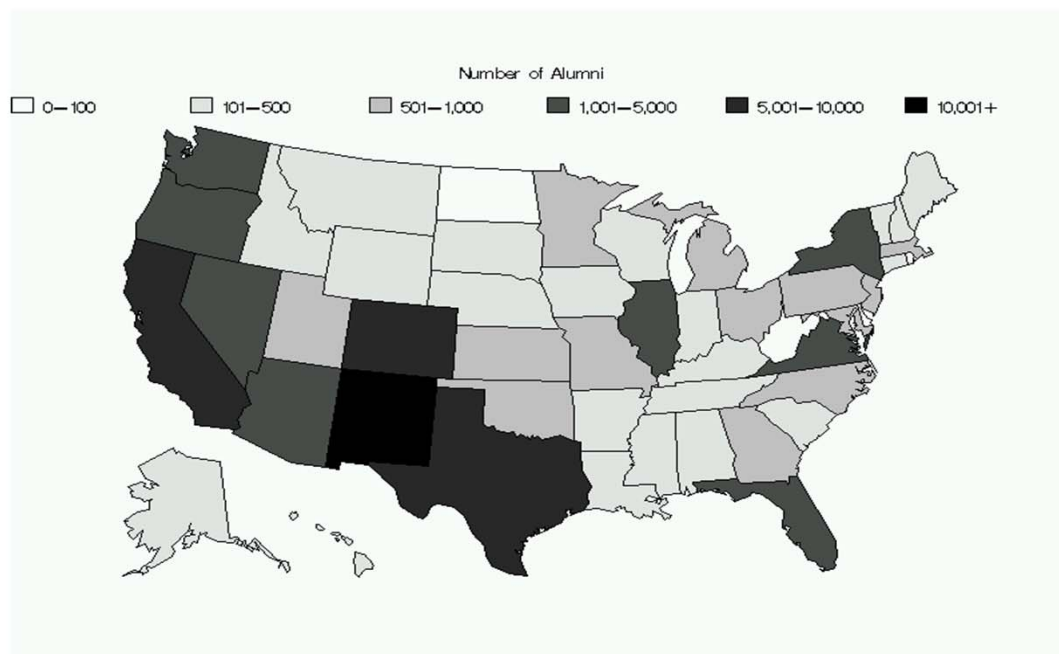

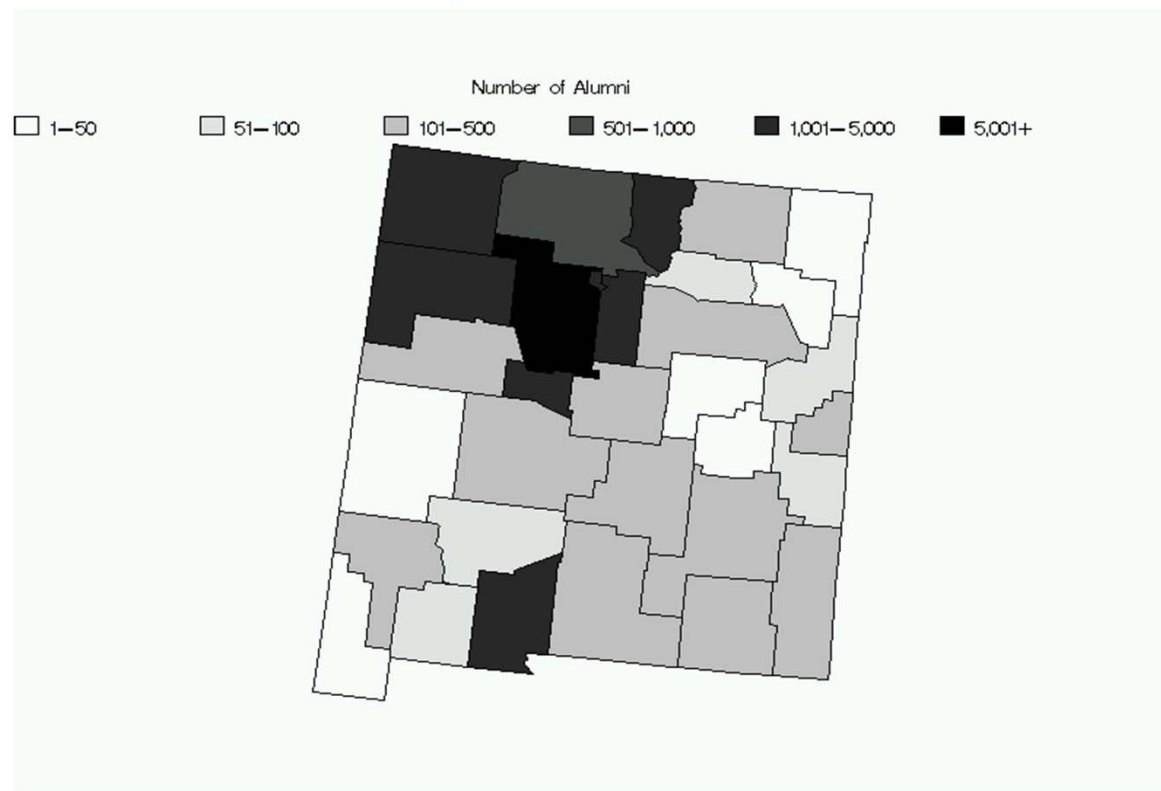

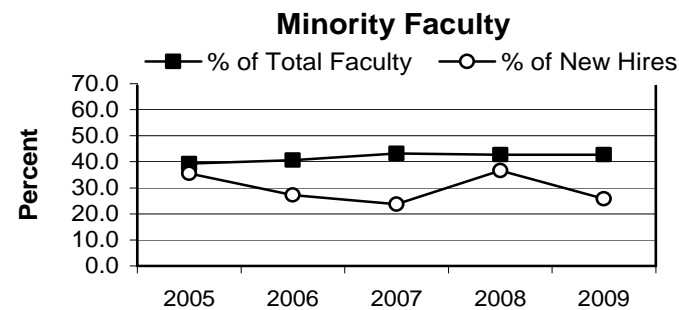

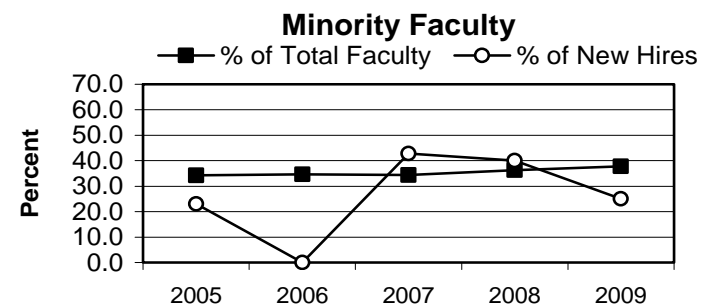

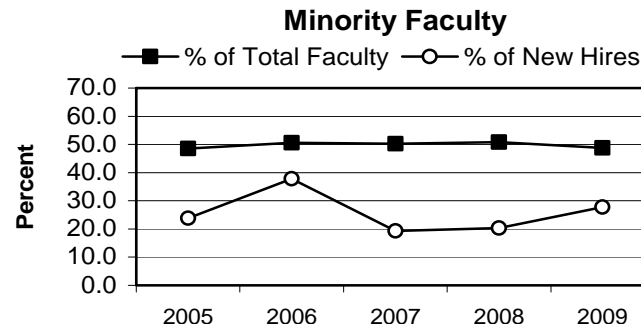

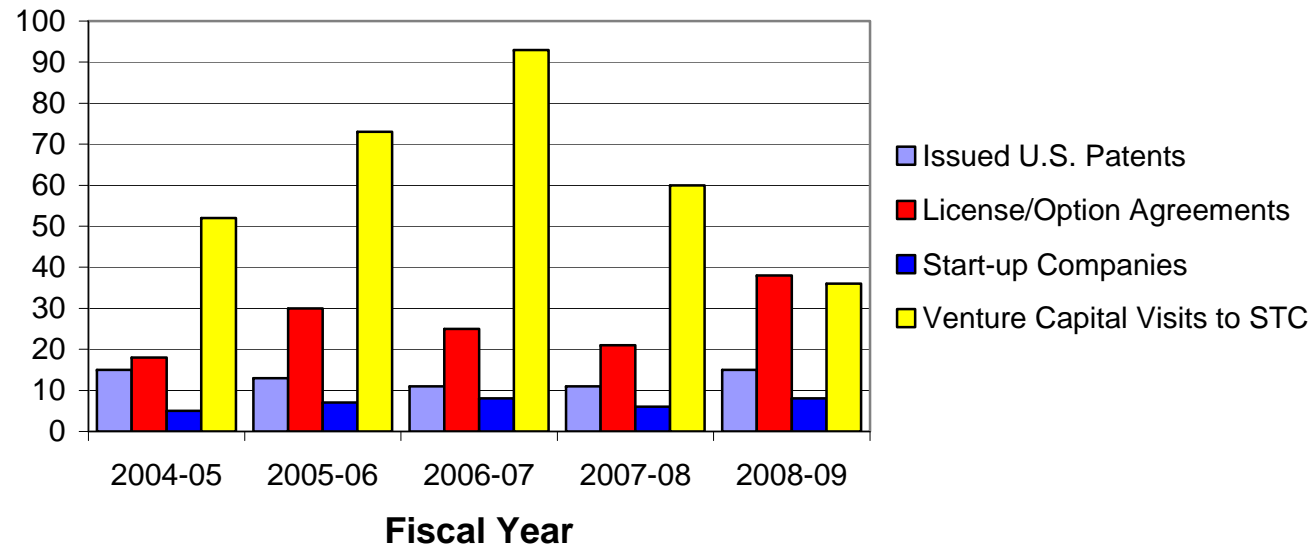

UNM Main Campus Libraries

Overview

UNM Main Campus Libraries include the University Libraries (UL), the Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC) and the Law Library. University Libraries is administered by the Dean of University Libraries who reports to the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs. In the Health Sciences Center the Director of Library Support Services for the HSLIC reports to the Associate Vice President for Knowledge Management and IT and in the Law School the Associate Dean for Library and Information Technology reports to the Dean of the School of Law. The Bunting Visual Resources Library (CFA) and the Tireman Learning Materials Library (COE) provide specialized collections to their colleges.

University Libraries

The University Libraries is the largest academic library system in the state with the most paper and electronic resources as well as the most space for students. The physical library is comprised of Centennial Science and Engineering Library, Fine Arts & Design Library, Parish Memorial Library for Business and Economics, and Zimmerman Library. University Libraries will also take a lead role in providing services at the new UNM West Campus in Rio Rancho, NM starting in January 2010. The Center for Southwest Research & Special Collections located in the historic West Wing of Zimmerman Library houses significant resources on the Southwest and other collecting areas. The UL is a Government Information Depository Library and Patent and Trademark Depository Library. The UL provides 24/7 on-line services through an extensive set of web pages and offers 24/5 hours for UNM only at Parish Memorial Library.

Law Library

The UNM Law Library houses the largest academic legal research collection in the State of New Mexico and is considered a “large” library under ABA accreditation standards. The library space consists of 32,443 square feet, encompassing two floors with beautiful views of the Sandia Mountains. During the academic year, the Library gate count reaches 10,000+ visits per month, with the Library open an average of 90 hours per week.

Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center

The Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center is the only federally-designated resource library to serve the health information needs of New Mexico. The HSLIC serves the Colleges of Pharmacy and Nursing as well as the School of Medicine, Biomedical Sciences Graduate Program, and Diagnostic & Therapeutic Sciences Programs. HSLIC serves approximately 9,000, including faculty, students, staff and preceptors across the state. HSLIC is open 357 days a year. Over 200 health-related organizations and individual health professionals throughout New Mexico receive specialized services through outreach memberships and other programs.

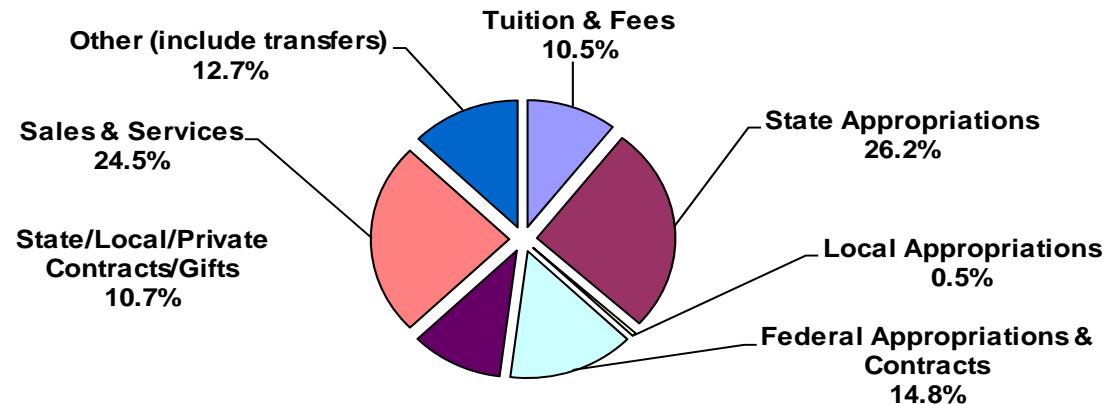

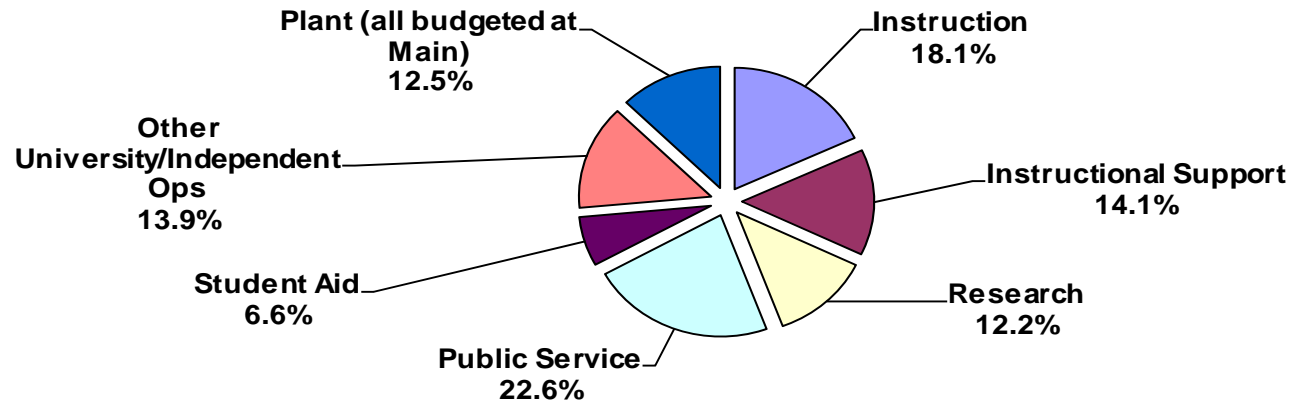

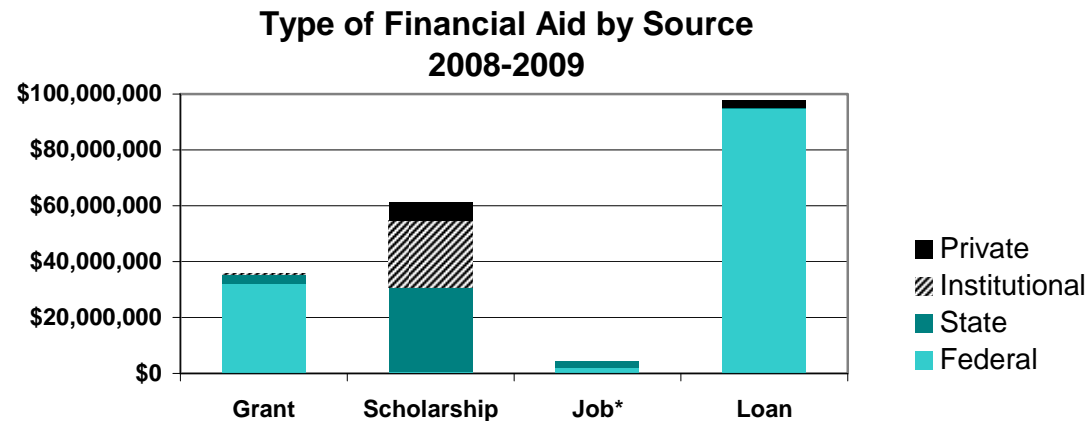

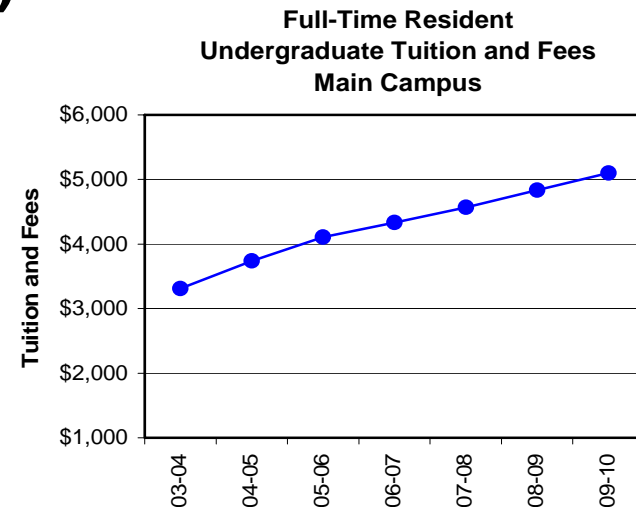

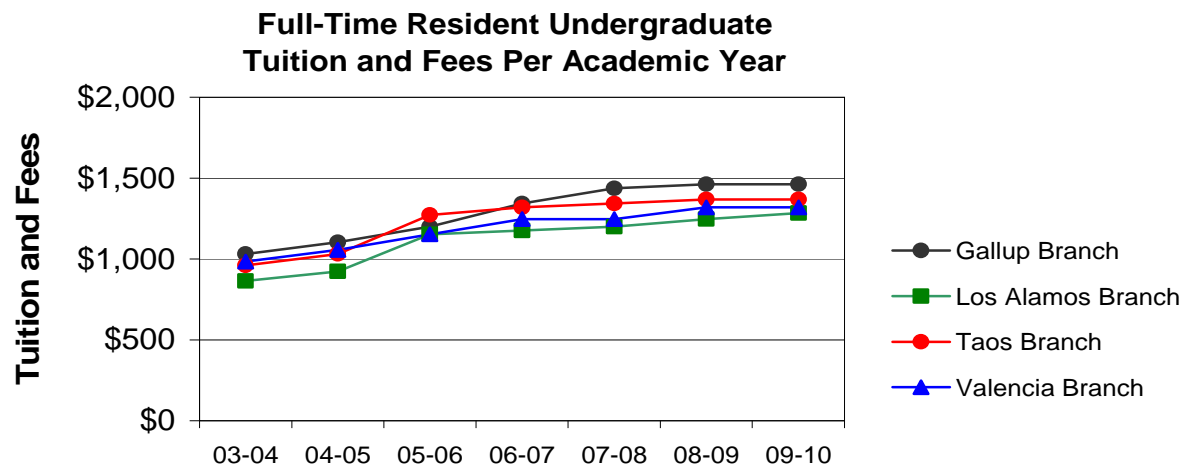

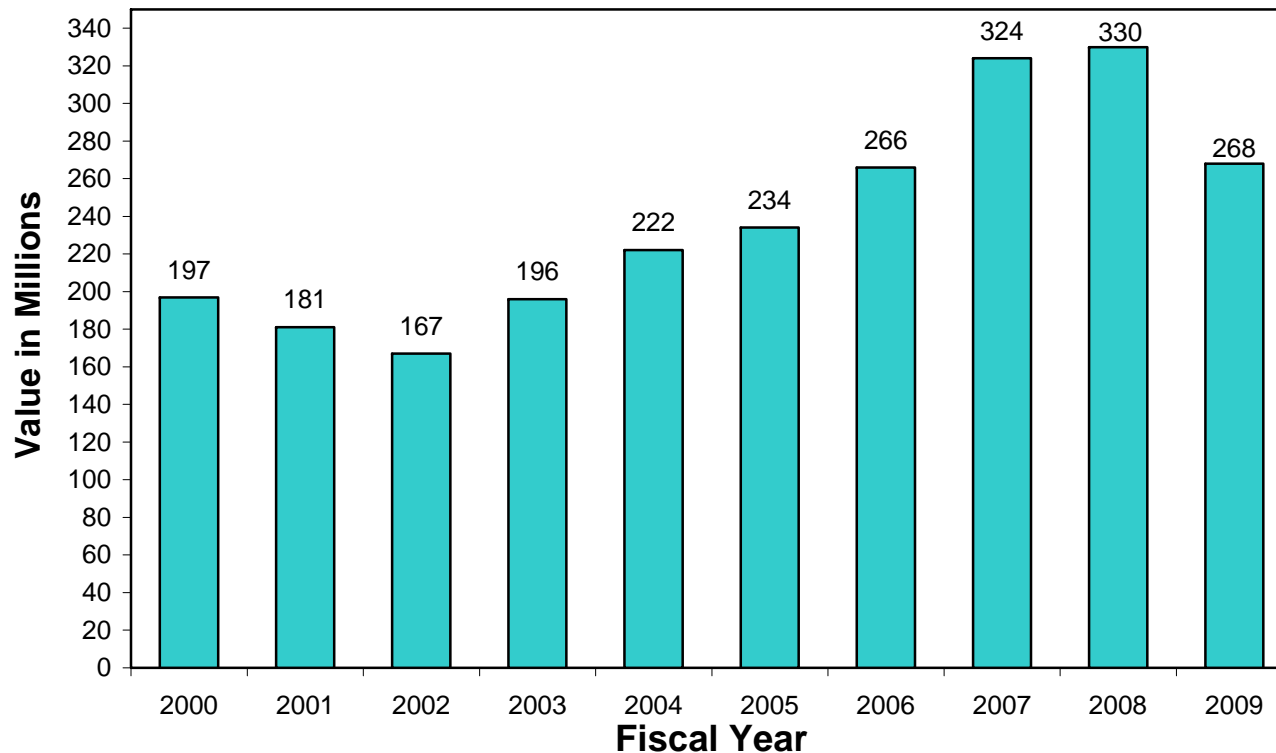

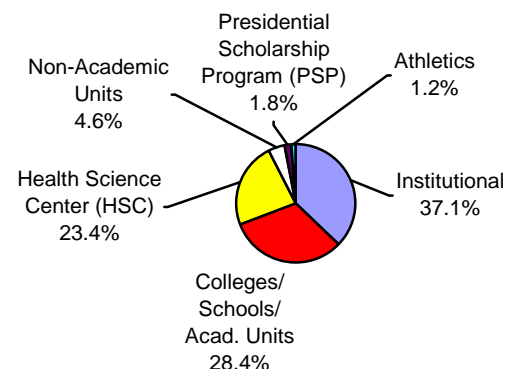

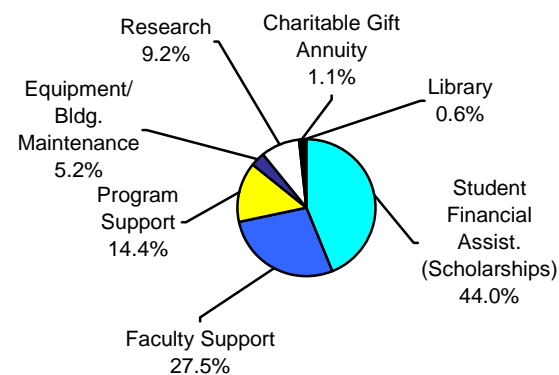

(FY 2009)**



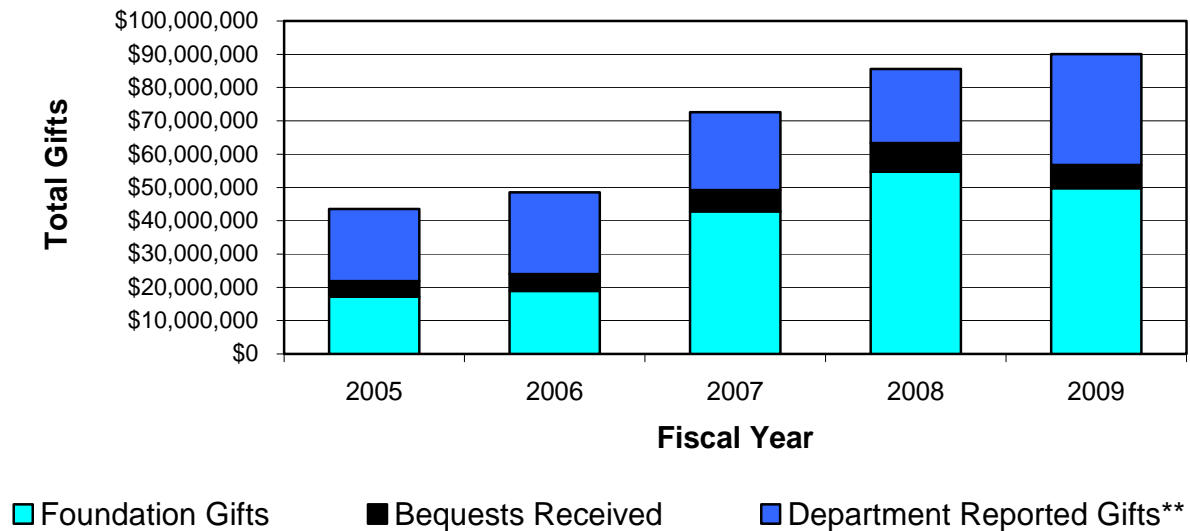

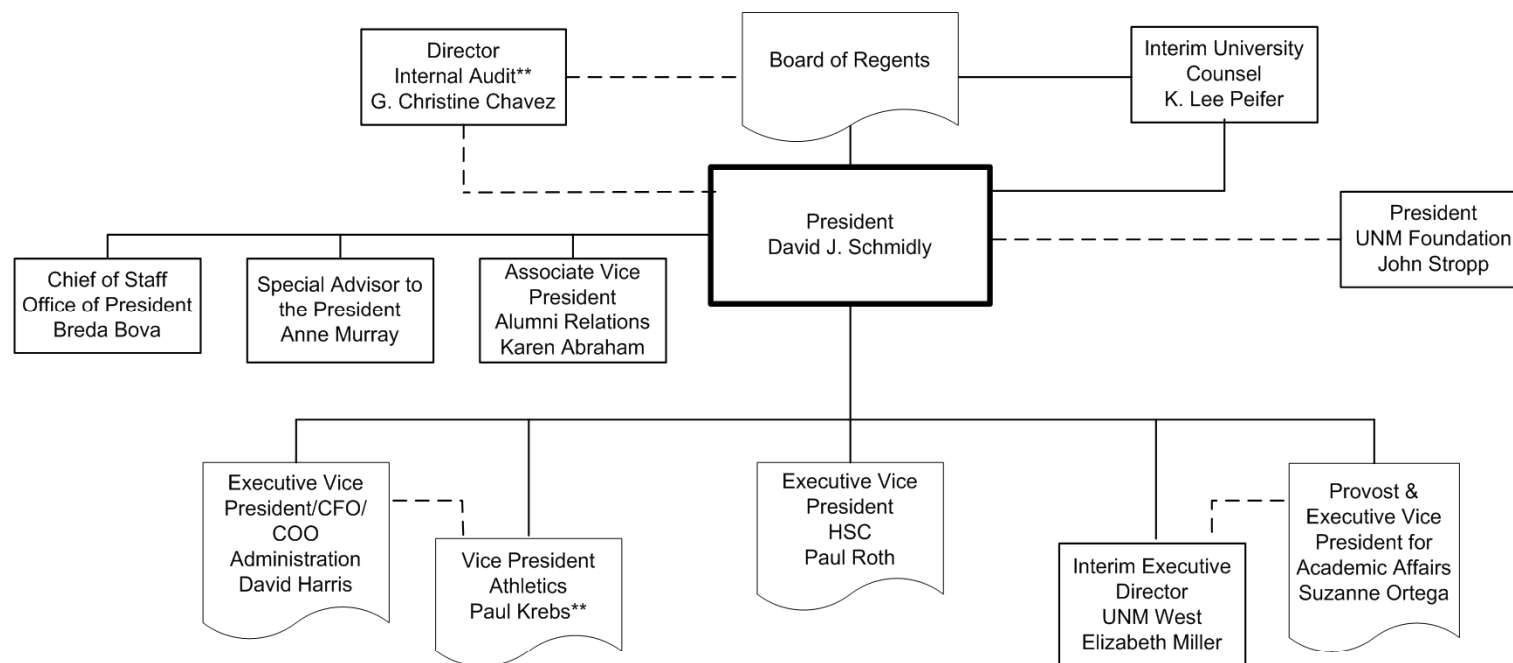

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*



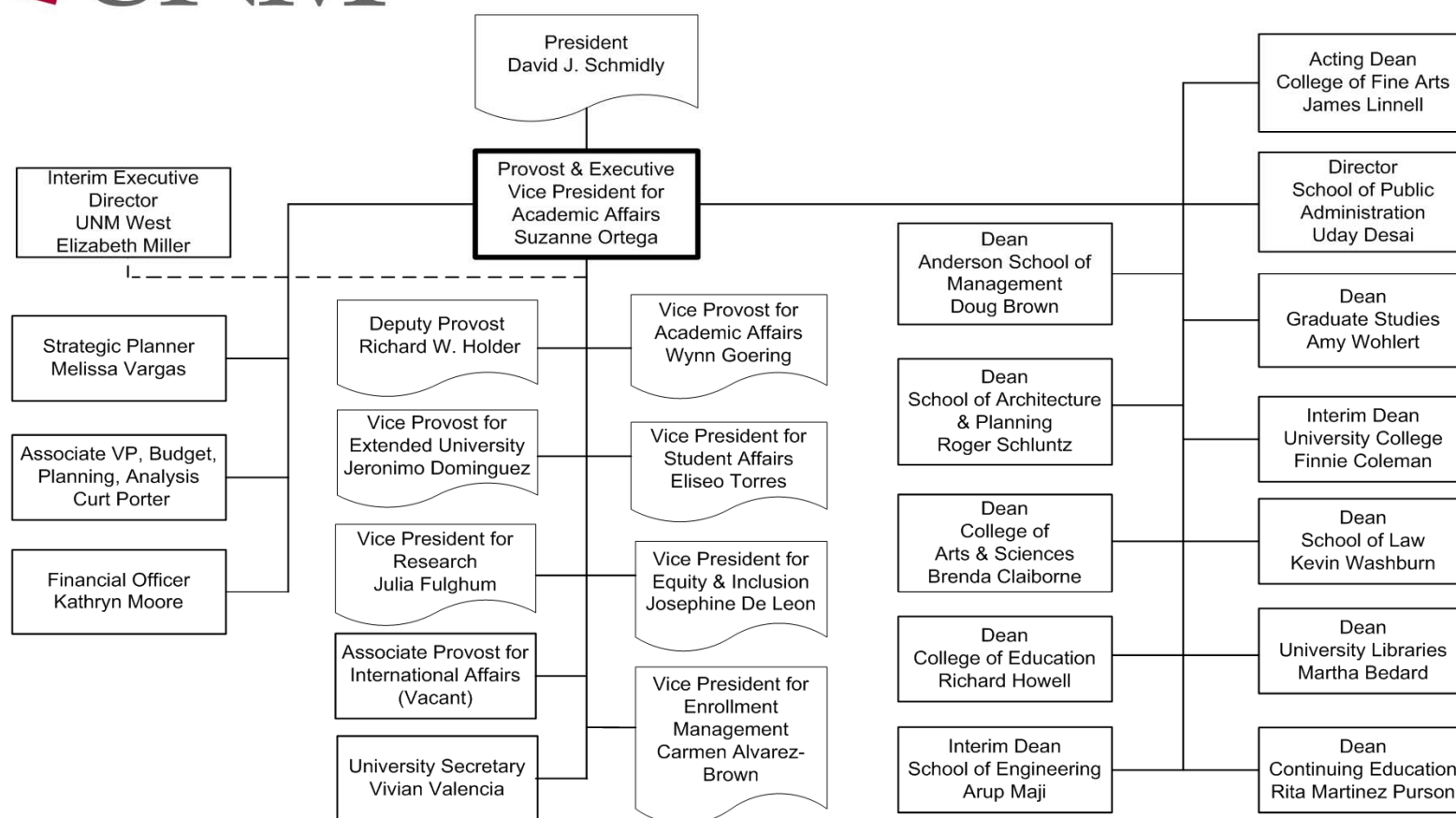

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

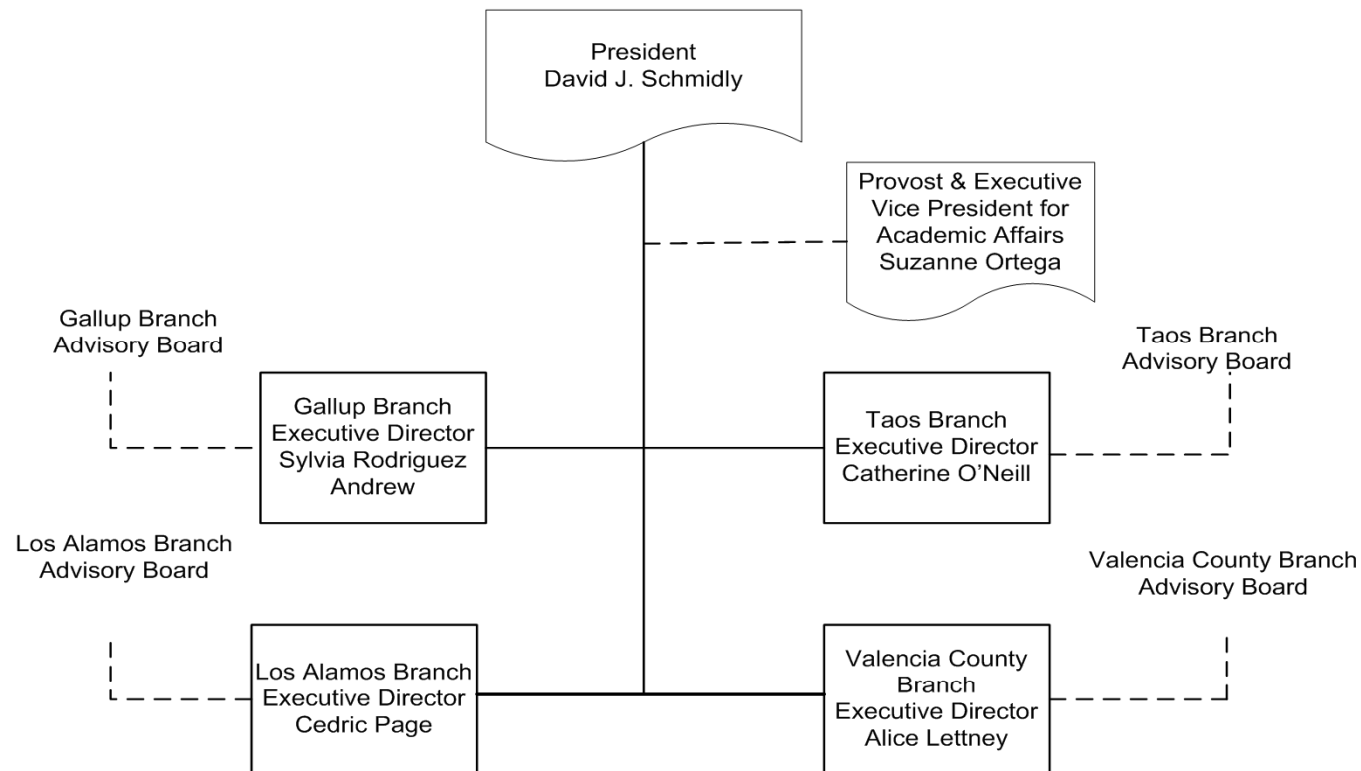

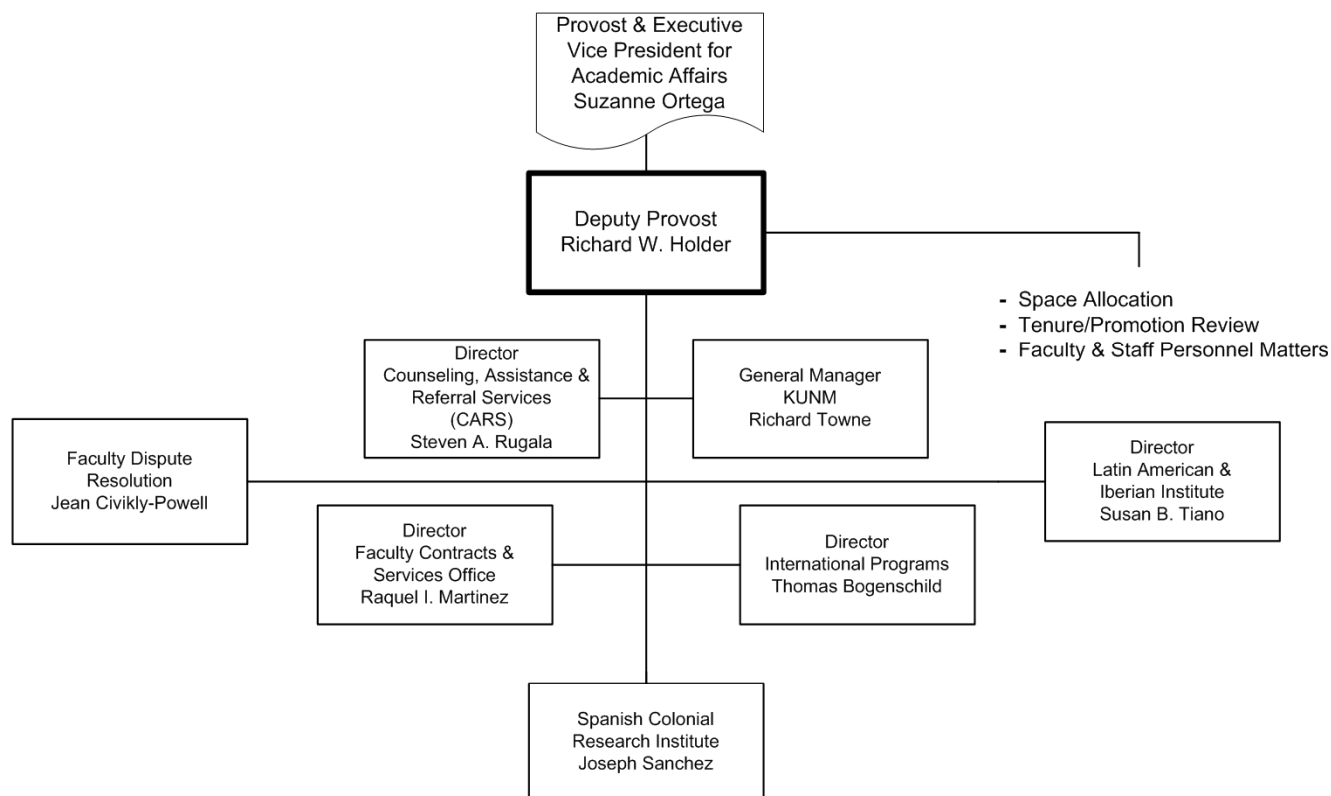

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

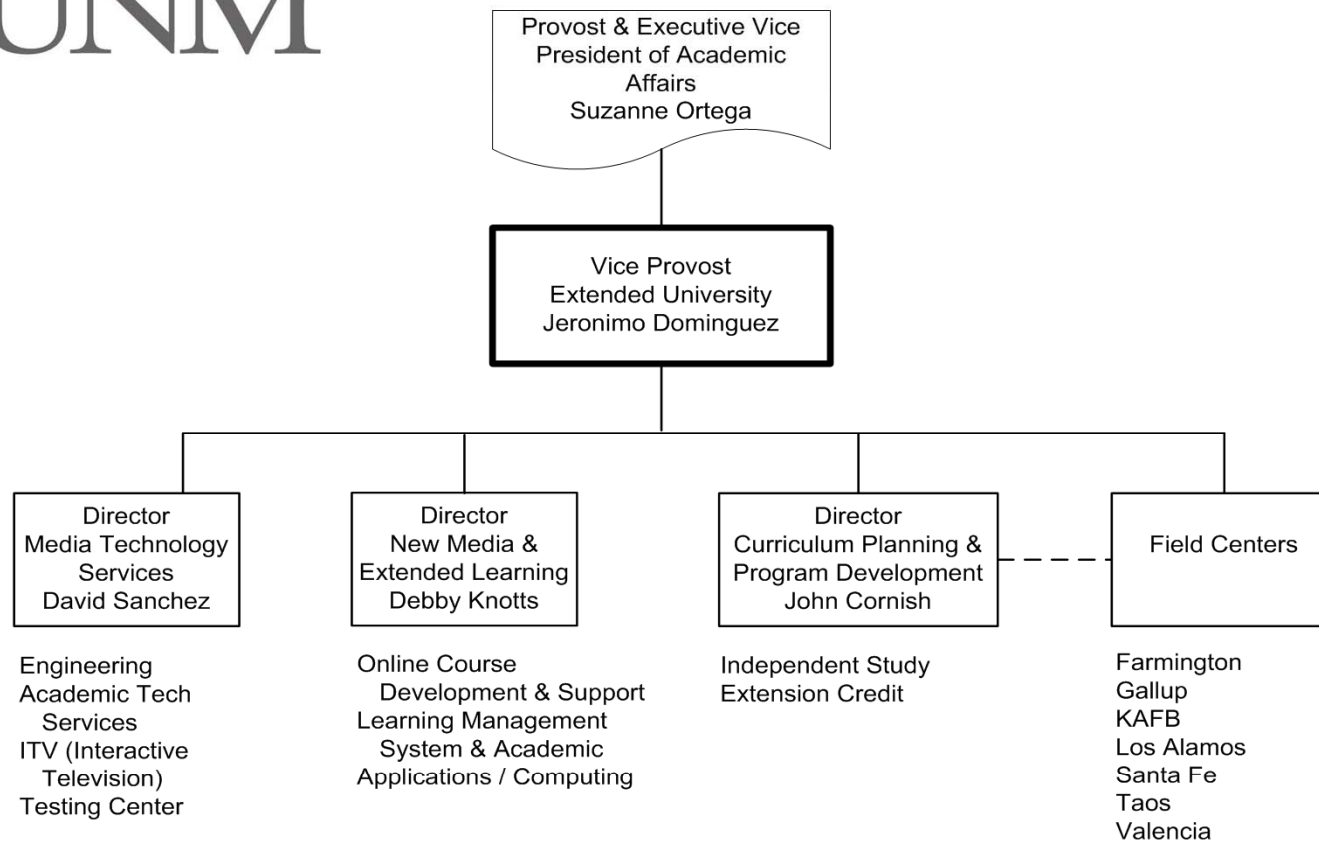

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

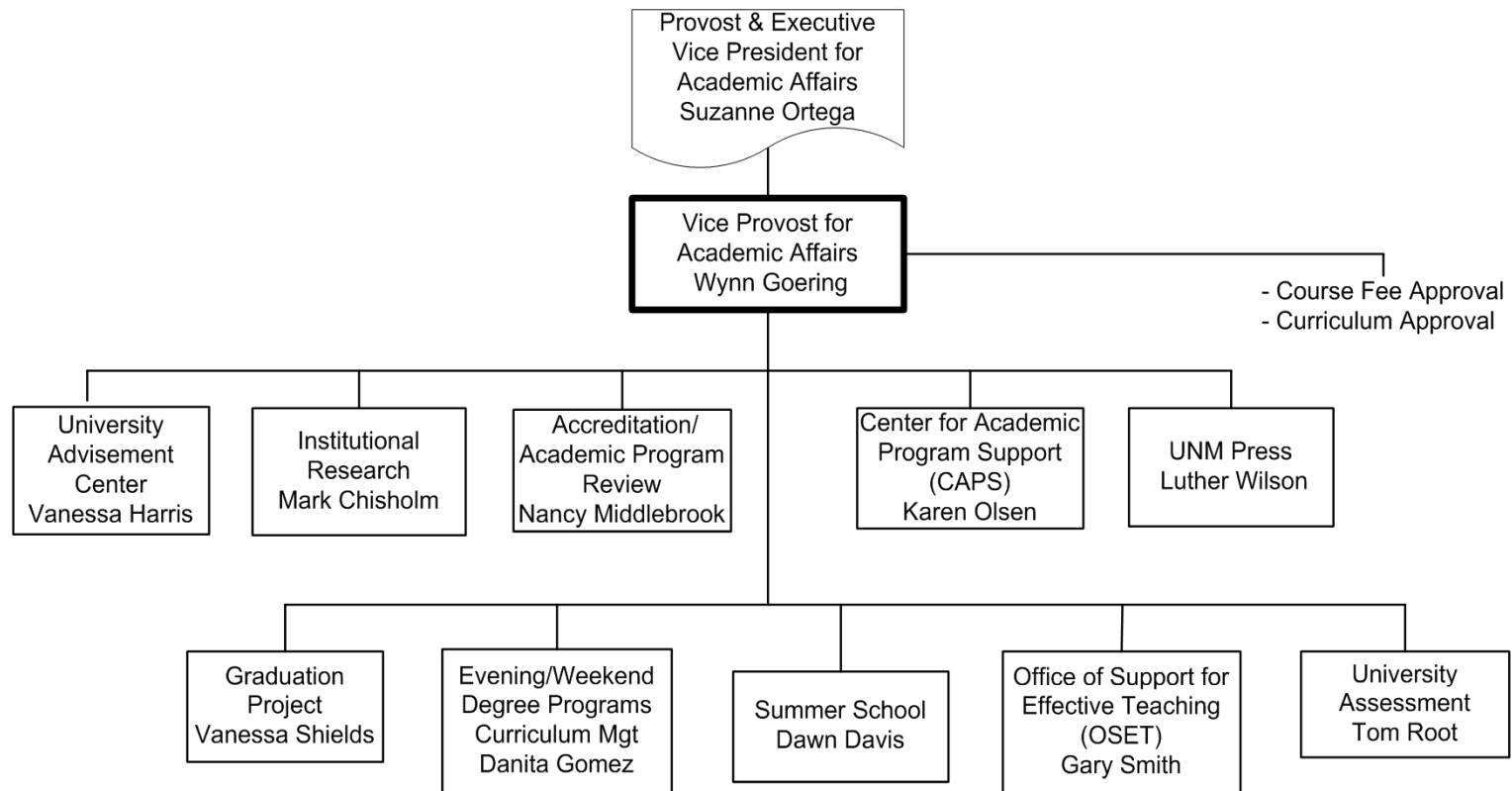

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

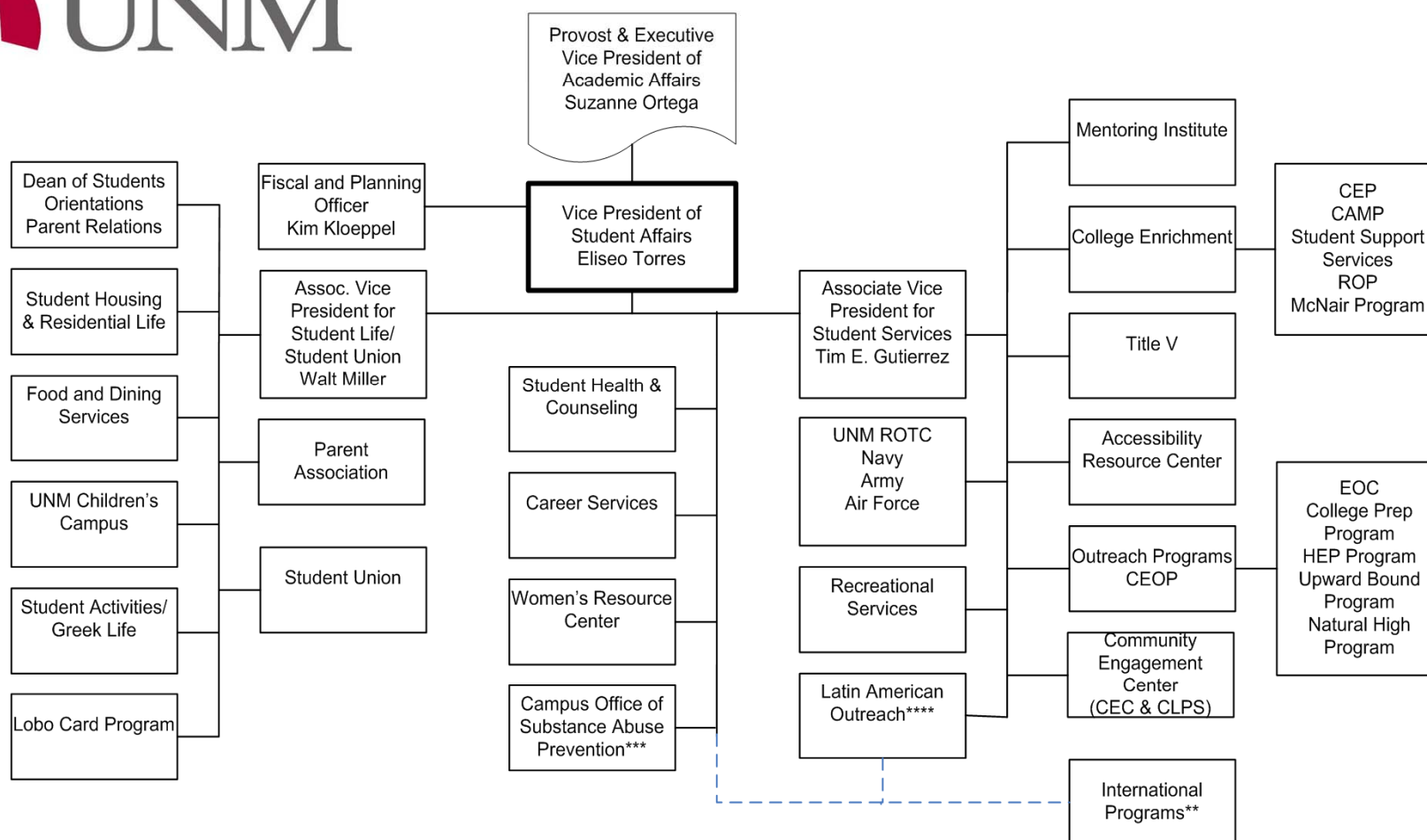

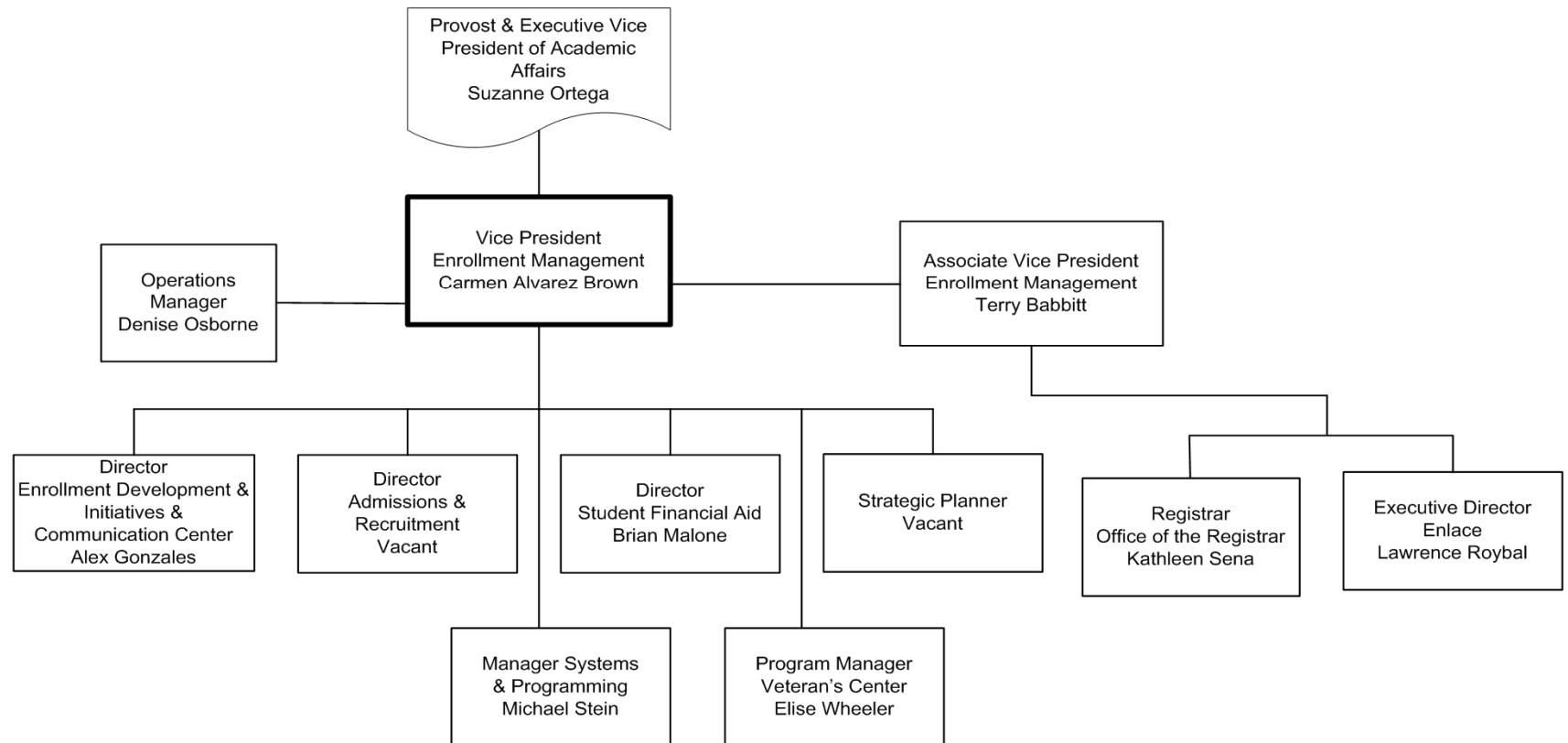

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

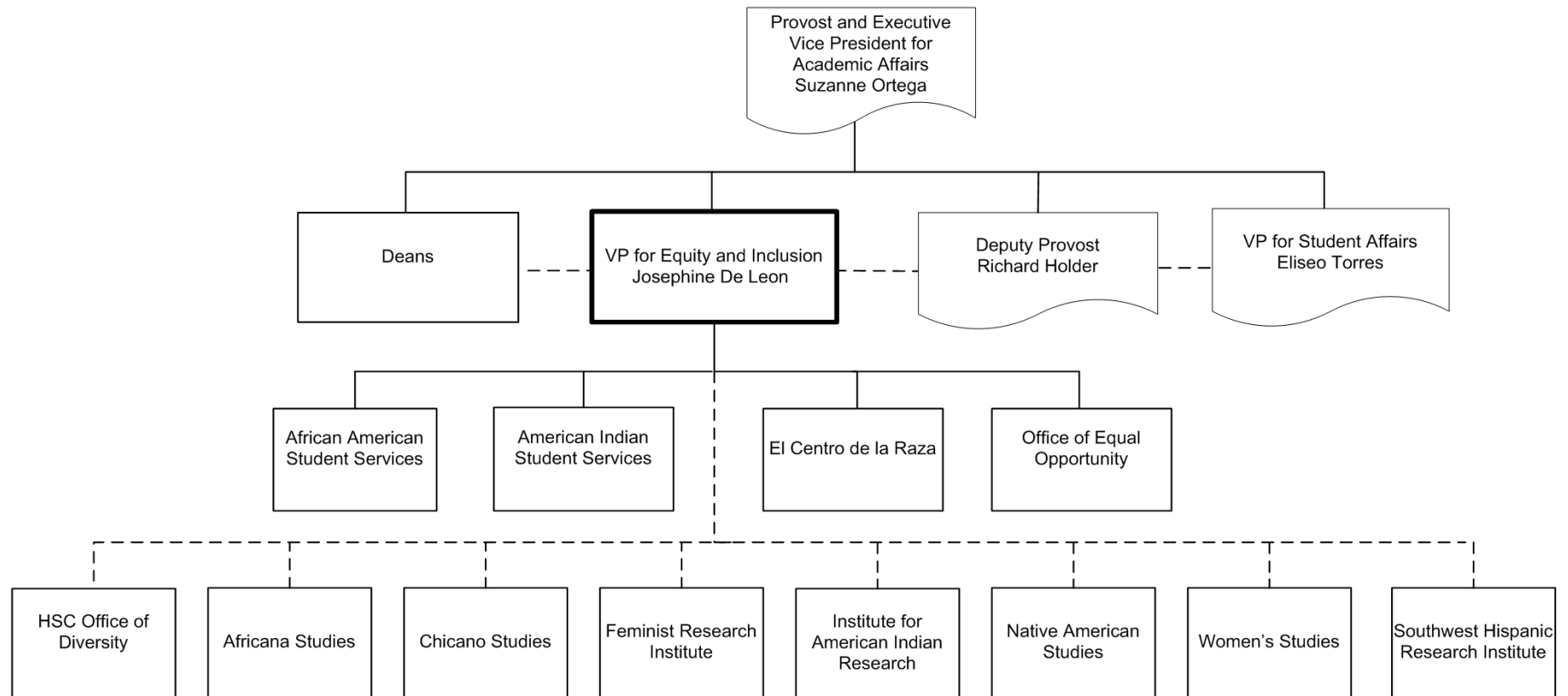

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

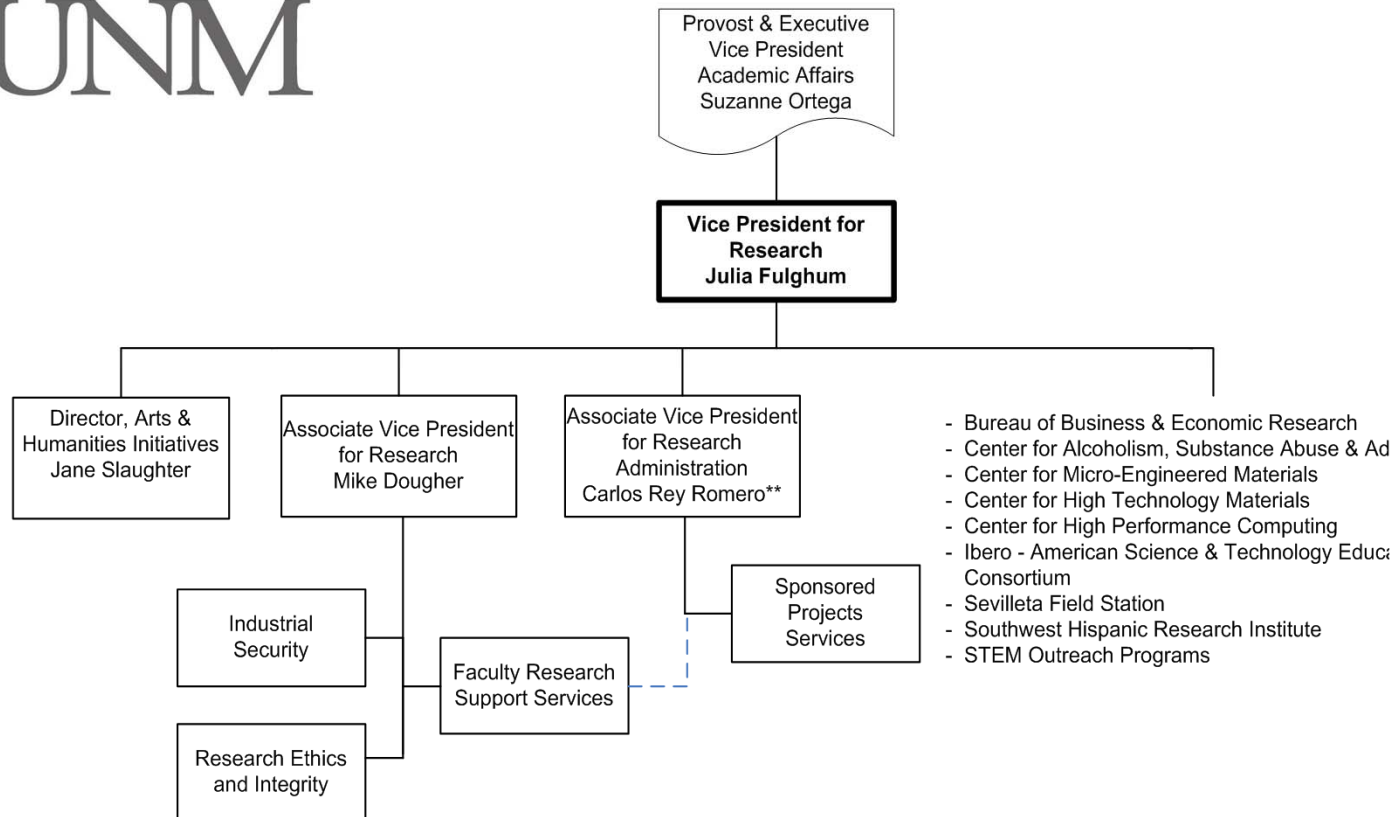

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*



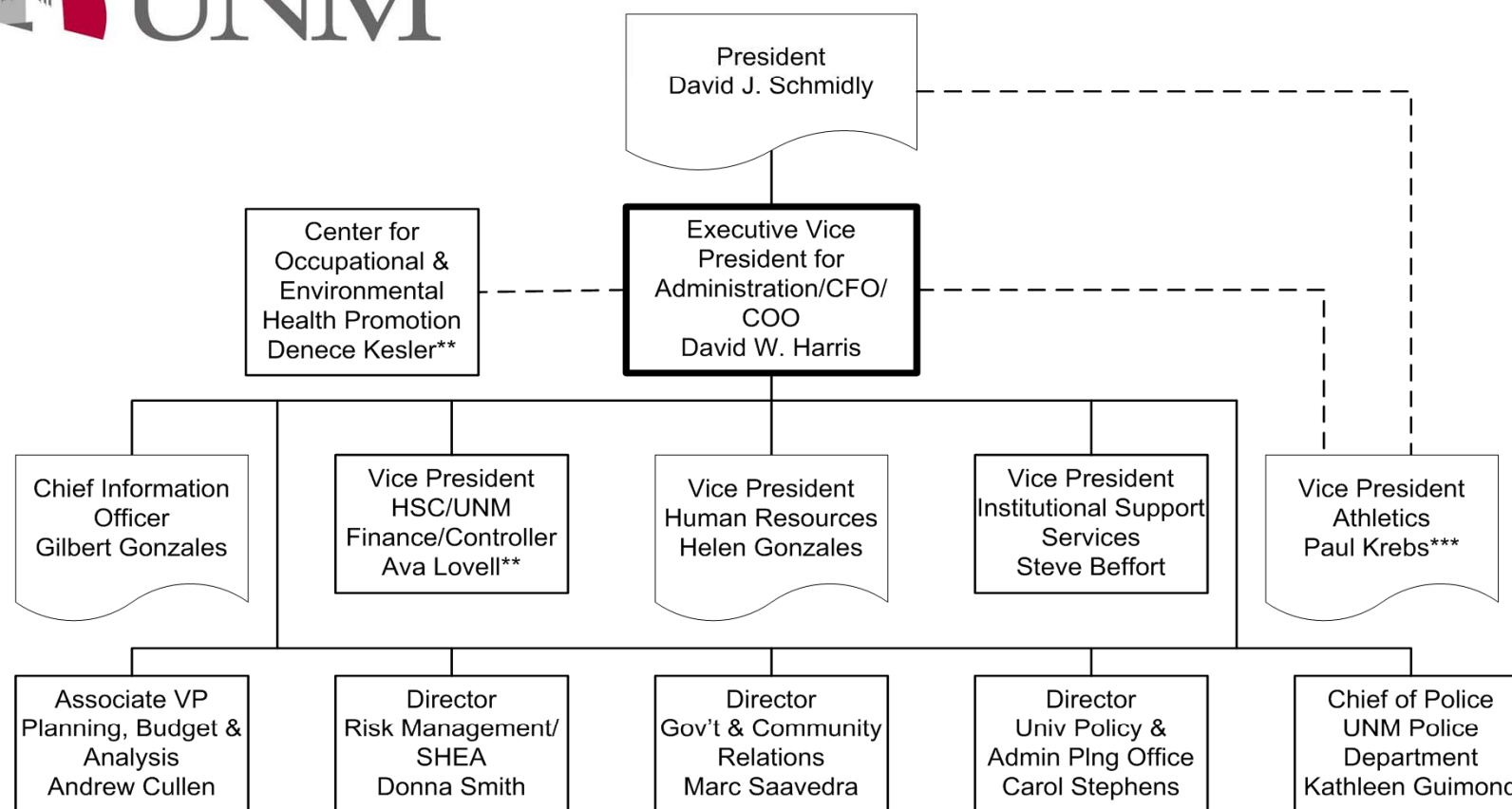

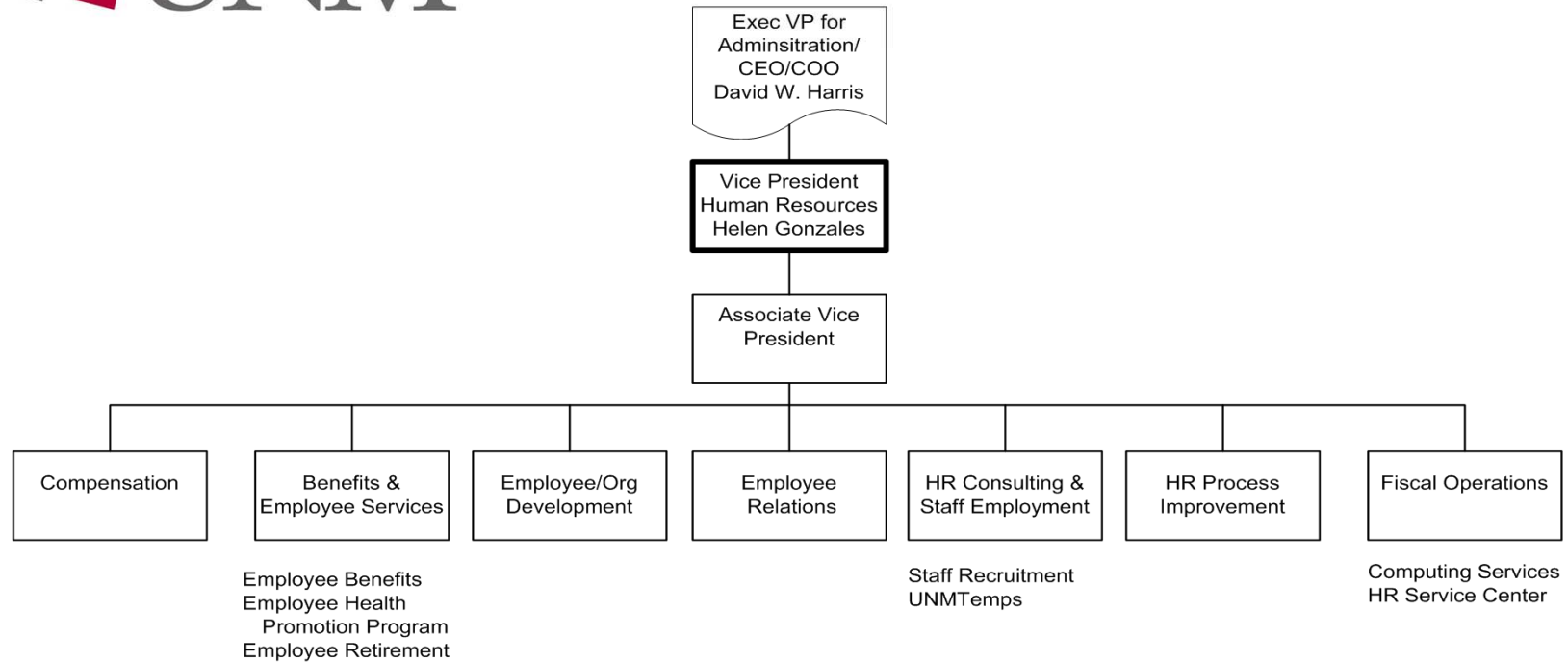

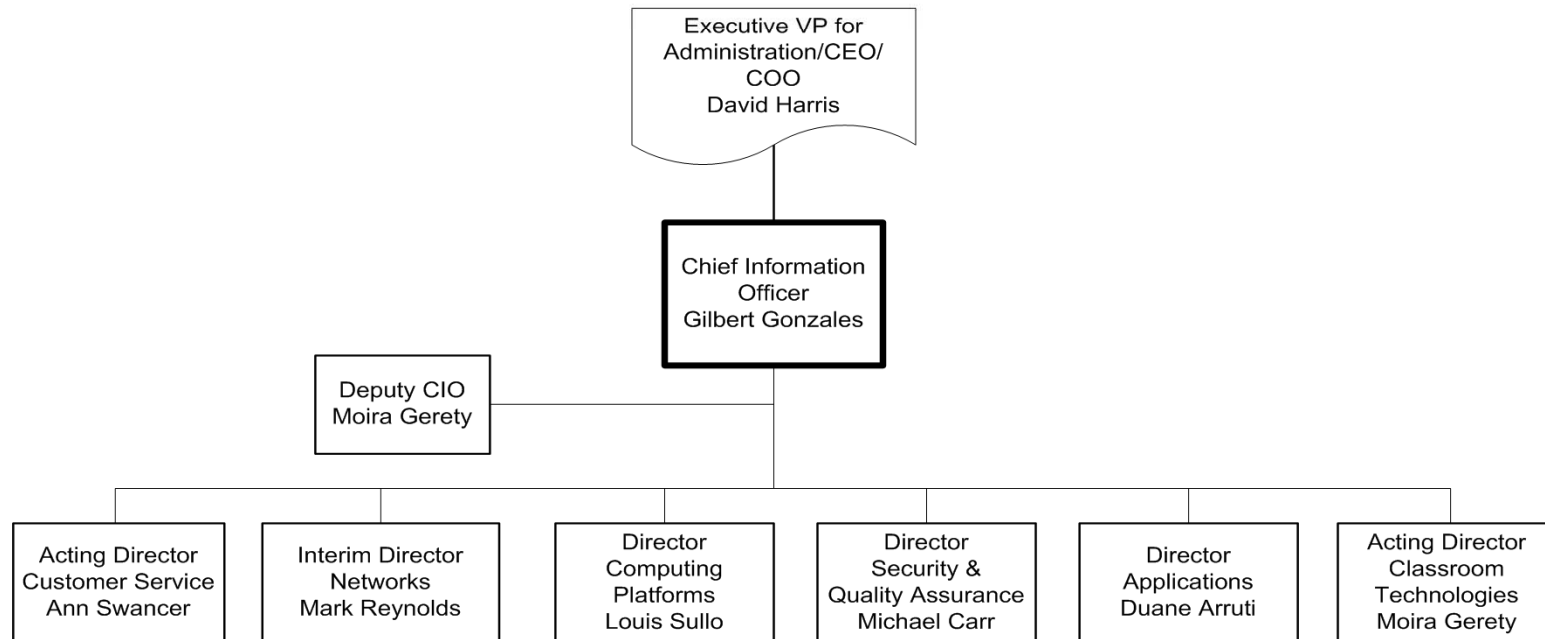

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

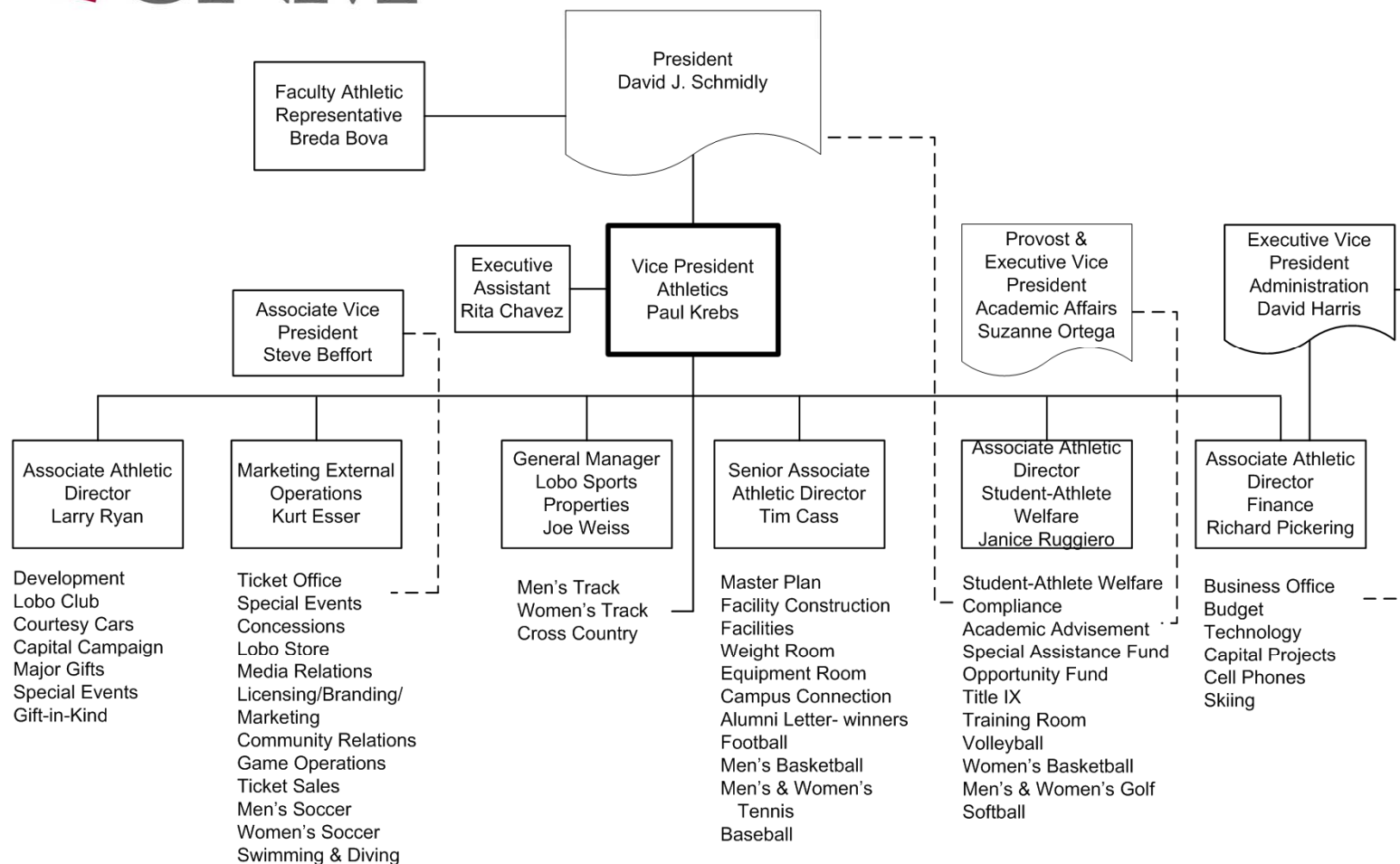

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

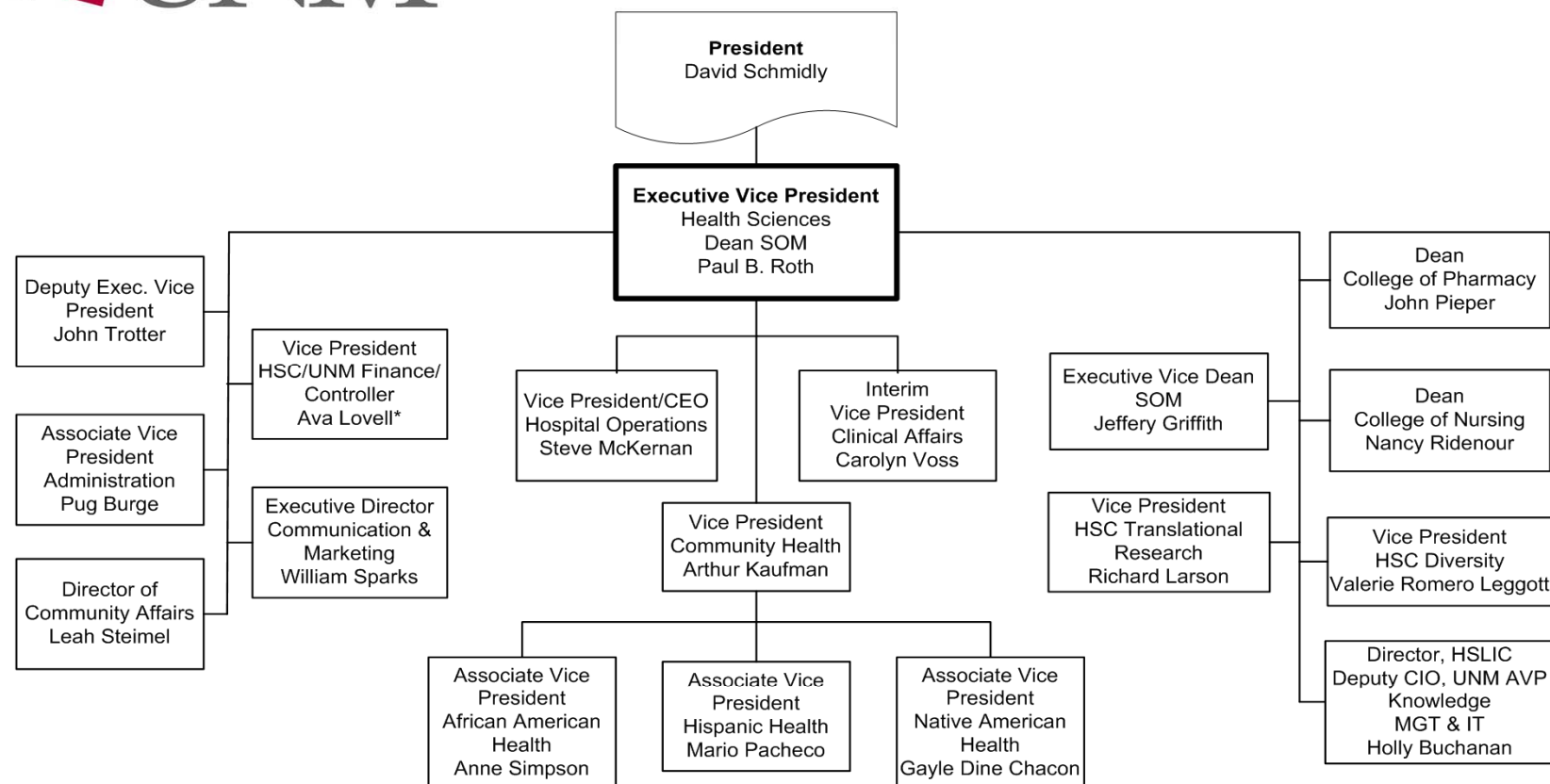

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*



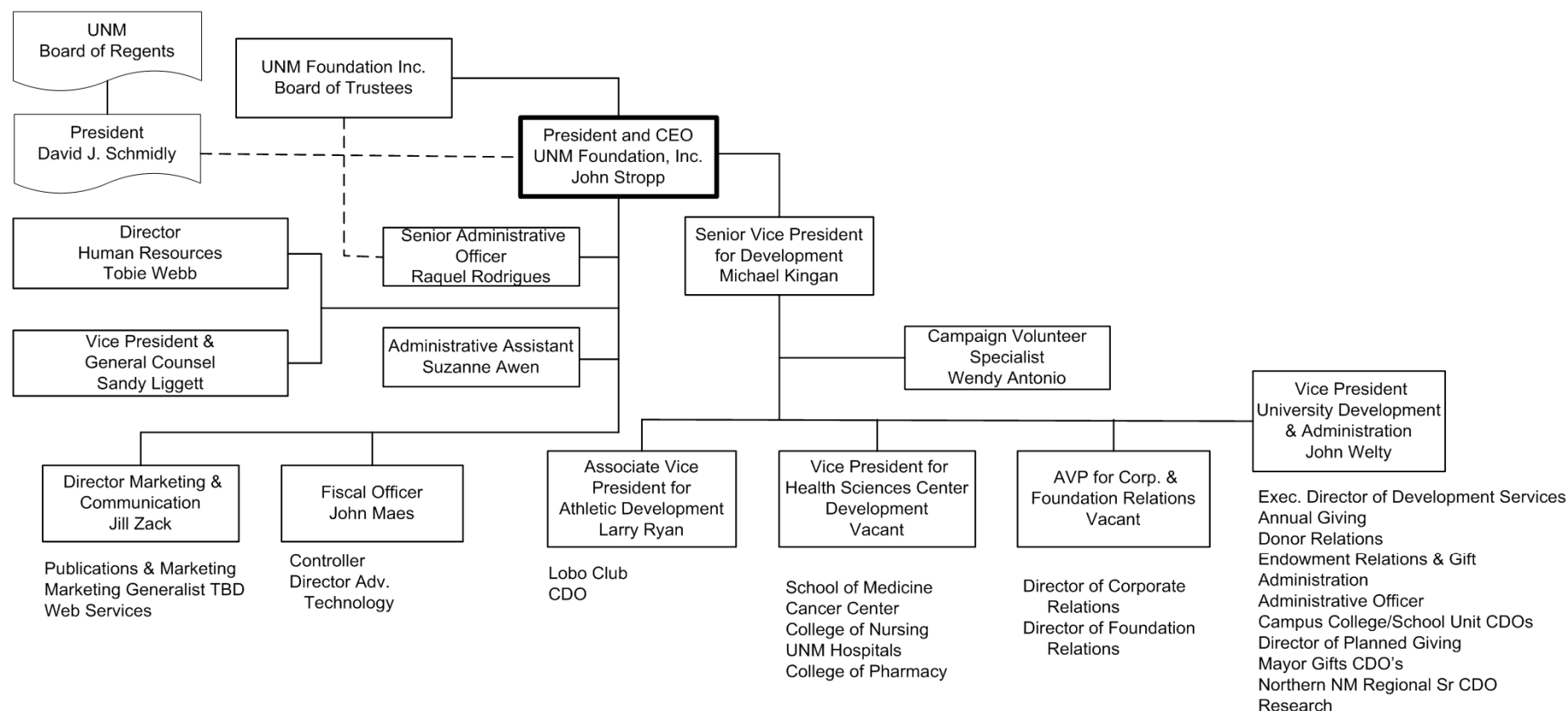

2009-2010 Organizational Structure*

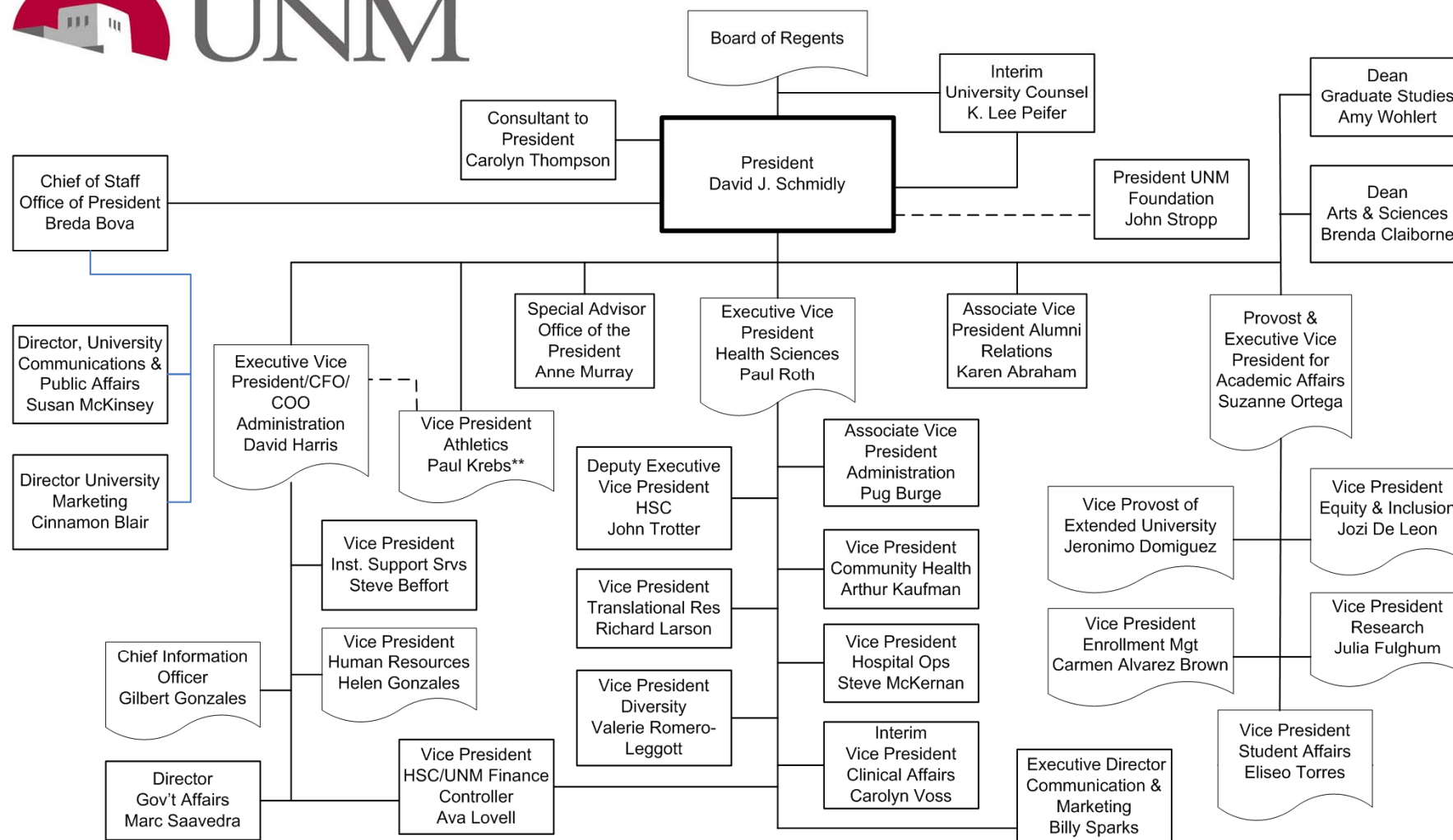

2009-2010 Executive Cabinet*



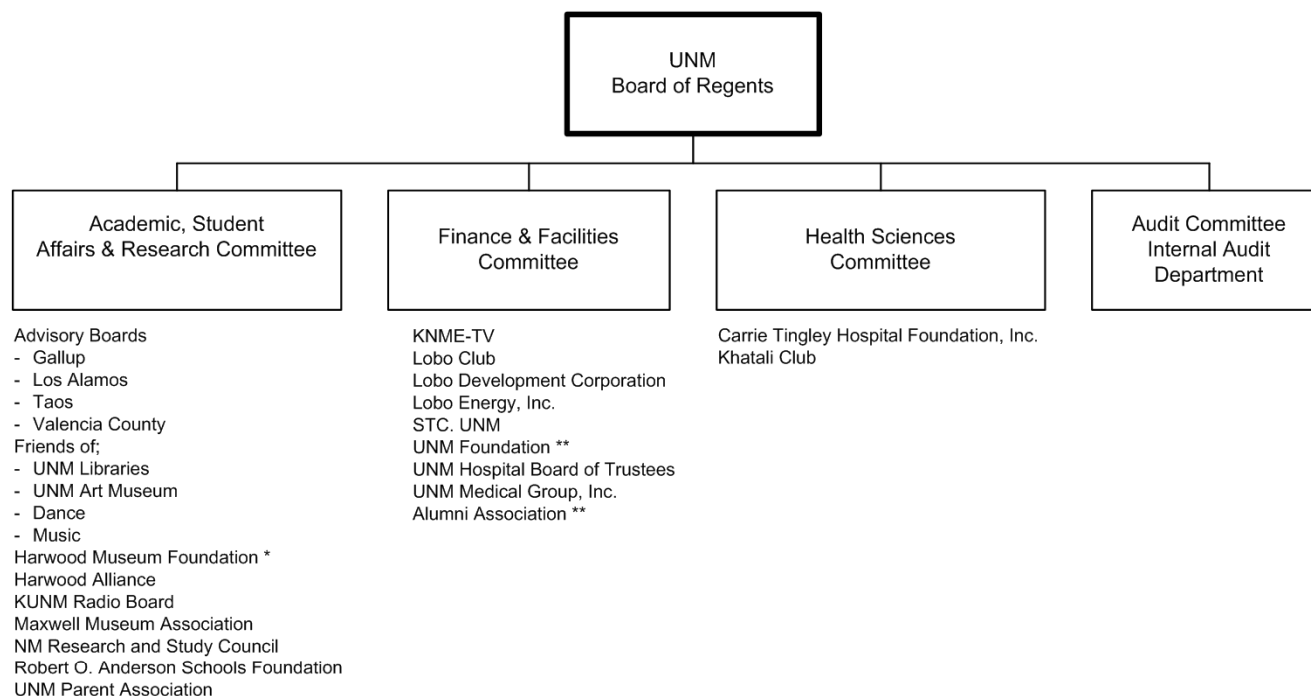
